


Total per year 2009-2013






Child Protection Assessments




Total per year 2009-2013


Monthly Average in Millions






Medical Assistance Cases

Medicaid Client Caseload Comparisons 2013 - 2014









Colorado Child Care Assistance Program (CCCAP) Cases






Actual Annual Expenditures (In Millions)

Funding Components

- Most programs are funded with a combination of Federal, State and Local dollars
- Administrative funding for county staff is generally 80%
 Federal/State and 20% County
- Child Protection funding is generally 80% Federal/State and 20% County
- Some programs are funded with 100% Federal funds
 - Generally the direct client benefit for example Food
 Assistance and LEAP client benefits are funded 100%.
 - Client benefits for Medical Assistance are funded with Federal & State dollars

Challenges and Opportunities

- Workloads in most DHS program areas have grown over the past 5 years, some by over 50%
- Every year new legislation and CDHS rules create additional work for staff
- Increasing FTEs for DHS was last approved by the BOCC nearly 7 years ago
- DHS is currently allotted 390 FTEs
- Allocations, grants, and incentives earned by DHS have increased allocations to DHS to address the increasing workloads and implementation of new state and federal rules
