Calling on graduates and people from every field to lend support and cooperation

Having grown continuously since it was established in 1949 with the merger of Osaka Technical College, which was founded in 1925, and Osaka Science and Engineering University, which was founded in 1943, Kindai University is preparing to mark the 100th anniversary of its founding in 2025.

We have pursued educational, research, and healthcare activities with the goal of educating caring, trustworthy, and respectable graduates in keeping with the founding principles espoused by Koichi Seko: “learning for the real world” and “nurturing intellectual and emotional intelligence.” With 15 undergraduate faculties, 12 graduate programs, research facilities such as the Aquaculture Research Institute, two University Hospitals, two junior colleges, Kindai University Technical College, Kindai University School of Nursing, and associated primary and secondary schools, the University has grown into one of Japan’s leading comprehensive institutions of higher learning. We are grateful to graduates and people throughout every field for their understanding and support, which have made this journey possible.

As we implement a variety of programs in keeping with the concepts described in this prospectus to mark our 100th anniversary in an effort to improve the level of service we offer to students and patients and to further enhance our educational support, research, and healthcare activities, we will require large amounts of funding. While we plan to do our best to secure funding from outside sources and lower costs, donations will provide a major source of support for these efforts.

The environment in which universities and other educational institutions operate has become extremely challenging as the population of 18-year-olds declines, but we’re committed to moving on to the next stage of our history as we celebrate the 100th anniversary of our founding through a concerted effort by all faculty members and other workers. We hope that you will approve of the University’s dedication to this effort, which is described in this prospectus, and that you will consider extending your support and cooperation going forward.

Founding Principles

‘Learning for the real world’
and ‘nurturing intellectual

Educational Goal

To develop caring, trustworthy, and respectable people

Founder Koichi Seko and Kindai University

“We put research findings to work for society by establishing a wide range of faculties as a comprehensive university and offering learning for the real world.”

Kindai University founder Koichi Seko led a tumultuous life driven by a sense of resolute belief.

Carving out his own destiny as an indomitable student who had to support himself

After graduating best in his class in elementary school, Koichi Seko, who was born in Wakayama Prefecture in 1893, gave up on continuing his studies in junior high school for economic reasons and went into service. However, his desire to study remained undimmed, and he eventually enrolled at Nihon University after studying at an English school in Tokyo’s Kanda district. After graduating, he worked for the Asahi Shimbun until he was given an opportunity by Nihon University, where his ability and commitment had attracted attention, to study abroad at what is now Humboldt University of Berlin.

An independent politician with a defiant spirit

Seko found a Japan awash in recession and unemployment when he returned after completing his study abroad. He decided to become a politician based on his belief that the “people must not be allowed to starve,” winning his first Lower House election in 1932. For more than 30 years, he used his abilities on behalf of the Japanese people as a politician of defiant spirit who fought unjust authority.

A passionate educator who poured his heart and soul into creating the ideal university

Later, Seko turned his attention to the field of education. Drawing on his experience of once having given up his studies due to poverty, he turned his passion to establishing Kindai University to realize his commitment to “ensuring that all students who want to study are able to do so.” His goal was to “establish every undergraduate faculty from medicine to literature and create a university that will serve as a pioneering model by anticipating an era in which all Japanese will receive a university education.” He determined to “make an aggressively organic approach to education that blends study and practice the university’s founding principle” and to “focus on refining the spirit as a particular priority so as to train promising human resources who think in a steady and dependable manner.” Seko spent his life pursuing this ideal vision, which is embodied by Kindai University, where that founding spirit continues to be passed on today.

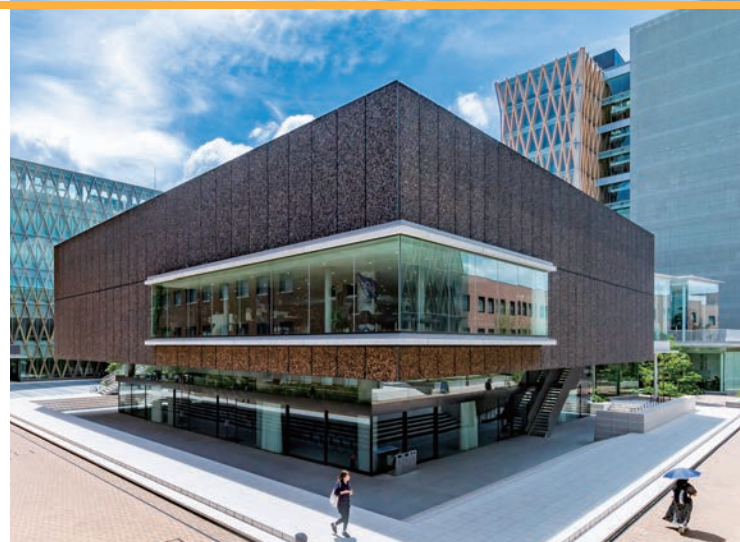

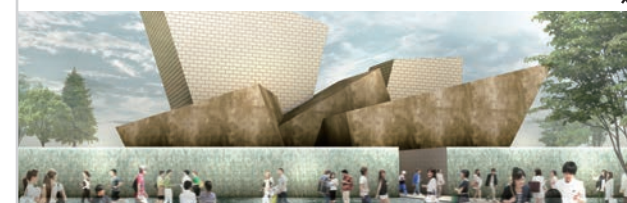

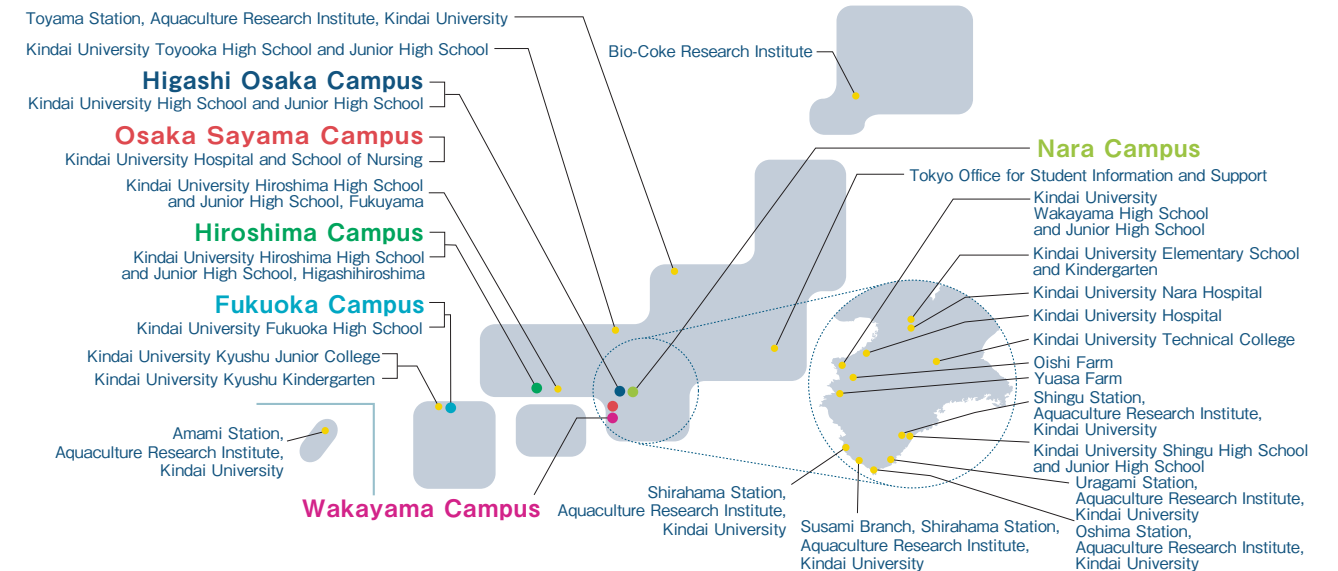

That rating reflects the improvement of branding ability and the strong student-recruiting capability of the University which lead to the largest number of applicants taking the 2023 Kindai University general entrance examination among the other universities in Japan for the tenth year running, the diverse range of research fields as a comprehensive university that produces the larger number of research projects commissioned by private companies than any other universities in Japan for six years straight, as well as the aggressive actions toward business improvement and digital transformation. The "AA" rating is the third highest of R&I's 21 ratings, and as of December 7, 2023, the University had the highest rating of any university rated by the company.
