AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA)

- \$1.9 trillion Package
- \$362 billion for State and Local Government Relief
 - \$65.1 billion in direct aid to counties

- Also included funding for
 - Vaccine distribution, testing, and public health support
 - Increased TANF
 - Behavioral and mental health
 - Housing and utility assistance
 - Food and nutrition assistance
 - Extension of \$300/week federal unemployment to 9/6/21
 - Education stabilization
 - PPP and EIDL Loans
 - Public Transit
 - FEMA and EPA



DIRECT PAYMENTS TO COUNTIES

- Allocated based on share of national population
- El Paso County's total share \$139,929,837
 - Payment in two equal tranches one May 2021, second 12 months later
 - Initial amount \$69.96 million
- Required to be spent by December 31, 2024
 - Amounts obligated to large projects by 2024 can be spent on projects finished by December 31, 2026
- Quarterly project and expenditure reports to US treasury
- Recovery plans and performance reports filed annually



ELIGIBLE USES

- Costs to respond to or mitigate the public health emergency of COVID-19 and address its negative economic impacts
- Regular government services to the extent of revenue loss
 - Does not apply to EPC
 - Cannot intentionally reduce revenue though sales tax holiday or property tax cut
- Infrastructure improvements:
 - Water
 - Sewer
 - Broadband
- Premium pay for essential workers who couldn't telework during the pandemic

ECONOMIC & WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

\$20 MILLION

- Regional Business Relief Grants
- Other business support
- Pikes Peak Workforce Center pop-up location
- Upskilling training for RBRF recipients
- Retraining for COVID impacted workers
- Tourism Support
- Small Business Development Center
- Regional Chambers Support



PUBLIC SAFETY - COVID/COVID VARIANT RESPONSE

\$17 MILLION

- No broad allowance for Public Safety costs like in CARES grant – only directly related to COVID
- Costs of running the jail are significantly higher due to COVID
- Testing, staffing, medical, quarantine, intake processing



PUBLIC HEALTH

\$8 MILLION

- Fills the gaps of other Public Health funding being received for COVID
- Address health inequities
- Public Health is receiving significant direct federal funding for vaccination, testing, and COVID response



WATER & STORMWATER INFRASTRUCTURE

\$13 MILLION

GRANT ADMINISTRATION

\$1 MILLION

- Stormwater projects being identified by EPC's Department of Public Works
- Water working with regional water districts to identify needs and improve water infrastructure

 Funding to provide monitoring and oversight for the ARPA grant



INDIVIDUAL & FAMILY ASSISTANCE

\$1 MILLION

- Programs that aren't included in the other dedicated federal and state funding the County is receiving
- Fills the gaps other funding streams aren't covering
- Family Support Center
- Emergency Rental Assistance
 - Direct funds being administered by Colorado Division of Housing
