

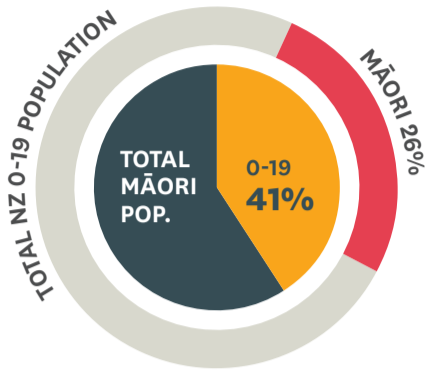

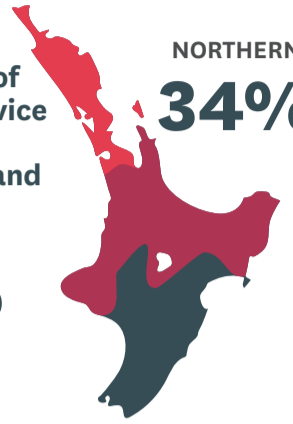

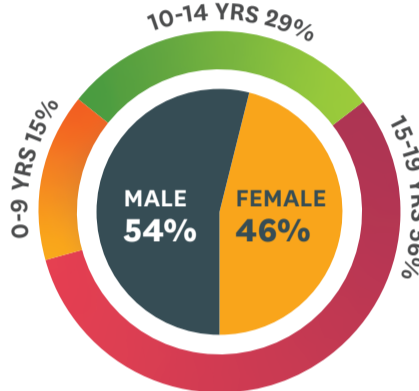
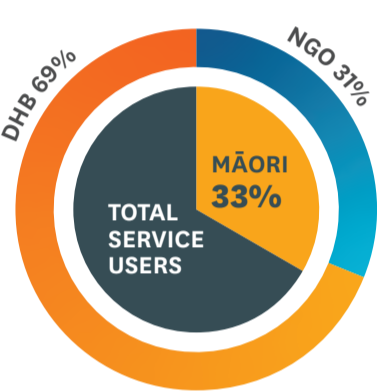

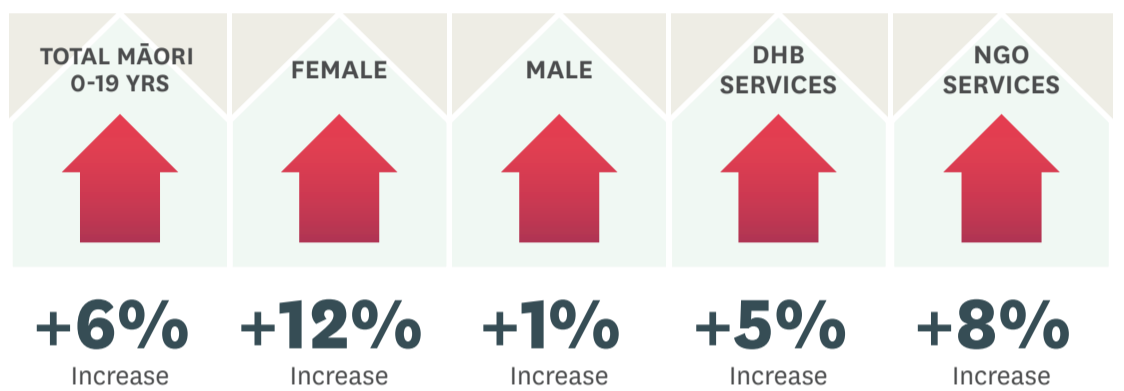

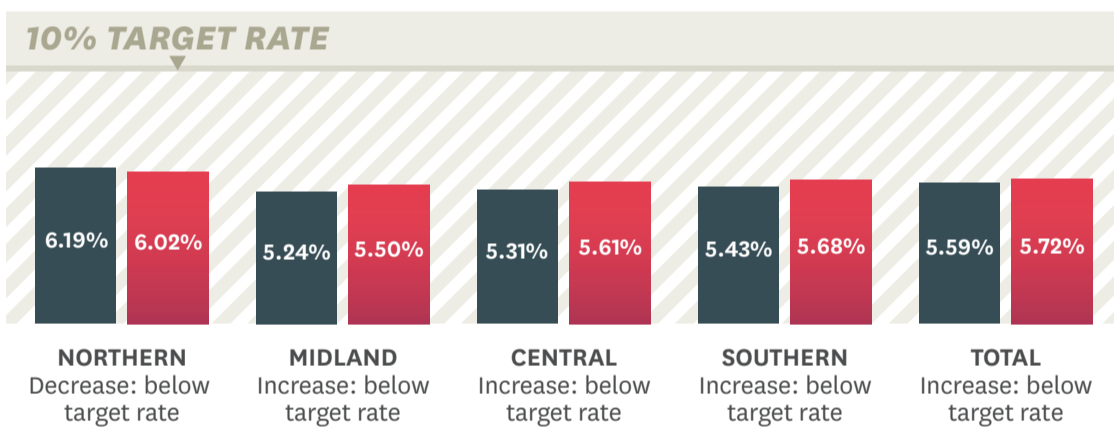
Māori service user access to services 2019



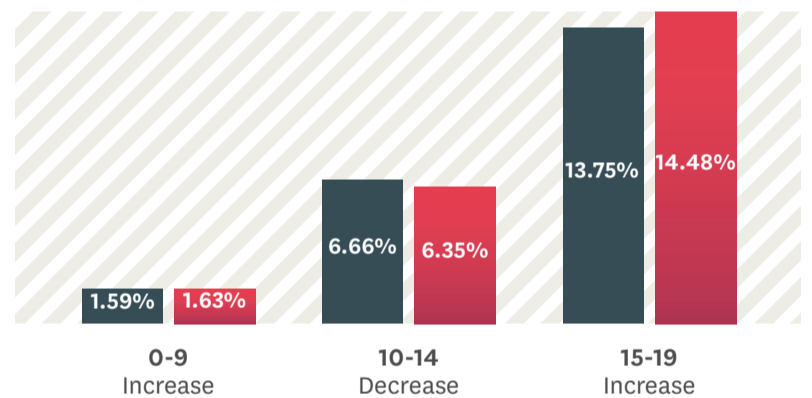
Māori service user access to ICAMH/AOD Services, 2017-2019



Māori Service user access rates by region, 2017-2019

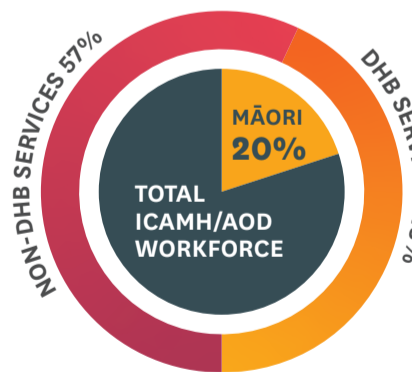
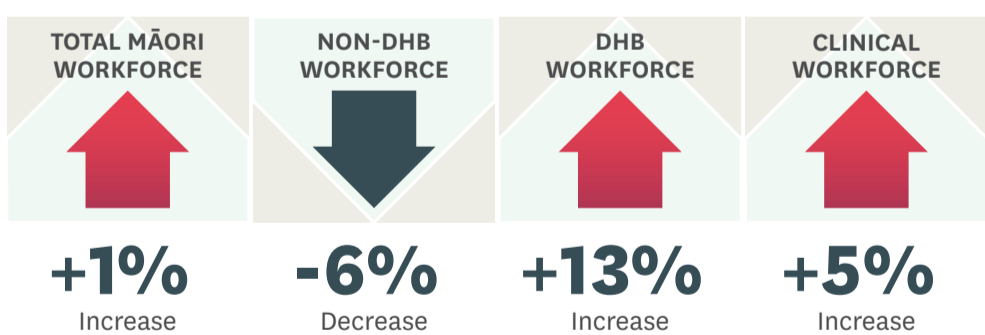


Māori Service user access rates by age group, 2017-2019

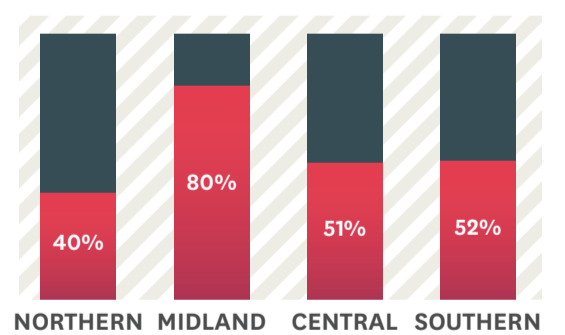

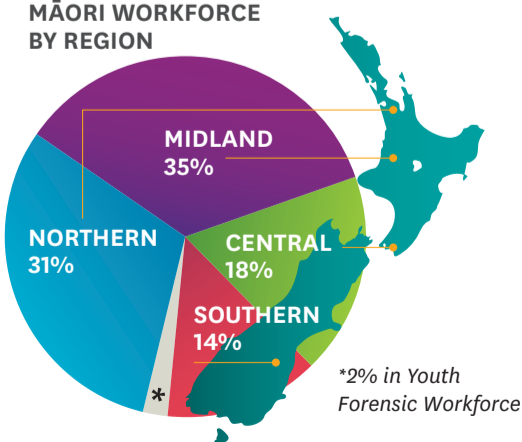
Māori ICAMH/AOD Workforce, 2018-2020/21



Māori Workforce in non-DHB services

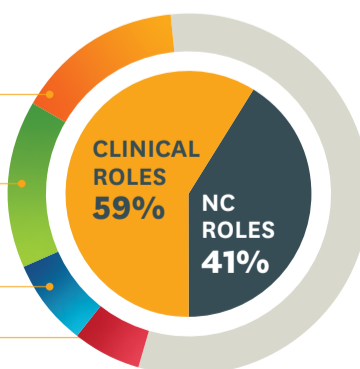
