Ballots with noticeable damage or marked with red ink are removed from pre-processing and designated for duplication

Ballots that cannot be read by scanners in their original format (military and overseas ballots, special district ballots, etc.) are designated for duplication

**Duplication**

Ballots the scanner cannot read are removed and designated for duplication

**Resolution Board**  
Ballots are individually examined and logged

**Input Judge**  
Ballots are recreated on ballot marking device and labelled with unique identifiers

**Review Board**  
Original and duplicated ballots are compared side-by-side

Duplicated ballots move forward to the standard ballot counting process

Original ballots are separated and sealed for storage

Ballots successfully read by a scanner and found to have overvotes, undervotes, write-in votes, and/or ambiguous markings are transmitted to adjudication

**Adjudication**

Ballots are resolved in accordance with the Secretary of State's Voter Intent Guide by a bipartisan team of judges

Adjudicated ballot images are marked digitally and an audit log is attached to the record
