
HOW TO GET TO THE TRAILS AND WHERE TO PARK NO HIKER PARKING AT TRAIL HEADS OR ALONG RESIDENTIAL STREETS



PICK (a trail), PARK (your vehicle) and PROCEED (walk to Trailhead)

TRAIL TO HIKE	PARKING AREA	DIRECTIONS TO TRAILHEAD
Mt. Dewey, Bratton	A	Ute Pass Ave. to Olathe St. Right on Ann St. Left on Grandview. Right on Catamount St. Right on Myrtle to Trailhead
Catamount, Bratton, Thomas	AorB	Ute Pass Ave. to Belvidere Ave or Hondo Ave. to Trailhead
Thomas, Kirkpatrick, Crystal	В	Ute Pass Ave. to Foster Ave. Left on Mountain Ave. to Trailhead or Ute Pass Ave. right on Hotel, becomes Park Ave. Right onto Boulder St. to Trailhead
Crystal, Kirkpatrick, Wallace Reserve	В	Ute Pass Ave. Right on Hotel, becomes Park Ave. Follow to Mountain Ave. to Trailhead
Crystal, Kirkpatrick, Thomas	C	Chipita Park Ave., up hill on Spruce St. right on Pine St. left on Mountain Ave. to Trailhead
Wallace Reserve, Kirkpatrick	С	Chipita Park Rd. left on Mountain Rd. to Trailhead

WHERE ARE THE FALLS?

To: CRYSTAL FALLS (1 Mile Round Trip)
Walk up Hotel St./Park Ave./Bounder St.

To: CATAMOUNT FALLS (2 Miles Round Trip)
Walk up Hondo Ave or Belvidere Ave.

To: SEE BOTH FALLS (3 Miles Round Trip)
Use Thomas Trail (yellow) to connect.

To: THE LOOP (6 Miles Round Trip)
Catamount Trail to Ring The Peak Trail to Crystal
Trail.

Loop distances measured from Main Trailhead on Lake St. POINTS OF INTEREST

- Site of GMF Hotel (1889 burned 1908): It was three stories high with 70 rooms, bathhouse and bowling alley.
 Rates: \$16/week with board
- 2. House of Fortune (1889): Rumored to be named for a place for miners to weigh gold dust.
- Tanglewood/Iron Spring (1889): The spring had a well worn path from the Town below.
- 4. Crystal Falls: Outflow from Crystal Reservoir on the North Slope of Pikes Peak. A small hydro plant built in 1911 gave electricity to the Town from dusk to midnight summers only until 1931.
- Lakeview Terrace Hotel (1888): The first hotel built in Town. Recently restored.
- Church of the Wildwood (1889): Built by community men who volunteered their labor.
- 7. House of 7 Gables (1889): A favorite Halloween haunt when it was empty.
- 8. Willomere (1888): Built by the GMF Town Co. for first settler George Howard, in exchange for his ranchland, the site of the new Town.
- Site of the first log house in GMF built in 1887 by George Howard & Ogden Whitlock.
- 10. The Hummingbird (1898): Built by a man for his bride but he was killed in a train wreck before the wedding.
- 11. Catamount Falls: The outflow for the Catamount Reservoirs on the North Slope of Pikes Peak.
- Location of alleged sighting of Bigfoot In 1989:
 Featured on the TV show "Unsolved Mysteries".

No campfires/smoking/shooting

PARKING - NO hiker parking on Hondo Ave., Belvidere Ave., Boulder Ave., or Myrtle St. Tickets will be issued and vehicles towed. Leave vehicle at Lake St., Ute Pass Ave., or Olathe St. parking.

WATER - Carry Water. No Potable water along trails. Creek & Reservoir water is NOT SAFE. No water at Ranger Station.

DOGS must be kept on leash.
