How does my sponsorship help poor children and their communities?



World Vision pools donations from you and other sponsors into Area Programmes that help sponsored children, their families and community members.

By staying in touch with your sponsored child through letters and even personal visits, you can let your sponsored child feel loved and cared for, and thrive with your support.

World Vision starts by surveying the communities where your sponsored child lives in, to identify the root causes of poverty and particular needs of the community, before mapping out and running a unique Area Programme that includes work of various sectors alongside

Your sponsorship can improve the environment for children's growth and empower community members to be resilient, enabling the community to become self-sustainable and be free from the poverty trap.

Three phases of empowerment



Build capacity

Collaborate with community leaders, local organisations and government departments to review the needs in the community, before setting priorities for different projects.

Leverage experiences in development, professional knowledge and local resources to implement projects.

Equip community members with new knowledge and skills for development, and train leaders through means such as community committees and cooperatives. When the community is empowered to play a more active role, World Vision can further focus on monitoring and providing guidance until the community is fully

Build confidence

capable of continuing its development. Most Area Programmes last around 15 years.

Three reasons behind: why is money not given directly to my sponsored child's family?

It is not just about helping your sponsored child

Directly giving money and supplies to sponsored children may not be the most sustainable and effective way to help them out of poverty. It may also cause divisions or slow down the progress of development.

• It is not just about helping your sponsored child's family

In your sponsored child's community, poverty is not an issue facing a particular child or family, but a consequence of a lack of resources in the community as a whole. Therefore, it is by improving the environment for children's growth that they will have a chance to thrive.

Does my sponsored child know about my support? Sponsored children know that they are being supported by a sponsor. Through your first letter, your sponsored child will get to know who you are.

How do I write a letter to my sponsored child?

What should I bear in mind when writing a letter?

- Mark your sponsored child's name and ID number, as well as your name and partner number on the letter (and gift, if any)
- Keep your letter short for ease of translation into your child's native language
- Avoid topics such as wealth, religion and politics
- To protect your privacy, do not disclose your address, email, phone number or other contact details
- Contents that are inappropriate to the child's context or contain personal details will be deleted during inspection

How letters are processed



Sponsor writes a letter

The letter is delivered to the corresponding overseas office

The letter is translated from English into the local language by a staff member or volunteer

The letter is delivered by a staff member or a volunteer



The child receives the letter

The reply is translated into English by a staff member or a volunteer and sent to Hong Kong

The child writes a reply, sometimes with help from parents or staff





Reminder:

Will my child send me a reply?

It takes about four months for your sponsored child's letter to reach you. However, postal services and other factors may cause delays. Please contact us if you have any enquiries.





How long can I support my sponsored child?

It takes about 15 years for World Vision to implement an Area Programme. When the community becomes more established and empowered to lead its own development, we will gradually transfer the ownership of our community development work to local partners and move on to another community in need. The duration of your sponsorship depends on the following:

Progress of the programme

The community may be at an initial or a more advanced phase when you start your sponsorship. Once the community achieves its development goals, with families and community members becoming sufficiently self-sustainable to support children's growth in an improved environment, World Vision's Area Programme will be closed, and that will be the time for you and your sponsored child to part ways.

Status of the child

When the status of the child and the family changes, such as when the child finishes school, starts working or moves out of the community, they will drop out of the sponsorship programme.

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How may I **protect** my sponsored child?

Can I share my sponsored child's information on social media or other channels?

World Vision welcomes you to share the joy of sponsorship with your loved ones and encourage more people to become sponsors. However, in order to protect the privacy and safety of your sponsored child, please adhere to the followings:

- DO NOT disclose the child's family name, child ID or location.
- · Only upload photos in which children are adequately dressed.
- The uploaded photos should NOT be geo-tagged, though you may tag the address of the World Vision office in that country.
- Children's information should be password-protected during storage and transmission through the Internet, mobile devices or other electronic means.

Can I contact my sponsored child through social media or other channels?

- ✗ Due to child protection concerns, please do not contact your sponsored child directly through social media or other channels of communication.
 - World Vision plays the role of a mediator in all communications between sponsors and sponsored children, in order to avoid any communication barrier or misunderstanding due to differences in language, religion and culture.
 - It is World Vision's absolute priority to protect children. We need your collaboration in preventing children from being exposed to threats online. Let's work together to keep children from harm.

What should I do if I suspect that a child is abused?


