Introduction

With this report, CPOST is pleased to introduce its new "Political and Violent Dangers to Democracy" Tracker, the most comprehensive and rolling picture of the key trends in the magnitude of anti-democratic (and prodemocratic) sentiments in the US adult population related to the future of American democracy now available. In recent years, CPOST and other scholars have called attention to various political and violent dangers to democracy related to the deep distrust of democratic institutions, dangerous political conspiracy theories, expressed support for political violence for a range of grievances on both the political Right and Left, and public yearning for bipartisan political solutions to protect American democracy going forward. With CPOST's new tracker, these critical issues can now be presented as a comprehensive picture of state of the public mind on dangers to democracy, measured in a unified, high quality, reliable nationally representative survey conduct by CPOST and NORC at the University of Chicago, fielded March 31-April 6, 2023, N= 4046 adults age 18+, and margin of error of +/- 2.15% and compared to previous CPOST/NORC surveys in September 2022 and January 2023, N= 3000, MOE = 2.95.

Above all, the "Dangers to Democracy" Tracker shows a truly disturbing picture of the landscape of attitudes on democracy in the US general population. Beyond any one individual issue, the composite of the full range of political and violent dangers to democracy and their trajectory shows that public attitudes on these issues are not improving -- indeed about half of the measures are more disturbing since fall of 2022. This means that despite the resounding public rejection of "election deniers" and politicians viewed as threatening democracy in the 2022 mid-term national elections and numerous "election integrity" policies, the state of American democracy remains fragile.

This broad approach to understanding support for political violence from the right and the left is essential to anticipating flashpoints and critical for developing effective strategies to address and mitigate risks from wherever they arise to threaten the health and stability of American democracy.

The great strength of America's democracy is resilience in the face of serious challenge, resilience that starts with informed public debate. The "dangers to democracy" tracker shows there is tremendous work to do -- and that it is important to get to work as we begin to head into the 2024 election season.

Beyond the new tracker, this report also delves more deeply into numerous crucial issues explored in the April 2023 survey and finds:

- (1) The size of the pro-Trump "Insurrectionist Movement" remains highly stable. In September 2022, 5% of Americans believed force was justified to restore Trump to the presidency. Today that number is the same, at 5%. In our new survey, we also asked those who neither agreed nor disagreed about their leaning, and found 12% of these or 4 million lean toward agreeing that force is justified to restore Trump. This suggests our previous surveys have underestimated the true level of force for Trump by effectively counting all the ambivalent as not agreeing. When we add these 4 million from the ambivalent to the explicit support for force to restore Trump, we now have a more accurate estimate of the size of the insurrectionist movement as of April 2023, about 17 million.
- (2) Support for violence in addressing causes on the Left is also stable from September 2022 to April 2023 across a variety of grievances (restore abortion rights, protect minority voting rights, prevent police brutality against minorities), remains sizable, and comes predominantly from Democrats. Overall, support for political violence continues to extend across party lines.
- (3) Support for political violence against members of Congress and on government officials grew from 9% (equivalent of 23 million adults) in January 2023 to 12.5% or (the equivalent of 32 million adults) in April

- 2023 and continues to come almost equally from the Right and Left. The 32 million breaks down as 10 million Republicans, 8 million Democrats, and 5 million Independents.
- (4) Our new survey asked questions about commitment of the public to the US Constitution and remaining politically united as a nation and found disturbingly: 12% or 31 million adults agree that the "US Constitution should be ignored" (about evenly across parties), while 16% or 41 million adults favor the "United States having a national divorce." Importantly, support for national divorce remains at disturbing levels when high consequences are added, with 7% (18 million adults) favoring a national divorce even if "thousands of people are injured or killed" and 7% (18 million adults) even if it means "China would replace the United States as the world's only superpower." Republicans are more than twice as likely to favor national divorce across all these questions.
- (5) There is also good news. Our April 2023 survey found that 77% of the public supports bipartisan solutions to American political violence, a stable level since January 2023 and indicating that Americans are *not* polarized on this crucial issue and pointing the way forward for political leaders to work together to prevent political violence in the future.

Since June 2021, the University of Chicago Project on Security and Threats has conducted seven nationally representative surveys of violent sentiments for political causes among American adults. These surveys are fielded by the highly reputable NORC at the University of Chicago using the gold standard of polling methodologies – drawing large random samples from panels of 50,000 individuals matched to the US population on dozens of demographic, socio-economic, political, and other factors.

Our seventh and most recent CPOST/NORC survey on political violence was fielded March 31 to April 6, 2023 and randomly sampled 4,046 American adults, with a margin of error of about 2.1 percent. This survey asks questions to understand the scope and drivers for political violence in America to examine violent support for both right and left-wing causes. Like the previous six CPOST/NORC surveys, we track "Insurrectionist Movement" characterized by support for violence to restore former president Donlad Trump to the presidency. But we also widen the aperture to understand support for violence in relation to police brutality, abortion rights, and minority voting rights.

This broad approach to understanding support for political violence from the right and the left is essential to anticipating flashpoints and critical for developing effective strategies to address and mitigate risks from wherever they arise to threaten the health and stability of American democracy.

The remainder of the report delves into these findings in greater detail. The topline survey results are included as an appendix to this report.

New "Political and Violent Dangers to Democracy" Tracker

To gain a more complete understanding of the fragility of American democracy in the US population, with our new April 2023 survey, we create a new composite "Dangers to Democracy" tracker, surveying a) distrust of American democracy; b) political conspiracy theories; c) support for political violence; and opposition to political violence. Since CPOST has in fact been asking many of these questions in our previous surveys, the tracker allows us to follow not only the magnitude of public support but also change over time.

The value of the "Dangers to Democracy" Tracker is that, for the first time, we can see the broad landscape of issues that scholars of American democracy and political violence have been concerned about in recent years. This allows us to follow the trajectory of these important issues in the public mind, enabling us to see that:

- (1) Americans are deeply distrustful of democracy, with majorities or near majorities of American adults lacking confidence that American elections can serve their basic function of resolving critical political problems, the political leaders of both major parties are the most corrupt and immoral people in America, and a small group of elites controls the levers of power and uses them to enrich and empower themselves at the expense of the American people. Although there are modest differences, these results generally hold across parties, as the lowest level of support for these beliefs by party is 40% (among Democrats for the last two questions), while about 60% of both Democrats and Republicans agree with the first.
- (2) Americans are deeply and persistently committed to the most commonly discussed political conspiracy theories, with the most prominent far right extremist beliefs that the 2020 election was stolen and the Democratic Party is deliberately replacing the current electorate with more politically favorable immigrants as well as the more politically balanced belief in the QAnon conspiracy remaining at or above their September 2022 levels as measured in April 2023.
- (3) Sizable factions of Americans support the use of force for political goals related to both the Right (force to restore Trump) and the Left (force to restore federal abortion rights), while significant numbers of Americans across both parties support the use of force against members of Congress and favor a "national divorce" even if thousands are injured or killed.
- (4) The good news: Overwhelming majorities of Americans extending across both parties strongly oppose the use of violence for political goals, a strong, but largely un-mobilized counterweight to other disturbing trends on the tracker.

Importantly, the trajectories show that, across all the dimensions, the numbers are either flat or becoming more concerning consistently from September 2022 through January 2023 to April 2023.


Both the levels of public support and their trajectories suggests that:

- (1) American democracy remains fragile even after the 2022 midterms when a majority of Americans rejected candidates viewed as "election deniers" and dangers to democracy.
- (2) Current campaigns against disinformation and in support of election integrity are not working, at least with respect to changing attitudes within the American public.
- (3) Opportunities to push back against the political and violent dangers to democracy exist, because the Republican and Democratic publics are not polarized on this issue and most in both parties support bipartisan political solutions by their political leaders.

The Continued Stabilization of the pro-Trump Insurrectionist Movement


To assess the strength of the pro-Trump insurrectionist movement, the crucial question asked respondents whether they agreed, "the use of force is justified to restore Donald Trump to the presidency," which we have asked, word for word, in four surveys over the past 18 months.

As the chart below shows, 4.5 percent of American adults – the equivalent of 12 million Americans -- now agree with that statement.



This number is only slightly different than our September 2022 and January 2023 estimates, only a .5% difference that is well within the margin of error of 2.1% for the April survey. Thus, we are now seeing solid stabilization over the past 7 months, despite the results of the 2022 midterms, Republicans taking control of the


US House of Representatives in January 2023, and the news of the impending Trump indictment in late March 2023.




Violent Support for Multiple Political Causes on the Right

To assess whether political violent sentiments on the Right are evolving and/or spreading to other political issues beyond the alleged stolen election in 2020, it is important to ask questions related to specific political grievances not necessarly related to pro-Trump and/or stolen election issues. Hence, CPOST asked the questions whether respondents agreed, "the use of force is justified to prevent the federal government from prosecuting Donald Trump" and "the use of force is justified to preserve the rights of whites."

As the charts below shows, 6 percent of American adults – the equivalent of 15 million -- now agree with the statement on Trump prosecution, while 6% -- the equivalent of 15 million adults -- agreed with the statement on white rights.



However, violent support for far right grievances are not shared by the same people across the three grievances. As we see below, a total of 28 million people -11 % of the population - supports the use of force for at least one of these three far right grievances, while 13 million agree with at least two, and 3 million with all three.





Given this finding, it is important to recognize that support for the use of force for any one specific grievance under-weights the extend of support for violence for far right grievances as a whole.


Support for Political Violence from the Left

Our survey also asked a variety of questions related to potential political violence from the left, focusing on grievances where there may be violent mobilization across the political spectrum, not just simply from the right.

As in our September 2022 survey and our January 2023 survey, our new April 2023 survey found hat there are millions of Democrats with violent sentiments related to far Left grievances, specifically restoring the federal right to abortion, preventing police brutality against minorities, and defending minority voting rights. As the chart below shows, Democrats make up strong majorities among those supporting force for these causes.








As with far Right grievances, however, violent support for far Left grievances are not shared by the same people across the three grievances. As we see below, a total of 49 million people – 19 % of the population – supports

the use of force for at least one of these three far right grievances, while 28 million agree with at least two, and 15 million with all three.




Support for Political Violence across both the Right and the Left

Overall, the above data shows that there is significant support for violence across both the right and the Left amounting to about 30% of the US population of adults – well over 50 million people, even accounting for the margins of error -- for at least one of the six total Right and Left grievances measured.

To see another measure across parties, we also measure support for political violence against a specific target may be broadly shared across the Left/Right political divide. Importantly, "shared" support in a specific context does not mean shared underlying grievances across Left/Right issues. Still, understanding shared political grievances among Republicans and Democrats (and Independents) is helpful to understanding the general nature of politically violent radicalization in the United States.

To assess the existence of politically "shared" support for force, the survey asked whether respondents agreed that "the use of force is justified to ensure members of Congress and other government officials do the right thing."



As the chart above shows, 12.5 percent of American adults – the equivalent of 32 million people – agree that the use of force is justified against members of Congress and other government officials. The breakdown by party shows that this support is broadly shared across the political spectrum, with the 32 million breaking down as 10 million Republicans, 8 million Democrats, and 5 million Independent.


This finding may help to explain the rising levels of threats against members of Congress and other government officials, who become the target of both Left and Right radicalization. In our last report, we noted that this finding suggests that a project designed to assess and track those threats in detail and across time is important. CPOST is now undertaking this project and expects results by fall 2023.

Vast Support for Bipartisan Solutions to Political Violence across both the Right and the Left

Our previous surveys indicated opportunities to mobilize a vast bipartisan coalition among the Americans to oppose political violence. This data led to detailed presentations and recommendations on communication strategies to encourage Republicans, Independents, and Democrats to oppose the political violent threats to our democracy. Indeed, there were major political communications to country consistent with the data and recommendation by the White House prior to the mid-term elections, which may explain the surprising results that occurred.

To probe the US public directly on this issue, our January 2023 survey asked if respondents agree, "Republicans and Democrats in Congress should make a joint statement condemning any political violence in America."

As the chart below shows, 78 percent of American adults – the equivalent of 200 million people -- agree with that statement. These 200 million represent the vast majority of Democrats (85%), Republicans (76%), and Independents (62%).



This strong support for bipartisan solutions to political violence in America comes as extremely good news, especially since the results are highly consistent with our January 2023 survey on this question. The magnitude and consistent trajectory of opposition to political violence shows that the overwhelming majority of Americans are *not* polarized on the preventing violent threats to our democracy and provides a roadmap endorsed by the public for America political leaders to follow to prevent political violence in the future.

Conclusion

The best course to defend democracy in the coming months is going further down the path that has achieved progress. The wedge issue that works for democracy is opposition to violence itself. So, our leaders across the political spectrum should mobilize the vast majority of both Republicans and Democrats who oppose political violence and support peaceful means of resolving disputes. The results of the mid-term elections on November 8, 2022 provide evidence that this approach can work. Our leaders should follow up this momentum to endorse more bipartisan solutions to safeguard American democracy going forward.
