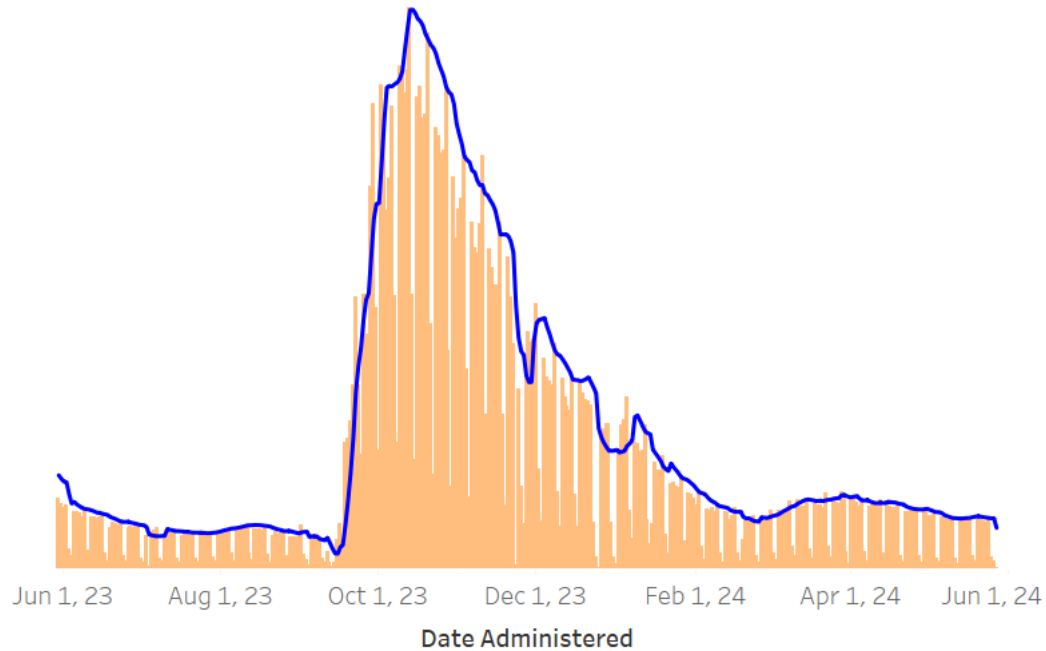

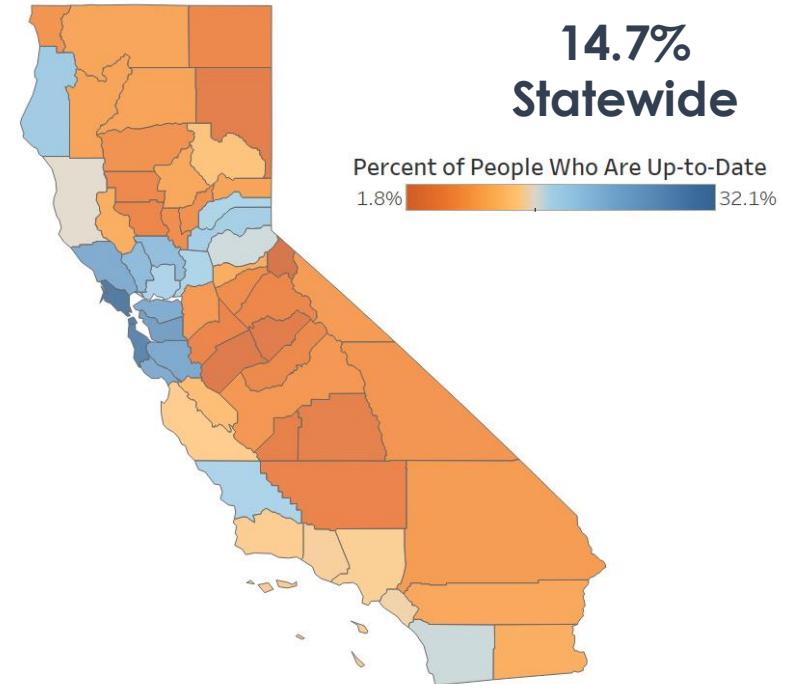

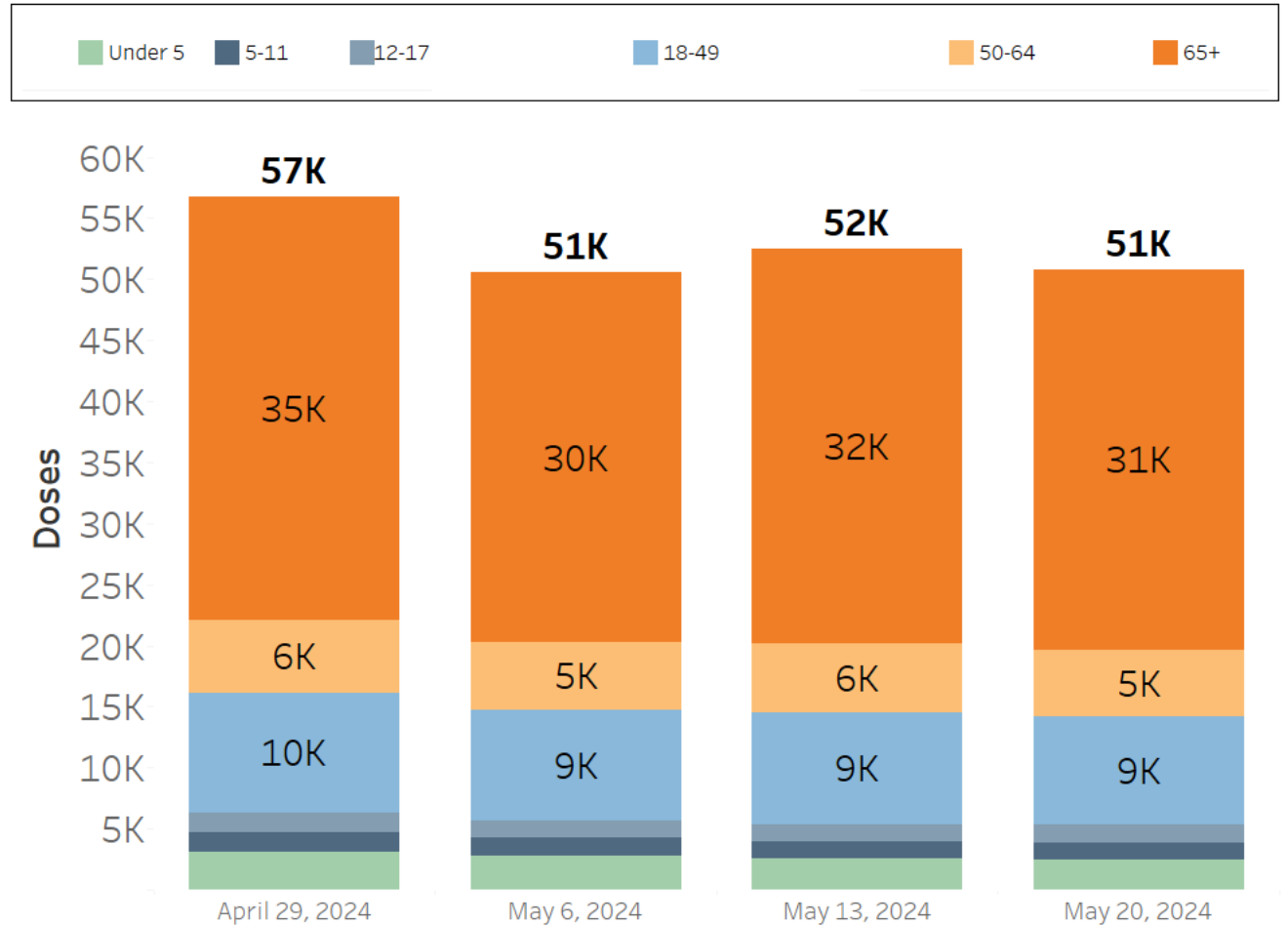

## Doses Administered by Age Group, Past 4 Weeks

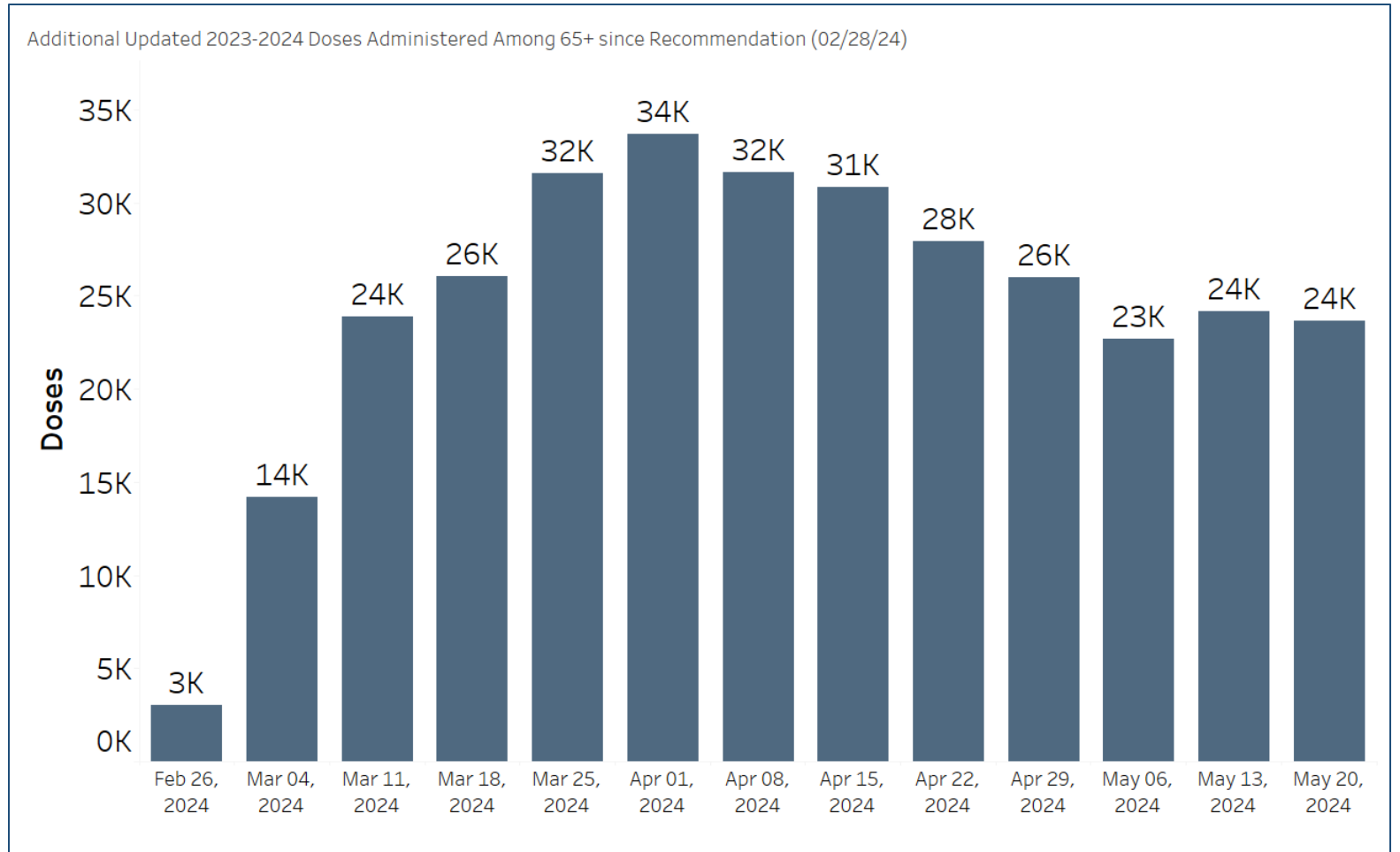


# Trends in 65+ Additional COVID-19 Vaccine Dose Administration

- Recent decline in additional doses

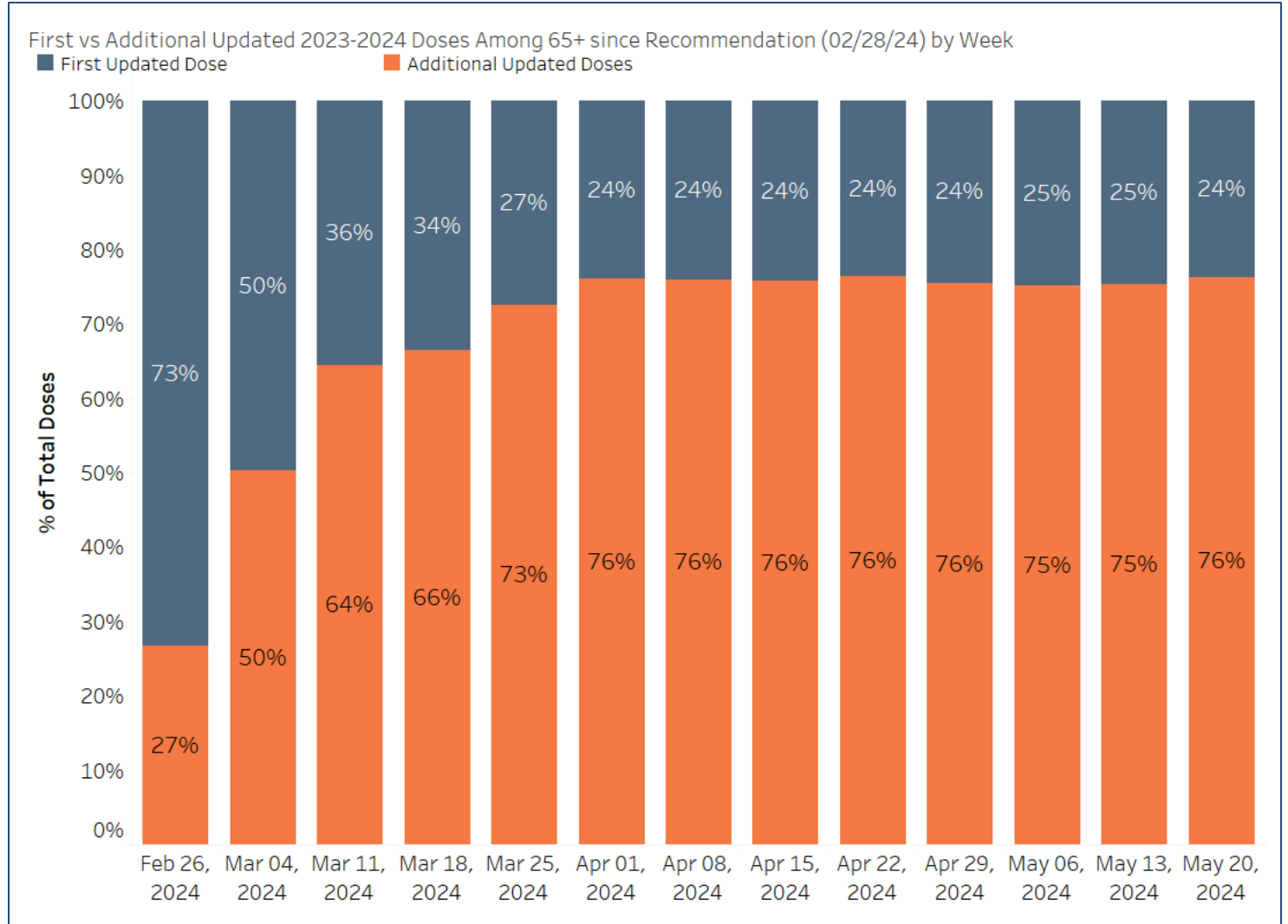


# Trends in 65+ Additional COVID-19 Vaccine Dose Administration

# BAP Program End Date Announcement

CDC has announced that:

- **The Bridge Access Program (BAP)**, that provides free COVID-19 vaccines to adults with limited or no insurance, **will now end in August 2024**, just before the arrival of the updated 2024 – 2025 COVID-19 vaccine. Funding that was previously expected to be available to purchase additional vaccine for the Bridge Access Program was rescinded by Congress and no additional federal funding for COVID-19 vaccine for adults has been identified at this time.



# Timeline

- June 5, 2024: the FDA Vaccines and Related Biologic Products Advisory Committee (VRBPAC) will meet to discuss and make recommendations on the selection of strain(s) to be included in the 2024-2025 Formula for COVID-19 vaccines.
- June 26-28, 2024: CDC ACIP anticipated to review and vote on recommendations for 2024-25 season
- Late Summer – Fall: 2024-25 vaccine anticipated to be available for use.
- BAP Program ends when the 2023-24 vaccine is no longer recommended, and the 2024-25 vaccine is recommended.

# Implications

- The BAP program in myCAvax will be discontinued when the program ends. More details on close-out activities will come over the summer.
- IZB is evaluating 317 budget (Claudia will cover), but it is not likely there will be funding to purchase COVID for VFA providers this federal fiscal year.
- No state funding is currently available for COVID vaccine.
- Manufacturers will be releasing details on Patient Assistance Programs closer to the end of BAP.

# Quality Assurance (QA) Visits to Continue

BAP is federally funded through August 2024 and all standard procedures per the provider agreement are still in effect, including participating in quality assurance visits.

\*Children ages 6 months - 8 years with a history of 0 -1 flu vaccines, need 2 doses. The first flu vaccine dose should be given as soon as vaccine is available to allow the second dose to be given > 4 weeks later and ideally by the end of October.

\*\*Providers may adjust timing based on guidance from local public health or regional medical centers.



# Will COVID-19 Vaccines be available via the 317 Program (for LHDs) and VFA (FQHCs)? TBD

CDC indicated 317 funding levels will NOT increase to cover the cost of COVID-19 vaccines.

Current 317 funding levels are so limited, drastic limits have already been implemented for VFA providers (last Q VFA communication)



Once we receive CA's 317 Funding levels for FFY 25 (October 1-September 30<sup>th</sup>), will need to determine how the current 317 Vaccine Eligibility Guidelines will need to be adjusted to support 317 vaccine ordering for LHDs and VFA providers.

Questions: What vaccines will be supported with section 317 funds?  
How much? What will be ordering limits? How many VFA providers?

## VFA Vaccine Ordering Updates

Due to budgetary constraints, we have revised the program's ordering policy for the following vaccines:

- HPV vaccine will be temporarily unavailable to order this quarter. The program will reassess the inclusion of the vaccine for future ordering.
- Vaccine dose requests for PCV and Zoster vaccines will be reduced by 65% of your practice's 2022 Quarter 2 order.
- Additionally, Td vaccine will no longer be available in the VFA Program. Please refer to the recent [VFA ACIP Clinical Letter](#) for additional guidance on the use of Tdap in lieu of Td.

### Summary

#### What is already known about this topic?

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is the leading cause of hospitalization among U.S. infants. In August... recommended nirsevimab, a long-acting monoclonal antibody, to protect infants aged <8 months ag... lower respiratory tract infection in their first RSV season.

**Nirsevimab was 90% effective at protecting infants from RSV-associated hospitalization\***

# Birth Hospitals in California

238 hospitals currently provide birthing services

- 64 (27%) already enrolled in VFC Program
- 174 (73%) not currently enrolled,
  - In 2022, these facilities delivered 114,487 Medi-Cal births

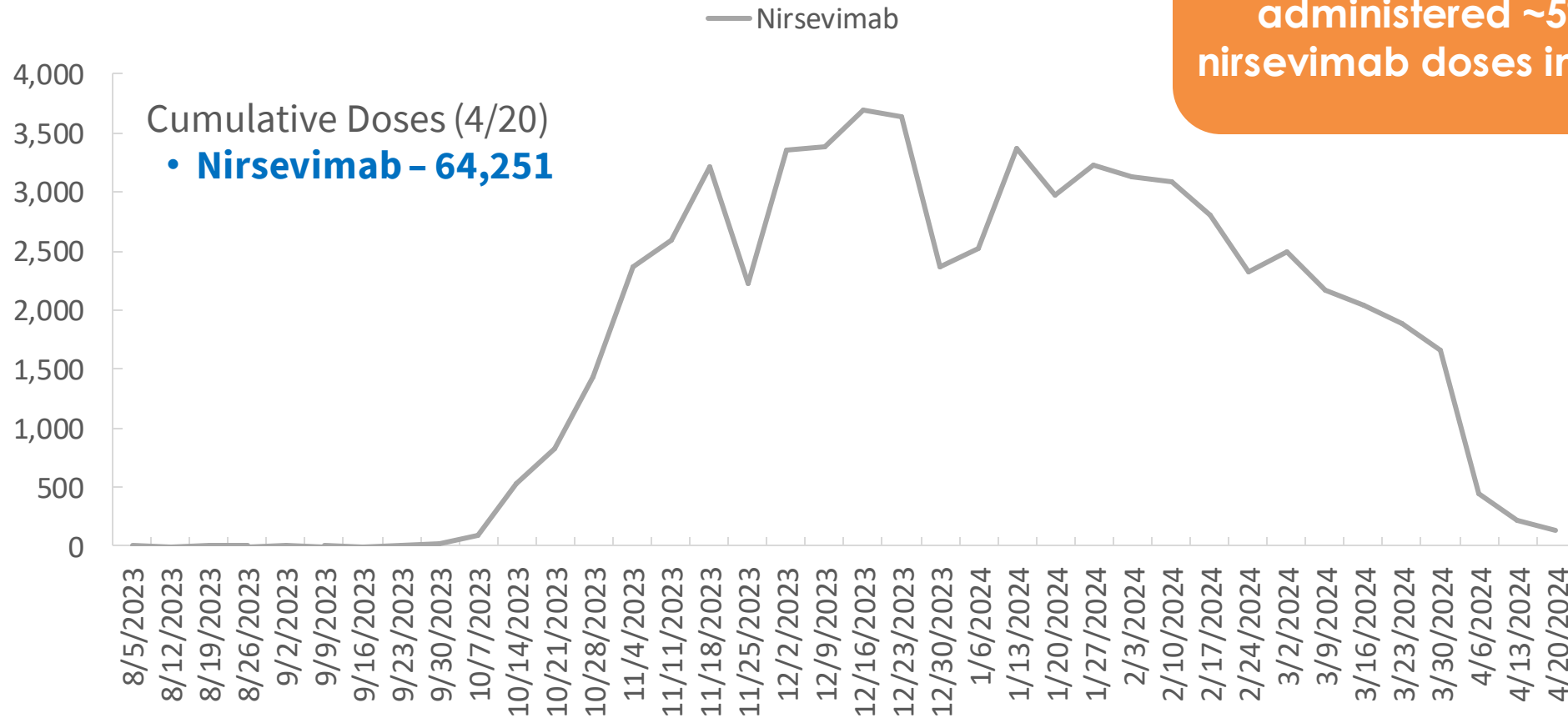
Goal: Identify top birthing hospitals, considering % of their Medi-Cal births among other criteria for prioritization, and focus enhanced outreach/support for VFC Program enrollment **by August 31, 2024**

While the Ultimate goal is to enroll all 174 birth hospitals, initial prioritization for outreach is 50 hospitals.

SUBJECT: Initial Allocation of Limited Nirsevimab (Beyfortus™) Supply;  
Interim CDC Clinical Guidance

**BACKGROUND**  
On October 13, 2023, CDC paused ordering of nirsevimab for VFC programs in the US due to a shortage in supply. The shortage is expected to continue in both the public and private sector supplies throughout the 2023-2024 RSV season. According to the manufacturer, the anticipated supply of 100mg doses of nirsevimab is insufficient to protect all eligible infants and children weighing ≥5 kg this season. Supplies of 50mg doses will be less limited. As additional limited supplies are made available by the manufacturer, CDC is allocating these doses to states, at an interval currently estimated at every 2 to 3 weeks.

**NIRSEVIMAB VFC ORDERING**  
The current allocation to the California VFC Program for both 50mg and 100mg formulation for nirsevimab is too small to resume ordering for all VFC providers. As a result, this current allocation is available only to hospitals, Tribal Health Clinics, selected Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs)/Rural Health Centers (RHCs) and Public Health Department Clinics. Additional doses will be made available to additional VFC Providers as more doses are received. The VFC Program will provide timely updates on availability and ordering policies.

**VFC ORDERING LIMITS**  
VFC orders for nirsevimab are limited, based on prior utilization of Hepatitis B vaccine birth doses at hospitals and pneumococcal conjugate vaccine for outpatient providers. The limits may be changed depending on supply.

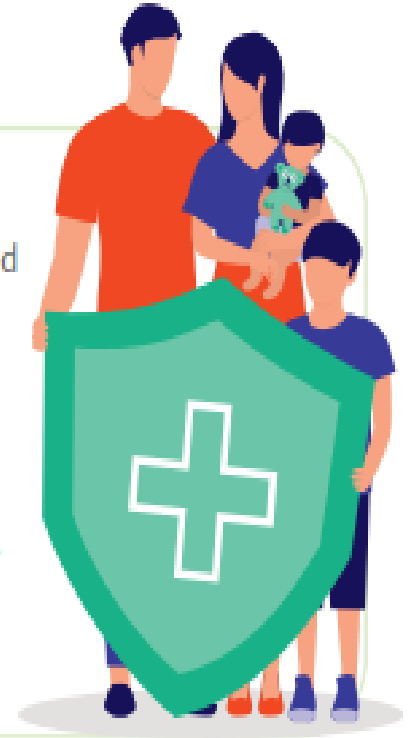
# Benefits of VFC Program Enrollment for Birth Hospitals

VFC Program covers the entire cost of immunizations for eligible patients:

- Single dose of Hep B at birth was previously the only immunization recommended for newborns
  - **Commercial Cost: ~\$28 / dose**
- Nirsevimab is now recommended for newborns at birth during respiratory virus season
  - **Commercial Cost: ~\$520 / dose**
- The financial impact for the implementation of Nirsevimab is significant.
  - Based on 2022 Medi-Cal Births alone (114, 487) among non enrolled hospitals, Cost of Nirsevimab = \$59.5 M

## DID YOU KNOW?

- + Birthing institutions are not required to carry all ACIP-recommended vaccines to participate in VFC.
- + VFC and commercial vaccines can be stored in the same storage unit.
- + Birthing institutions can participate in the VFC program, regardless of whether they accept Medicaid.

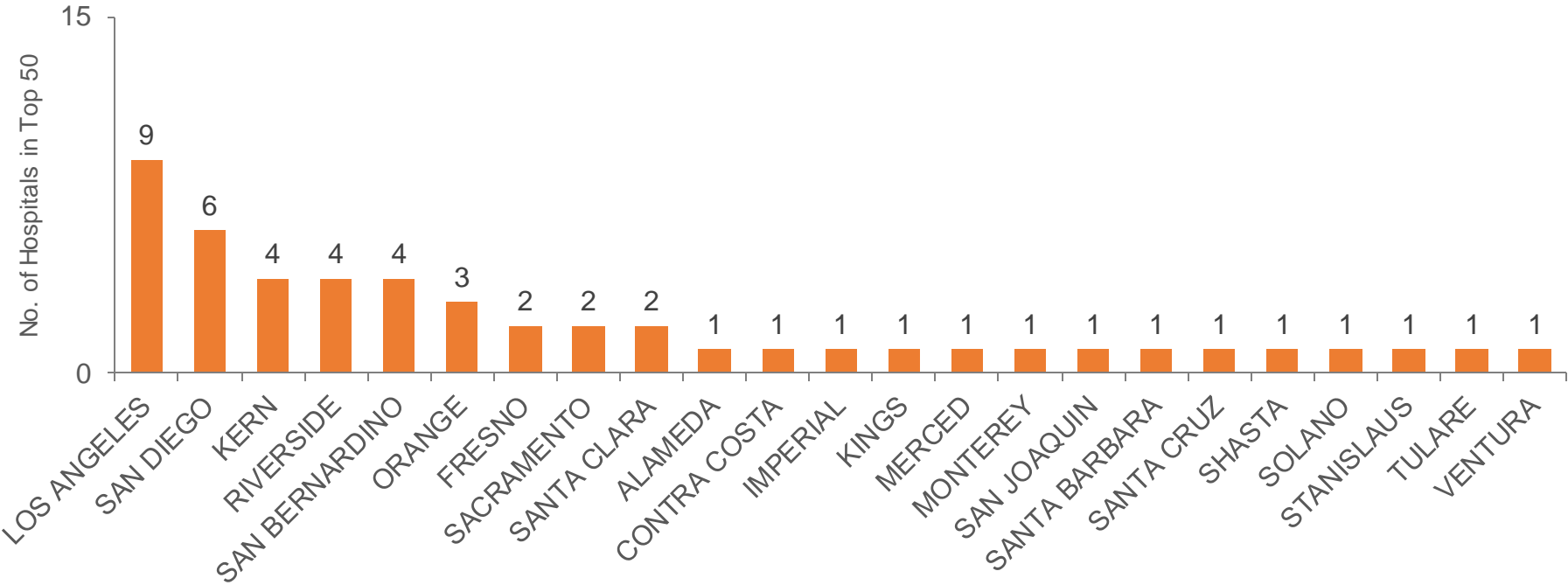

## Birthing Institutions and the Vaccines for Children Program



### What is the Vaccines for Children program?

The [Vaccines for Children \(VFC\) program](#) is a federally funded, jurisdiction-administered program which provides vaccines recommended for children and adolescents by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) at no cost to eligible individuals from birth through age 18 years. Children and adolescents are eligible for VFC vaccines if they are:

- Eligible for Medicaid,
- Uninsured, underinsured,<sup>1</sup> or
- American Indian or Alaska Native.

Approximately 50% of children in the U.S. are eligible to receive vaccines through the VFC program.<sup>1</sup> In some states, a state-specific funding mechanism is used to supplement the federal program and provide ACIP recommended vaccines to all children and adolescents, regardless of insurance status. Approximately 37,000 medical offices, hospitals, community-based clinics, pharmacies, and other providers of pediatric vaccinations participate in the VFC program.<sup>2</sup> According to [CDC estimates](#), between 1994 and 2021, the VFC program helped to prevent 472 million illnesses, nearly 30 million hospitalizations, more than one million deaths, and saved nearly \$2.2 billion in total societal costs.

### How does the VFC program work?

The CDC purchases vaccines from manufacturers at discounted rates and distributes them to VFC-enrolled healthcare providers at the direction of [the 64 state, local, and territorial immunization programs](#). These immunization programs are usually housed within the jurisdiction's department of health and are responsible for the administration of the VFC program for their jurisdiction. Immunization programs enroll healthcare providers—such as physician offices,

hospitals, and pharmacies—into the VFC program and provide VFC vaccines to them at no cost. VFC program providers administer the vaccines to eligible children and adolescents at no cost to families. Providers can charge a set fee to administer each vaccination, but if the family cannot afford the fee, patients cannot be turned away due to inability to pay. All immunization programs follow and enforce the federal VFC program requirements, and most immunization programs supplement the federal requirements with additional jurisdiction-specific program requirements that participating providers must follow. These requirements are in place to ensure the viability of every vaccine dose that is given and to prevent fraud and abuse of the program.

#### Why should birthing institutions participate?

**Birthing institution participation:**

- ✦ Ensures equitable access to immunizations.

As vaccines and vaccine-like products that are included in the VFC program may be cost-prohibitive for families who do not have commercial insurance coverage, birthing institution participation in the VFC program is critical to ensuring equitable access to these products. Nationwide, approximately 50% of newborns qualify for the VFC program, although that percentage varies widely based upon geography and the payer mix of individual birthing institutions.

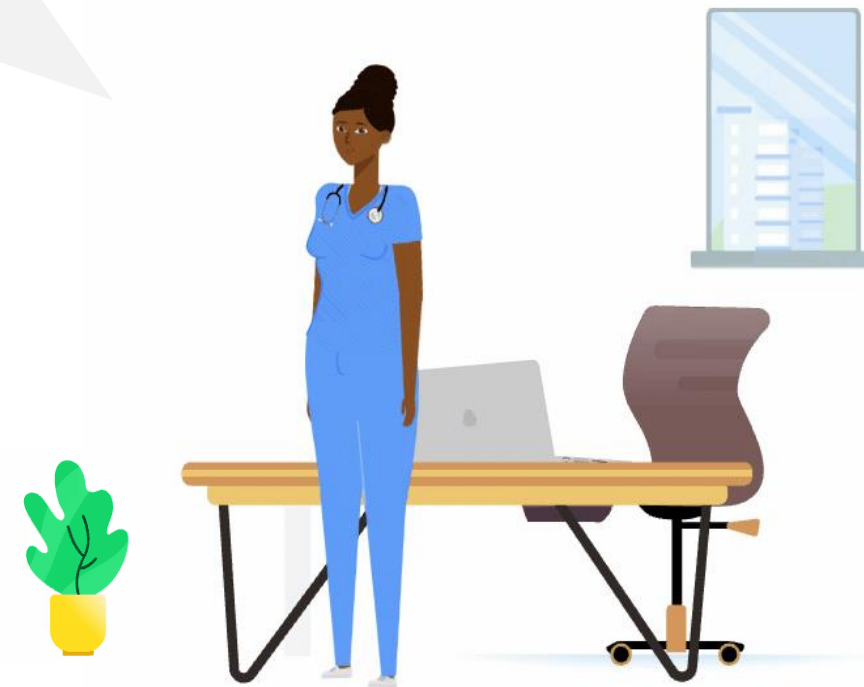

# Sunsetting CAIR Mass Vax

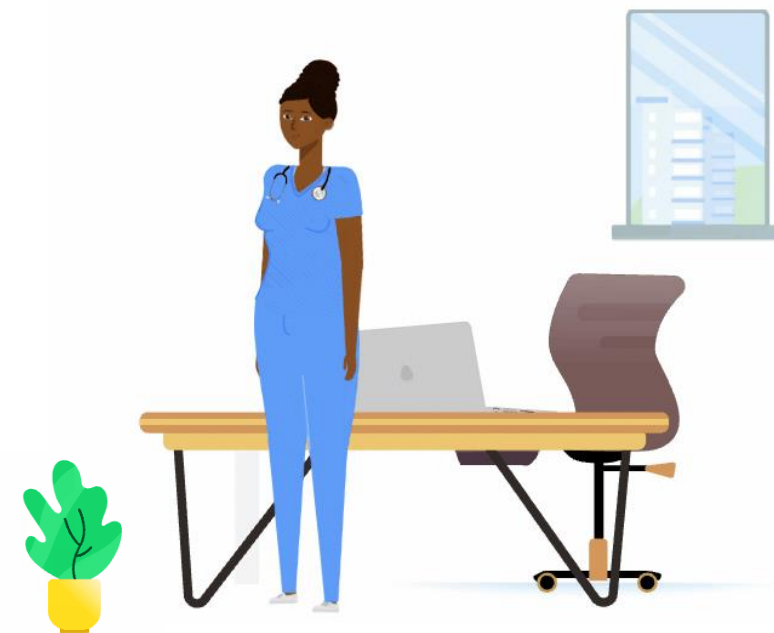
CAIR Mass Vax will be retired by the **end of June 2024**. It has been replaced by CAIR Quick Entry (CQE) in My Turn.

Providers enrolled in My Turn will automatically gain access to CAIR Quick Entry, which offers familiar functionalities from Mass Vax along with enhancements and support additional vaccines.

## Known Issues

### Missing 'Funding Source', 'Route', and 'Injection Site' from completed Super Clinic Jobs?

- ✓ 'Funding Source', 'Route', and 'Injection Site' values may disappear from completed Super Clinic Jobs if you complete the VA flow twice for an appointment.

### Clinic Appointment Reports Including 'Generic' Vaccines

- ✓ Super Clinic appointment reports are including records with a vaccine type of 'Generic'.

### Blank Accounts Dropdown on IIS Status Page

- ✓ Refreshing the IIS Status page may cause an issue where the Accounts dropdown select is blank.

### Greyed Out Pre-Screening Questions if Accessing Certain Appointments Through 'Additional Appointments'

- ✓ If navigating to an appointment that only has one product (traditional or super clinic appointment with one product) via the 'Additional appointments' pop up, the pre-screening questions are greyed out.

### Ordering Provider Required in CAIR for Vaccine Record Submissions

- ✓ CAIR now requires the Ordering Provider to be specified for vaccine record submissions – not having one will result in a warning response from CAIR2. The Ordering Provider data is not currently captured in My Turn.

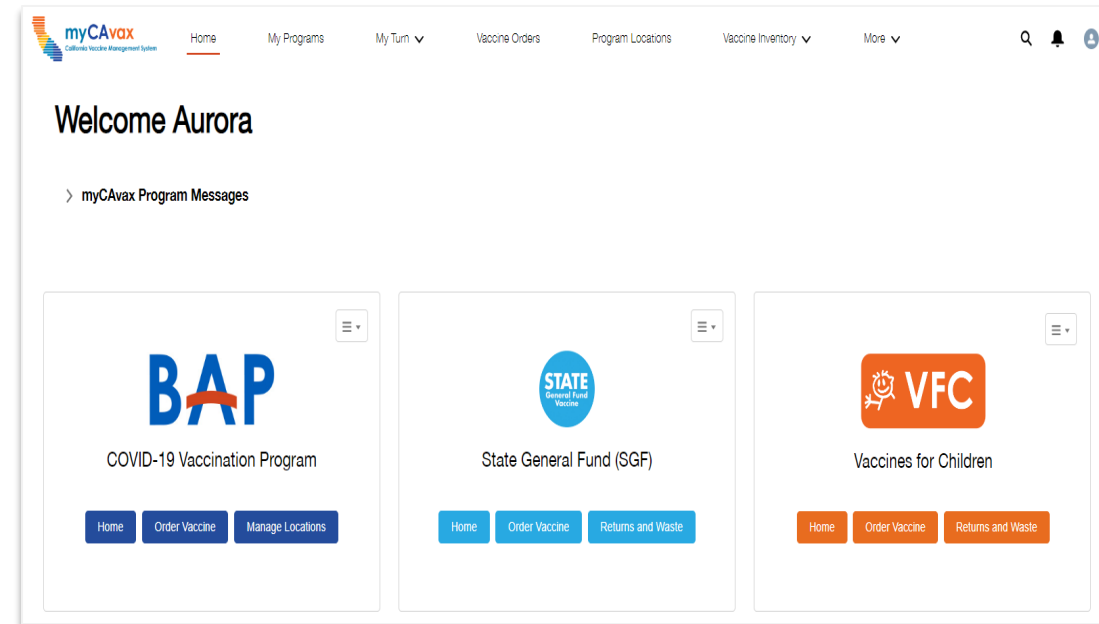

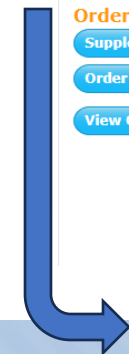

# Reporting Storage and Handling Incidents in myCAvax



Storage and Handling (S&H) incident reporting is moving from SHOTS to the new myCAvax system starting **Monday, June 10, 2024**.

- The **SHOTS** link is still available in MyVFCvaccines until the transition time.
- **Do not** submit any storage and handling incident in SHOTS after **Monday, June 10, 2024**.
- **Note:** The Triage component of SHOTS will NOT be available in myCAvax on June 10. Providers will still report incidents in myCAvax and follow instructions to contact vaccine manufacturers for vaccine stability determination.
- Additional S&H reporting functionality adding the triage component will be available in myCAvax on **Thursday, July 18, 2024**. **Stay tuned!**

# Announcement: myCAvax System Shutdown from June 6 – June 9



myCAvax will be **unavailable** from the evening of **Thursday, June 6, 2024 – Sunday, June 9, 2024**.

- Providers will not be able to log in to the system, place vaccine order requests, or manage vaccine inventory during this time.
- myCAvax will be live on **Monday, June 10, 2024**, with the new VFC program.

# VFC Go-Live in myCAvax: Preparing to Access the VFC Program in myCAvax

You must log in to myCAvax using your own unique login credentials.

## Have myCAvax Access

- **Organization Vaccine Coordinator** – Coming soon! This role oversees multiple vaccine clinics.
- **Primary and Backup Vaccine Coordinators** – Are primarily responsible for routinely ordering and managing VFC vaccines in myCAvax. Attending myCAvax training is highly recommended. Completing EZIZ training is required.
- **Additional Vaccine Coordinator** – If you have a third person who routinely supports the VFC program, you may request one additional vaccine coordinator by calling the VFC Customer Service Center. Completing EZIZ training is required before access can be granted.

- **Provider of Record (POR)** – Must DocuSign VFC program agreement only for newly enrolling VFC providers.

**\*NOTE:** This is true assuming the above roles are the only role assigned to a provider. The above can be primary, backup or additional vaccine coordinators too, which would grant them system access.

# VFC Go-Live in myCAvax: Preparing to Access the VFC Program in myCAvax – Only Provider

Primary and backup vaccine coordinators will be granted access to myCAvax based on the information provided in MyVFCvaccines. **You do not need to take any action to setup or restore myCAvax credentials today. You will be granted system access automatically, based on the information provided in MyVFCvaccines.**

- Be sure your vaccine coordinator information is up to date in MyVFCvaccines by **Friday, May 24, 2024**. Unlike MyVFCvaccines, in myCAvax, each user will need to log in with their own unique credentials.
- Your primary and backup vaccine coordinator will receive a myCAvax welcome email on **Monday, June 10, 2024**, which will ask them to finish setting up their myCAvax user account.

You do **NOT** need to enroll your organization in myCAvax as CDPH will migrate your PIN information into myCAvax.

**New** *Q: When does the California Bridge Access Program (BAP), which provides free COVID-19 vaccine to adults with limited or no insurance end?*

A: The California Bridge Access Program will **now end in August 2024**, just before the arrival of the 2024 – 2025 COVID-19 vaccine. Funding that was previously expected to be available to purchase additional vaccine for the Bridge Access Program was rescinded by Congress and no additional federal funding for COVID-19 vaccine for adults has been identified at this time.

**New** *Q: When will providers learn about the 2024 – 2025 formulation for COVID-19 vaccines?*

A: The updated timeline for the 2024 - 2025 COVID-19 Formula is as follows:

- June 5, 2024: the FDA Vaccines and Related Biologic Products Advisory Committee (VRBPAC) will meet to discuss and make recommendations on the selection of strain(s) to be included in the 2024 - 2025 Formula for COVID-19 vaccines.
- June 26 - 28, 2024: CDC ACIP anticipated to review and vote on recommendations for 2024 - 25 season.
- Late Summer – Fall: 2024 - 2025 vaccine anticipated to be available for use.
- BAP Program ends when the 2023 - 2024 vaccine is no longer recommended, and the 2024 - 2025 vaccine is recommended.

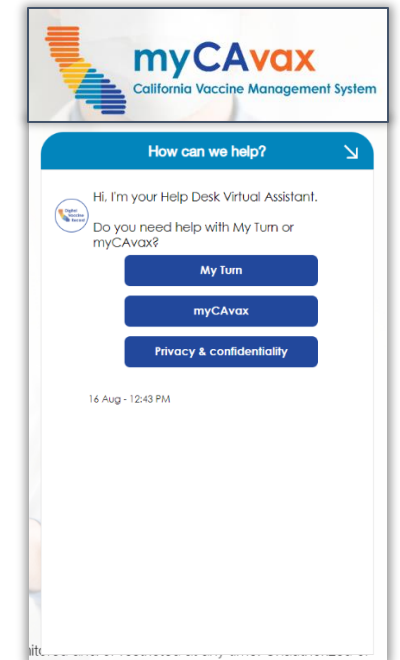

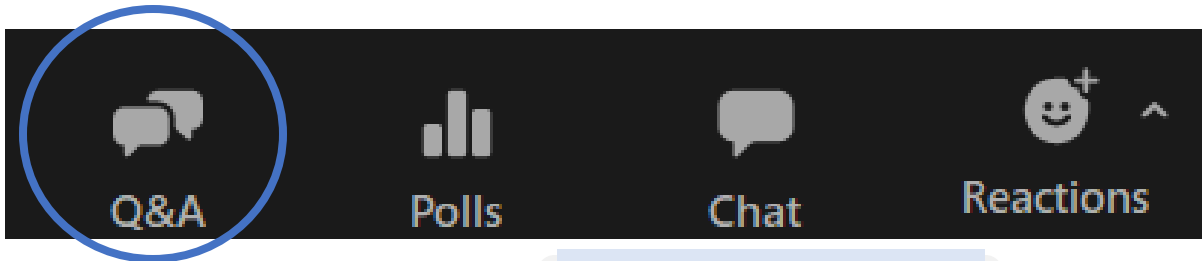
