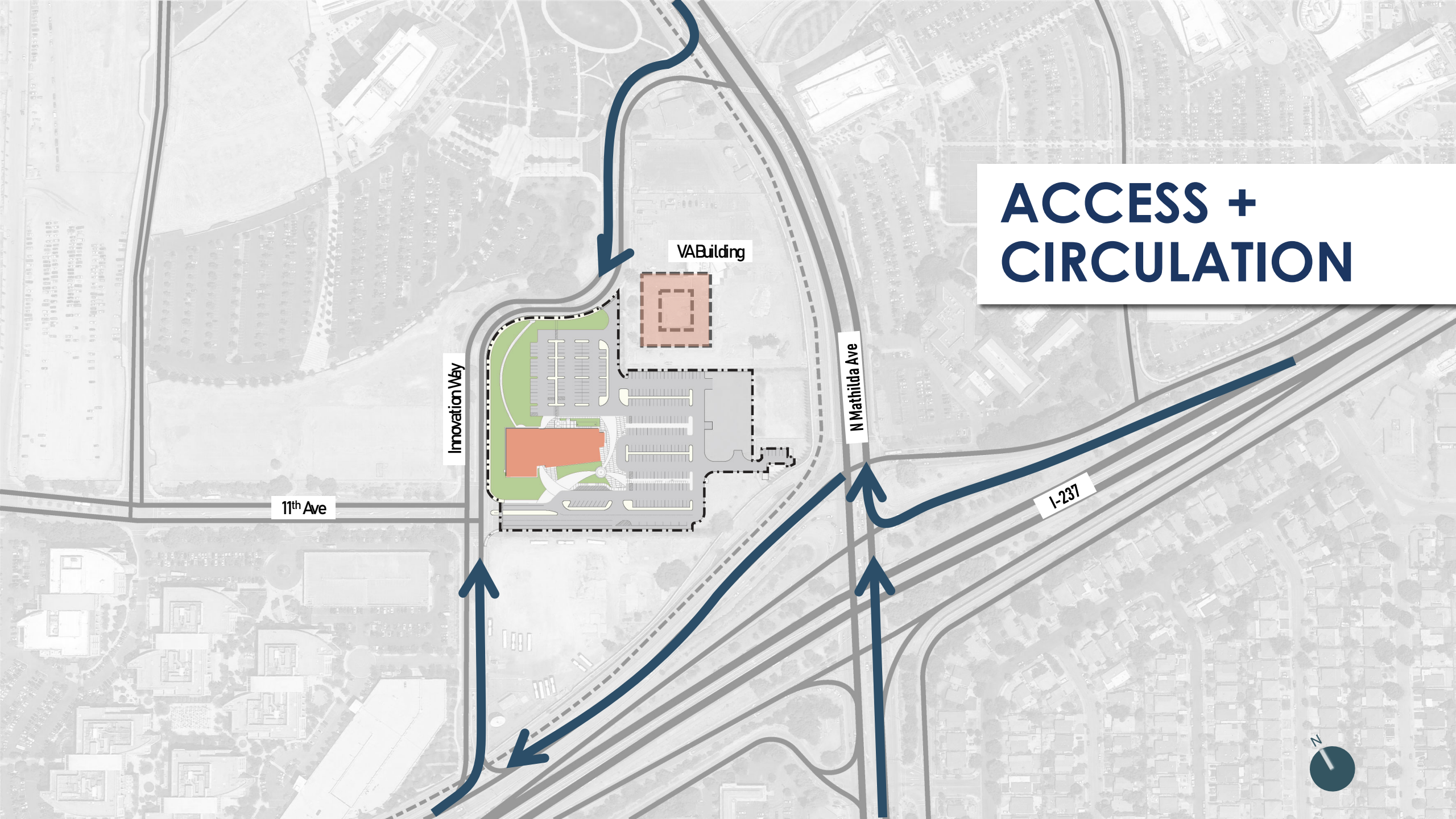

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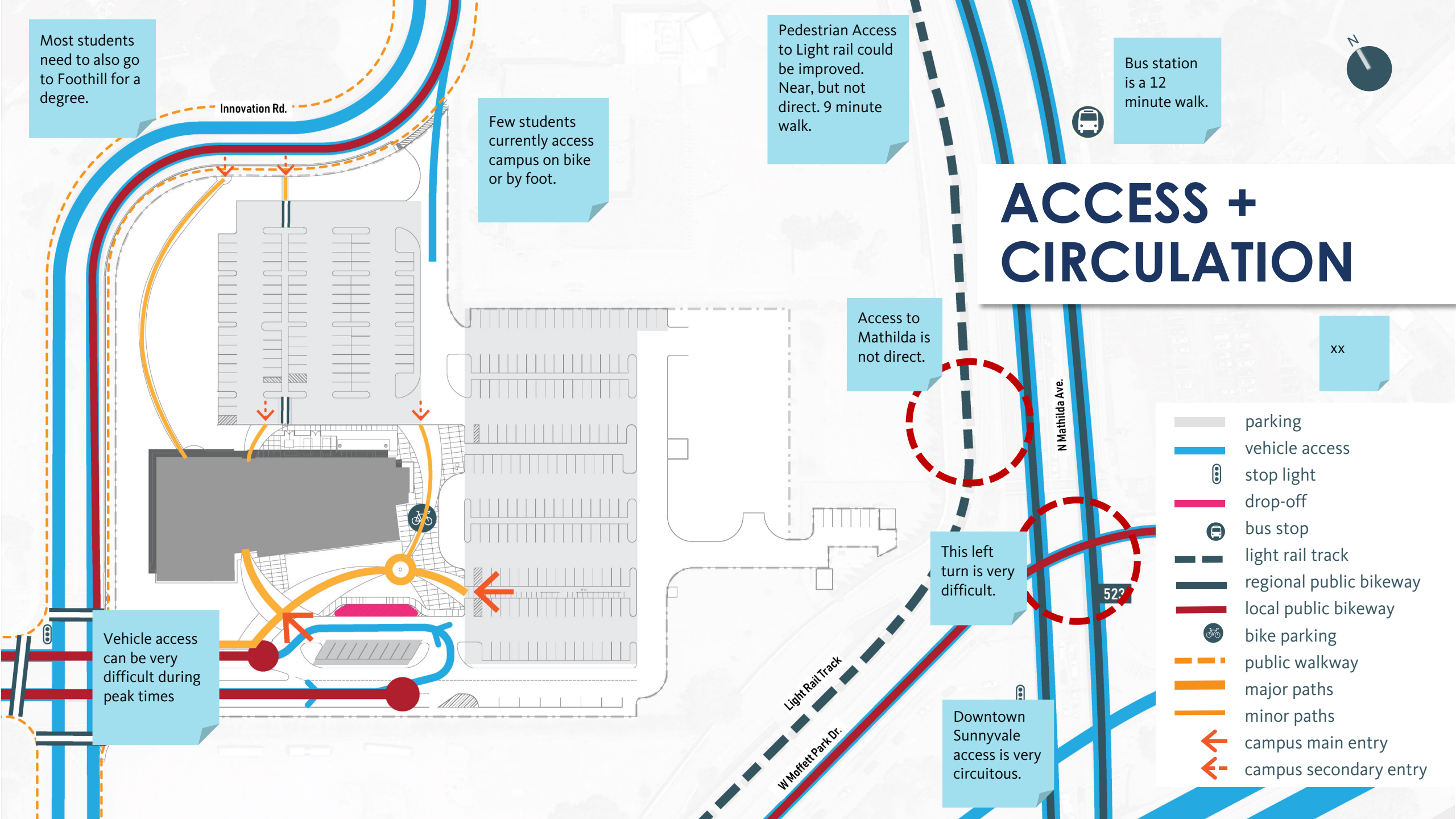
Access to Mathilda is not direct.

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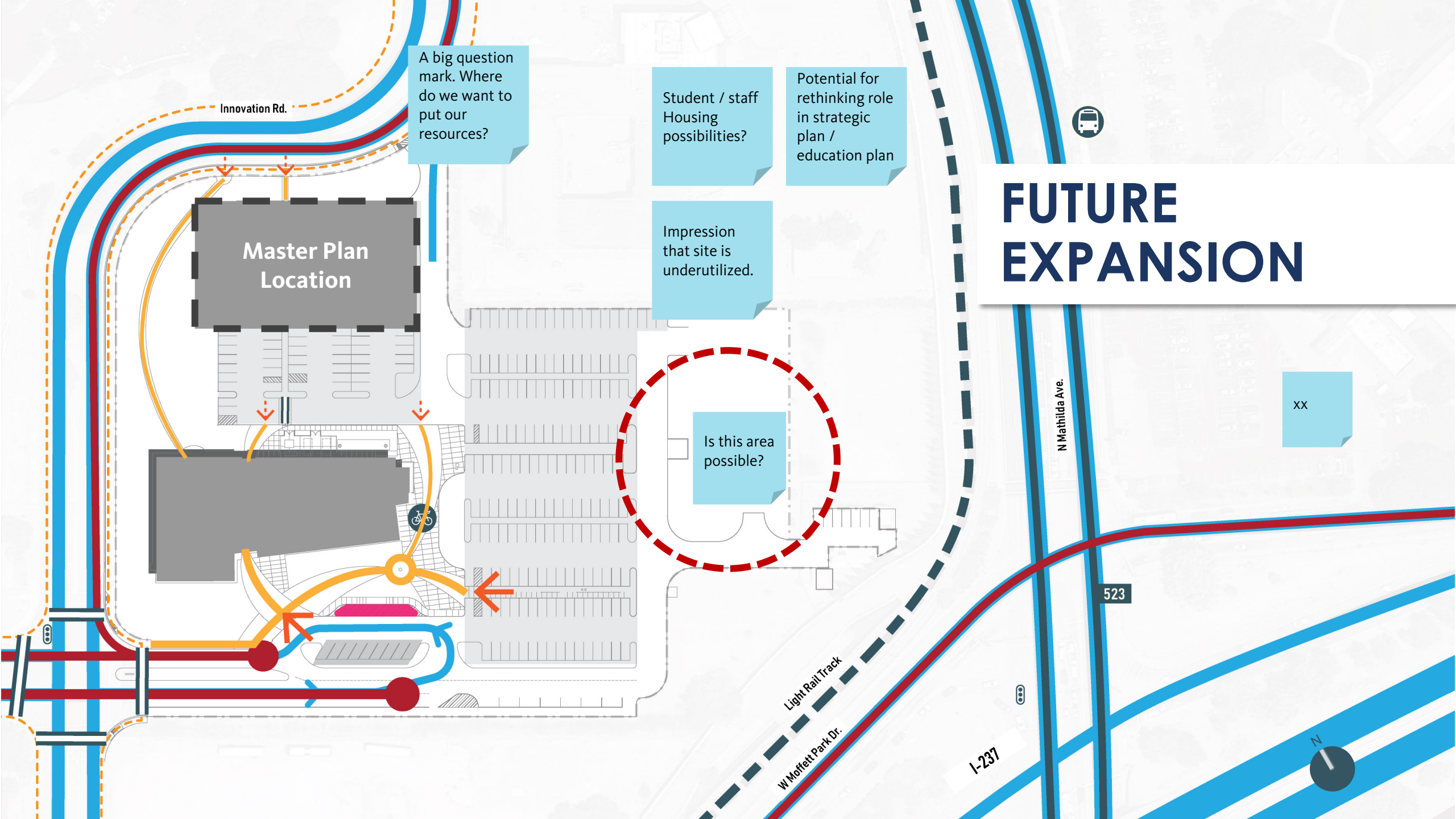

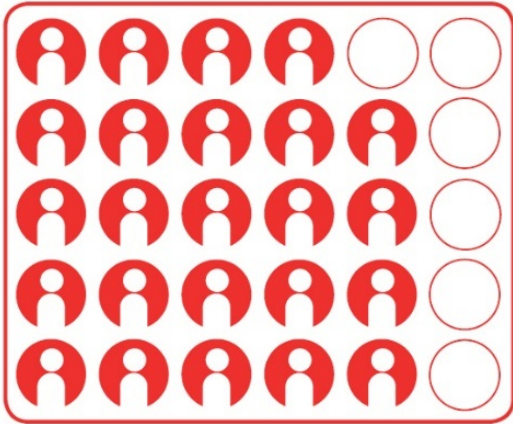

Capacity Load Ratios

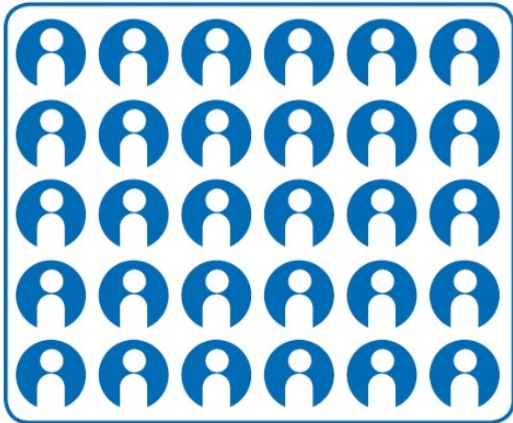
Room Utilization

100% capacity / load



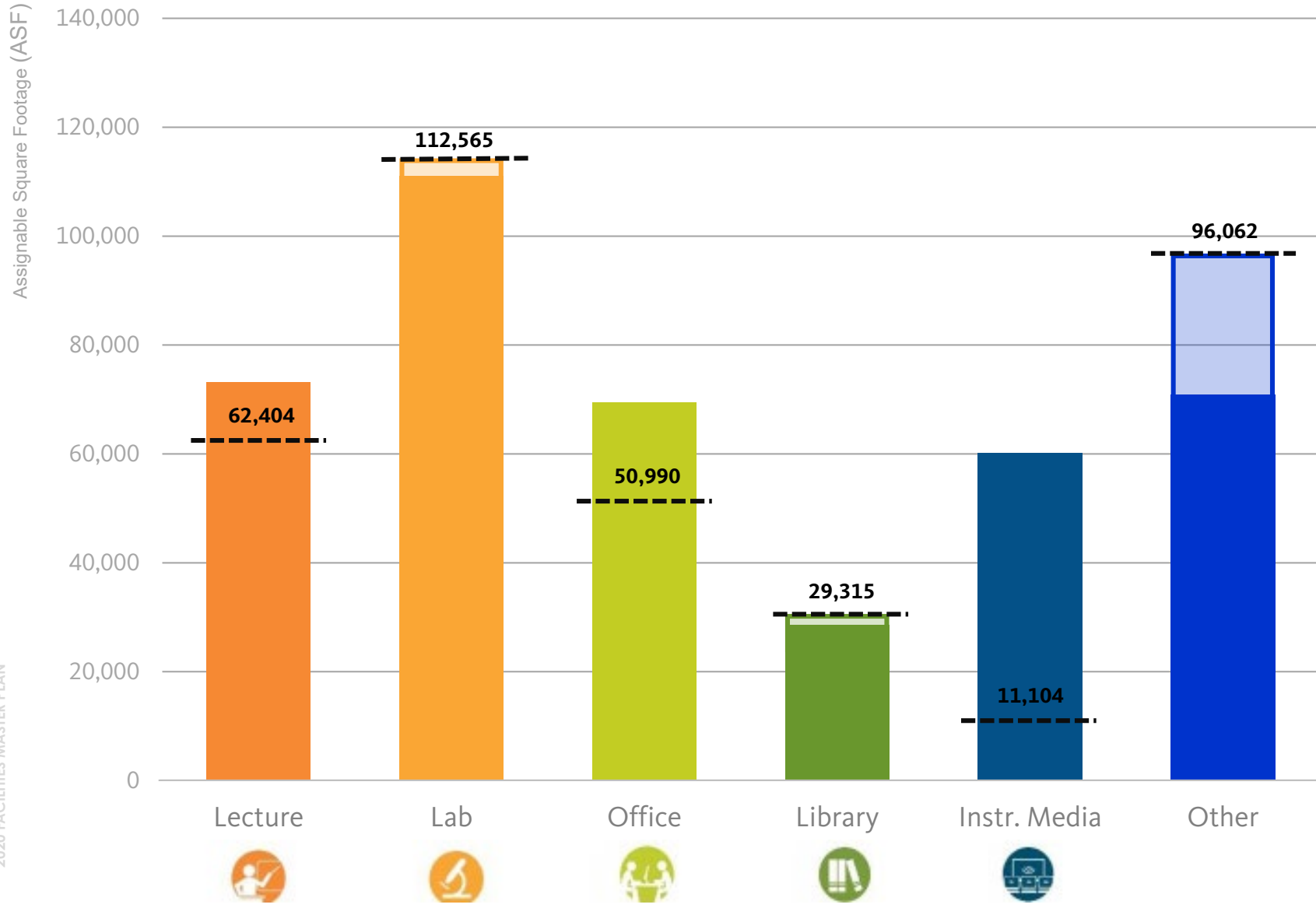
of seats > # of students

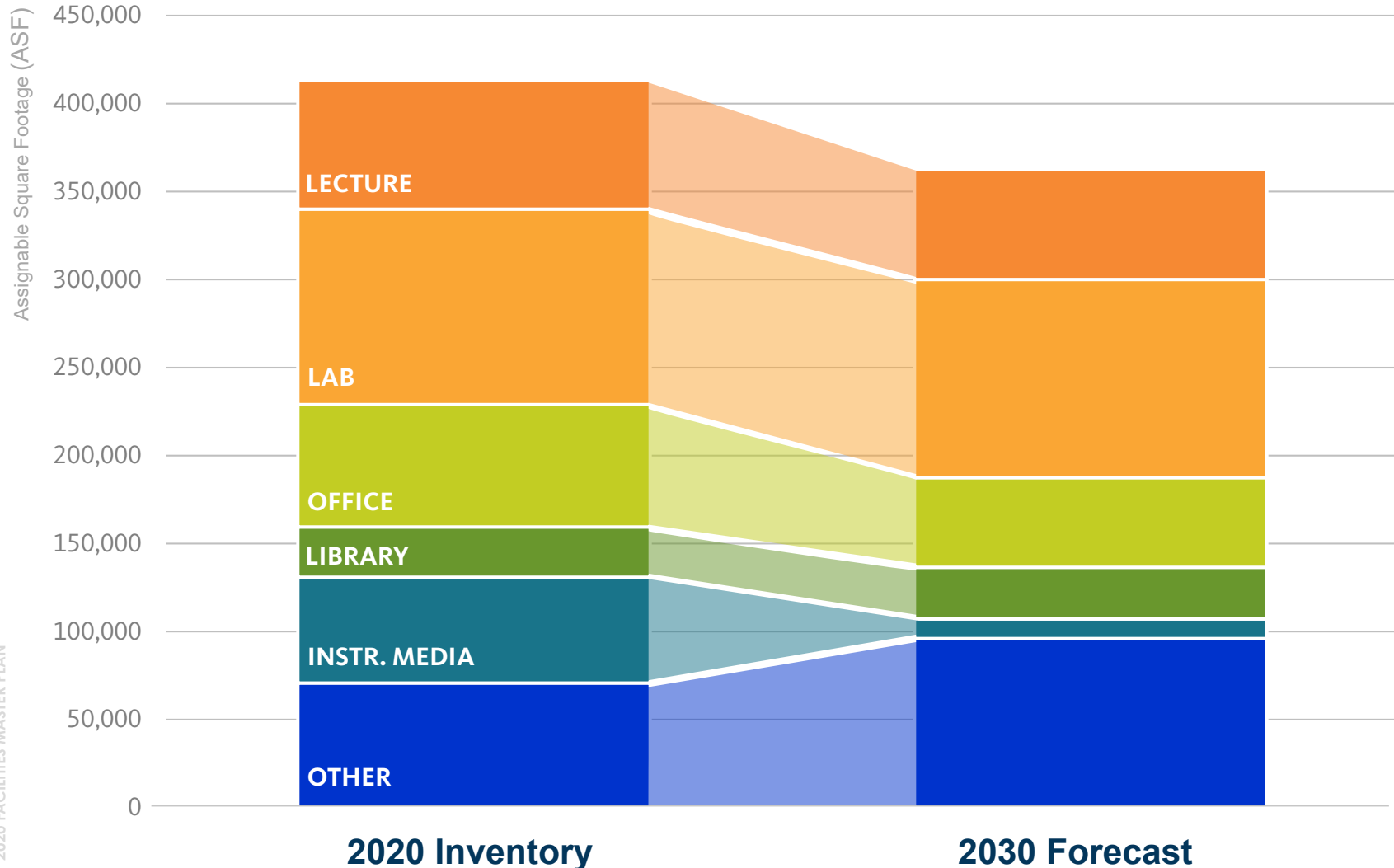

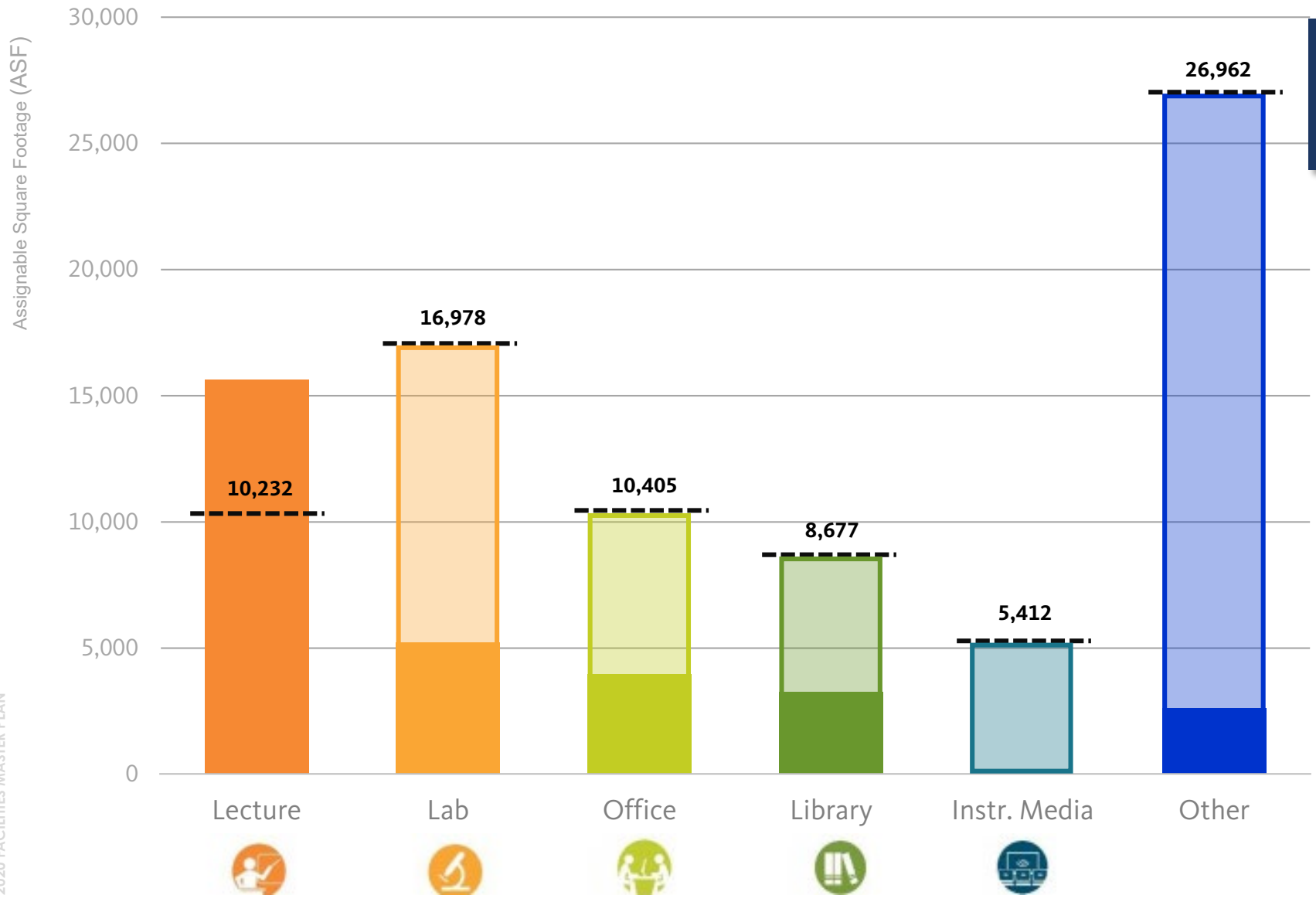
Foothill Campus 2020 - 2030 Comparison

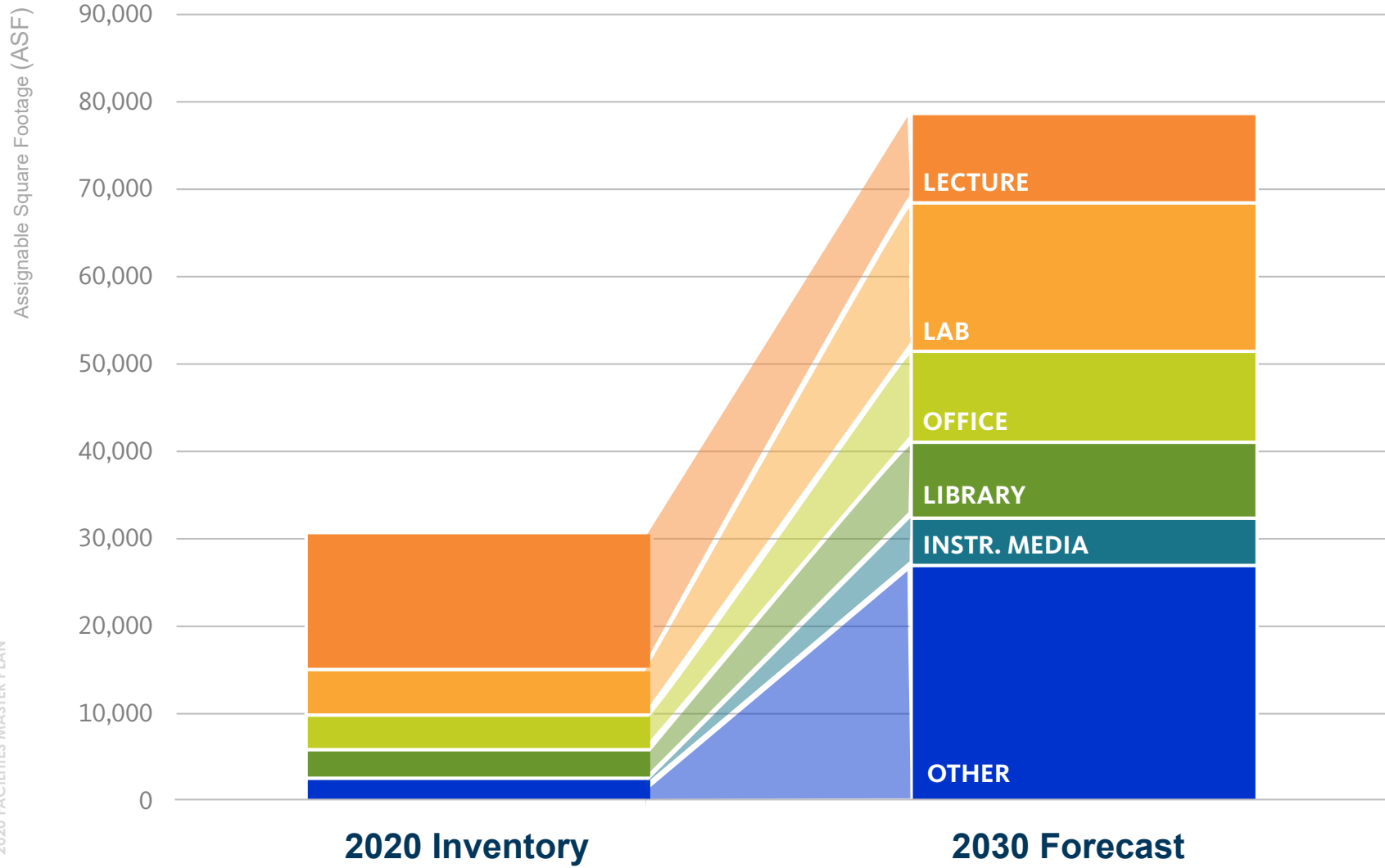
Sunnyvale Campus 2030 Forecast

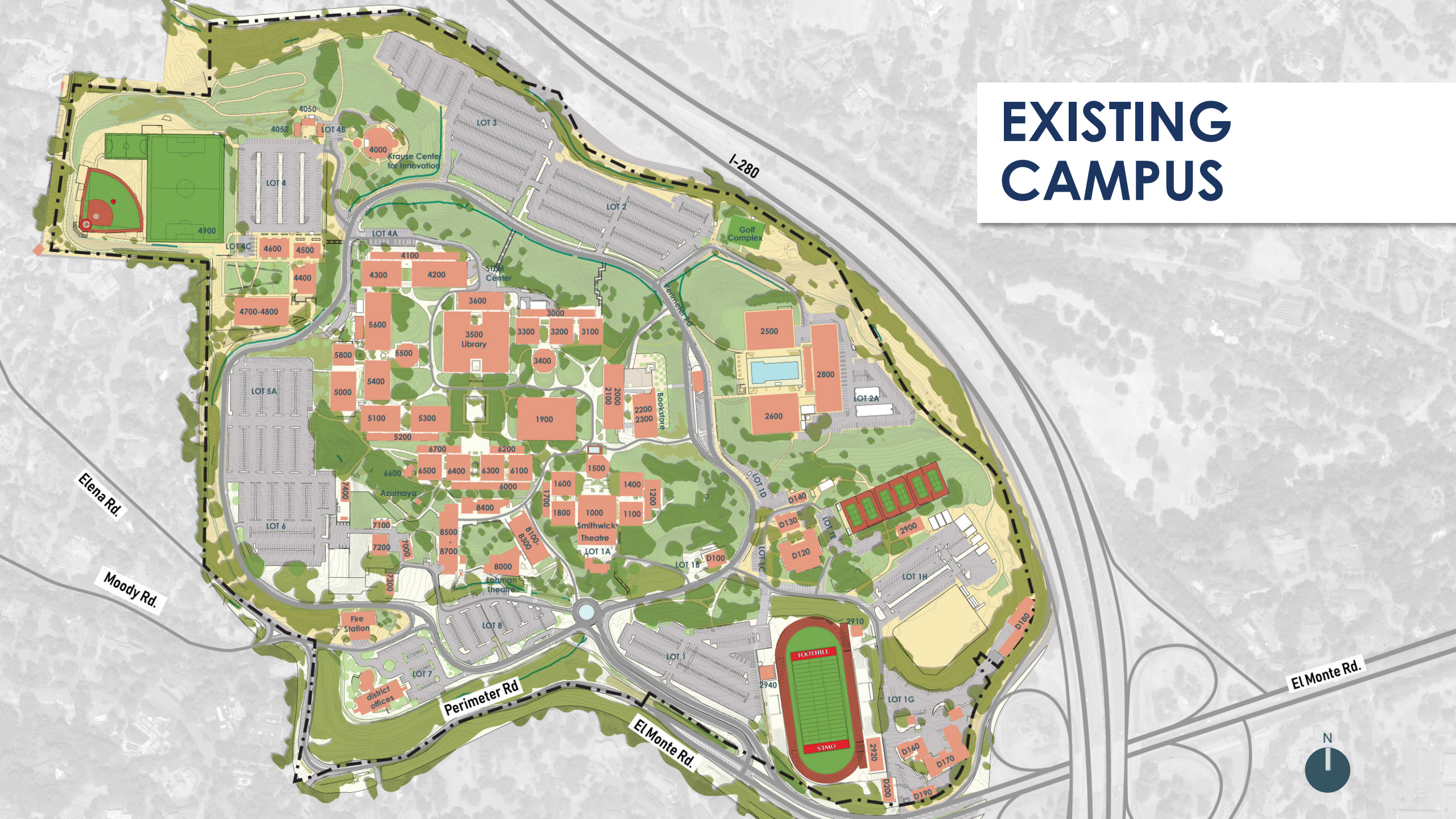

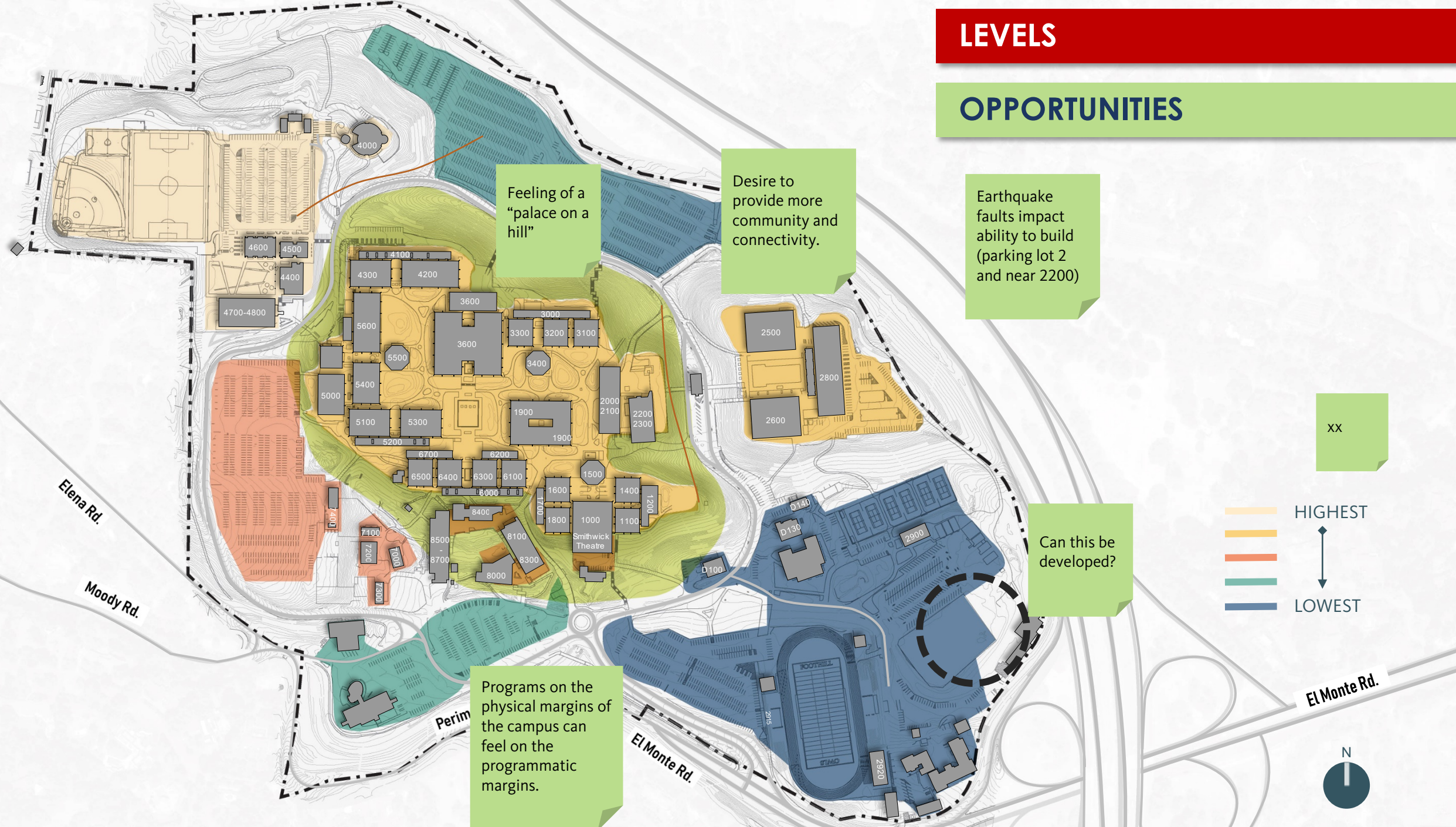
