Experience participants through the streets of Jerusalem and attending committee meetings in the Temple Board Room.

I feel gratified to know that our important work continues even in these less formal settings. And I want to remind you that opportunities for Jewish learning, enrichment, and community connection remain open to you as well, even (or especially) during the slower-paced summer months. This time of year offers terrific ways to deepen your connection with the incredibly rich world of Jewish culture.

This summer, consider reading a book of Jewish interest, even if you rarely do during the rest of the year (I am currently reading Yossi Klein Halevi's Letters to my Palestinian Neighbor, and can recommend it as an accessible and up-to-date perspective on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict). You might also set aside a couple of hours to spend with an Israeli movie or TV show (I recommend Women's Balcony and the gripping series Fauda; both are available on Netflix), or explore some great Jewish music by listening to one of the many resources online; you can easily listen on your computer to an Israeli radio station like Galgalatz (galgalatz.radio. net/), or Jewish Rock Radio (www.jewishrockradio.com).

I hope that these summer months treat you and your loved ones well, and I will look forward to hearing about your best Jewish summer reading (or watching, or listening) experiences when I see you next, whether it's at temple or by the swimming pool!

## Debunking the Myths of Synagogue Membership

When it comes to synagogue membership, the Reform movement is often battling the same myths across the country. As the needs of our communities change, it is our job to make sure that membership is seen as an enhancement to one's life and that the value of having a spiritual home becomes not only apparent, but a necessity.

In order to truly understand the importance of joining a synagogue, you first have to understand the myths that keep our friends and family from joining. It is my hope, rather our hope, that you can have these open and honest conversations with your peers to help them understand the value of membership, specifically here at Emanu El. With the help of some research provided from the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ), here are some of those myths and the truths behind them:

MYTH #1: Synagogues are only for families, specifically young families. It is true that Emanu El has many familyoriented programs, but that does not mean that they are only for families. Anyone and everyone is welcome to attend our family friendly programs. And not to mention our thriving and incredibly comprehensive auxiliary groups that range in age and stage from our Young Professionals to our Emanu Elders, our women's breakfast group to Brotherhood and Sisterhood, social action activities that include a Young Family Social Action committee to our monthly gatherings such as Kids' Meals and, of course, our various worship and Torah study experiences. What sets us aside is that the measure of success for Emanu El's programming is not the number of people who attend, but rather the depth of the connections and relationships that are created.

MYTH #2: Why should I join now? My child is not yet ready for Religious School. It's never too soon to join our congregational family! It's easy to fall into the idea that membership isn't necessary until children are old enough to take advantage of our Helfman Religious School, but there is so much power in your kids growing up watching you do "Jewish" things. A great deal of learning about Judaism is through doing, not just formal classes. You also don't want to overlook the fact that Emanu El provides ongoing opportunities to study, experience and enjoy being connected to a Jewish community.

MYTH #3: It costs a fortune to join a synagogue! Emanu El firmly believes that finances should never be a deterrent to membership. We are happy to work with our members on a case-by-case basis to ensure that everyone is committing at a level that is both meaningful and comfortable. Our chai membership, which is \$72 for the first fiscal year, makes membership easily accessible to those who are new to town or unaffiliated. We believe in low barriers and know there is an entry point for everyone.

We pride ourselves on being warm and welcoming and exhibiting audacious hospitality, but word of mouth and sharing your own personal experiences are the most powerful tools in helping to grow and strengthen our congregation. ## Shirley Barish Memorial Israel Experience Underway



Moonglow, by Michael Chabon THURSDAY, JULY 12TH 6:30 PM

Come join Rabbi Josh Fixler as he reviews Moonglow, by Michael Chabon on **Thursday**, **July 12th at 6:30 p.m**. In 1989, Chabon traveled to his mother's home, in Oakland, California, to visit his terminally-ill grandfather. Tongue loosened by powerful painkillers, memory stirred by the imminence of death, Chabon's grandfather shared recollections the younger

man had never before heard, uncovering bits and pieces of a history long-forgotten. From pre-WWII South Philadelphia, to the invasion of Germany by U.S. forces, from a Florida retirement village, to New York's Wallkill prison, from the heyday of the space program, to the twilight of the 20th century, the novel revisits an entire era through a single life.




