FROM RABBI HAYON



Watching our high school learners sample the riches of Jewish knowledge, and seeing them use those resources to forge meaning in their own lives, is best way for us to understand what Torah means and appreciate its deep and enduring value.

The festival of Shavuot is our annual celebration of the dramatic day, thousands of years ago, on which Jewish tradition asserts that the Ten Commandments were revealed to Moses on the top of Mt. Sinai.

Over the centuries, the observance of Shavuot has broadened and expanded, and today this holy day has become a time on which we commemorate and celebrate Jewish learning in its broadest sense, giving thanks for the many diverse forms of Jewish insight and inspiration that guide our lives.

In the Reform Movement, Shavuot has also been the day on which our congregations celebrate the Confirmation of our 10th grade students. When the custom of Confirmation first began, it was an innovation of early Reform congregations in Germany, which makes Confirmation perhaps the most recent life-cycle event to be introduced to Jewish life. The first synagogue known to have held a Confirmation service was the Reform congregation in Dessau, Germany in 1803. These earliest ceremonies were

Rabbi Walter Honored with Inaugural 'Spirit of Respect' Award from Interfaith Ministries

Rabbi Roy Walter was honored with the inaugural 'Spirit of Respect' award from Interfaith Ministries of Greater Houston (IMGH) in April. The honor came at IMGH's annual Tapestry Gala. The event was co-chaired by amongst others, Emanu El members Lorraine and Ed Wulfe.

The plaque from IMGH reads, "Rabbi Walter's leadership helped focus Interfaith Ministries' mission on addressing food insecurity through the early days of what ultimately became the Houston Food Bank and then through our ongoing Meals on Wheels program to support seniors and people with disabilities across our city . . . Rabbi Walter exemplified his commitment not only to the Jewish community but to people of all faiths."

for boys only; girls were welcomed into Confirmation classes about a decade later, in Berlin.

Our Reform forebears originally conceived of Confirmation as a replacement for bar mitzvah; they reasoned that 13-year-olds were too immature to be expected to assume the beliefs and responsibilities of Jewish adulthood, and many felt that the custom of bar mitzvah was "vulgar" because it appeared to call attention to the onset of puberty among adolescents.

Of course, in today's Reform Movement we joyfully embrace both moments of transition in our children's lives: at their b'nai mitzvah we acknowledge their arrival into Jewish adulthood, and at Confirmation we celebrate their decision to affirm their own commitment to Jewish values, Jewish learning, and Jewish life.

For me, the annual opportunity to share the bima with our confirmands is a great blessing, and a cause for bright optimism. Most of all, the joy of welcoming them into vast expanse of Jewish learning is what enables me to understand and appreciate Shavuot most fully. Watching our high school learners sample the riches of Jewish knowledge, and seeing them use those resources to forge meaning in their own lives, is best way for us to understand what Torah means and appreciate its deep and enduring value.

This year, we will welcome the Confirmation Class of 2019 to the bima on the evening of **June 8th**. I very much hope you will join us to celebrate their accomplishments and reaffirm the precious value of Jewish education in our congregational community.


Rabbi Oren Hayon Participates in Interfaith Prayer Vigil




Brotherhood Hosts Annual Real Men Make Chocolate Matzah

Congregation Emanu El Completes Roof Project and Begins Installation of HVAC for Feld Hall & Barish Sanctuary

Feld Hall, Barish Sanctuary & Proler Chapel Parking Lot to Remain Closed for Duration of Project; Sunset Circle Drive to Close



The roof project at Congregation Emanu El is complete. The new gutters and downspouts were amongst the last items installed as part of this project and the "punch list" was completed during the first few weeks of May.

We are excited to share news that the roof project at Congregation Emanu El is complete.

Starting this month, a heating and air conditioning project will commence in Feld Hall and the Barish Sanctuary which will take place over the course of the summer. The congregation approved the financing for both the roof and HVAC projects at its annual meeting in 2018.

Beginning on **Monday, June 3rd**, Feld Hall will be closed followed by the Barish Sanctuary a week later. For the duration of the project, these spaces and the Sunset foyer will not be accessible to anyone other than the contractors working on the HVAC project.

All impacted parties have been notified during the last few months and those with memorial plaques scheduled to be illuminated during this timeframe will be informed of the inability to view their loved ones' plaque as part of our yarzheit communications.

In addition, the small parking lot adjacent to the Proler Chapel previously used by the roofing contractor, will continue to be closed for use by our HVAC contractors for the duration of the project.

Lastly, the circle drive located at the front of our property on Sunset will be closed for the majority of this project, as temporary air conditioning to help protect both Feld Hall and the Barish Sanctuary will be housed in this space. Guests to our campus wanting to access the Gaylor Parking Facility will be asked to do so from the east driveway (closest to Hermann Park), while those parking in our west surface lot will be asked to do so via the west driveway (closest to Rice Village). There continues to be no garage access from the west driveway.

Any additional updates will be shared in the *Bulletin* and our other communications.

Remarks delivered by Emanu El President Rodney Roth on Friday, May 10th at Leadership Shabbat.

My Grandmother, who we lovingly referred to as "Nanny," was an only child with a first cousin named Ernest with whom she was very close. They played together, worked in the family vineyards together and attended Sunday school together. They lived an idyllic life until the seeds of antisemitism stripped them of their youth. Shortly after Hitler's rise to power, my grandparents,

along with Ernest, fled Nazi Germany and eventually settled in Houston where my grandparents started the family meat business.

During those early days in the mid-1940's, it was a prosperous time for the meat industry, as meat was rationed for the troops. Ernest, who also worked in the family business, married a lovely young lady named Rose; but unfortunately, they were unable to have children.

While Ernest and Rose's local family was initially very small, they established a new spiritual family and home at Emanu El. Ernest became very dedicated to Emanu El and attended Shabbat services every week. He was active in the Brotherhood, held almost every office, and was treasurer for over two decades. He was the ultimate congregant who dedicated his life to Emanu El, and did so passionately, without expectation of praise or recognition.

Next week, we honor and celebrate his incredible legacy as we name the congregant of the year, an esteemed award that bears his name. The dedication of Ernest and so many others including this year's recipients, Philip and Donna Tenenbaum, is what continues to inspire me to engage in my spiritual community and family, Emanu El.

This year, our 75th year as a congregation, has been an amazing one thus far and has been incredibly fulfilling on both personal and spiritual levels. We started the year with a cantorial concert that moved our hearts and souls. We have been blessed with dynamic programs, celebrations, and study that have brought us even closer as a community. I wanted to share with you the top 5 reasons why I am so committed and inspired by our congregation, and the personal benefits and gifts that I have received in return.

 For me it creates a feeling of gratitude. Feelings of compassion, humanity and a deepened sense of appreciation have awakened my soul since I have become involved. Taking a moment to reflect on all that we hold sacred and meaningful will no doubt fill your heart with love and gratitude for this community.

- 2. Giving your time and resources encourages a culture of giving. Behaviors are contagious. If people see you or others giving freely of yourselves, it will likely inspire them to do the same. - 4. Researchers say there is a proven health benefit from volunteering. On a physical level, you are bound to experience an elevation in your personal well-being. Being a part of this community, I have experienced a boost in my morale and confidence, developed increased feelings of happiness, and have found greater purpose in life. All of this has resulted in naturally lower stress levels.
- 5. It feels good to give. Deep down inside we all want to feel that we have contributed, added value, meaning, and purpose in our lives. My leadership role has enabled me to hopefully make a difference. The personal and spiritual benefits I have received in return are immeasurable. Just like Ernest, who dedicated himself to this sacred institution, it is now our turn. It is our turn to lead, to give back and to help build a brighter future for our children and future generations.

So, on this special day, our 75th Leadership Shabbat, I would like for you to find your place and to get involved like Ernest, the Tenenbaums, and the other leaders and forbearers that helped pave the way for us all today. I would like for you to discover the benefits that personally and spiritually await. The year is going to be filled with more opportunities for celebration, learning, and growth -- a chance for you to get involved and dive into the many opportunities that our spiritual home provides. I promise you will find it refreshing and rewarding.

On this special day, I would like to acknowledge all previous leaders, both professional and lay, who have given their time and talents to protect and nurture this precious asset so they too could pass it on to our community. I would like to acknowledge those members of the Executive Committee, who I have not only learned from, but who have also inspired me with their

Lastly, I would like to thank you all for honoring me with this responsibility and opportunity to lead and serve our congregation. Shabbat Shalom.






