vessels of flesh" for another day, another year.

This month, as the year 2021 begins, we look back at the journey we have shared together through an unforgettable year. We have spent plenty of time talking together about the difficulties and losses we have experienced together during 2020. I wonder, however, if we have also cultivated the capacity to consider what blessings we have come to know during our orbit around the sun during the past year.

As Rabbi Weinberg reflects in her poem, with the right perspective, journeys of discovery are intrinsically rewarding – whether or not they are comfortable. # Reopening Plan Update: Phase Status Change

This communication from the synagogue was sent to our congregational community on Tuesday, December 1. As of this publication's press time, there is no additional communication to share. Congregants are encouraged to visit emanuelhouston.org for any updates.

Dear Congregants,

You may recall that in mid-October our congregation's COVID-19 reopening plan was updated to reflect the latest guidance from public health agencies and our medical advisors. That guidance called for monitoring the movement of public health trends to inform the progress of our reopening process.

Unfortunately, in recent weeks, we have seen a significant upward movement of these trends. Based on the latest guidance and for the safety of our community, therefore, our Reopening Plan will be moving back to Phase 2, which will entail the following changes:

- Friday night and Saturday morning worship will be limited to B'nei Mitzvah families only (restricted to 10 total attendees per family)
- Funerals will be limited to 10 people, and will be held graveside only
- All meetings will be held virtually
- Other life-cycle events will be limited to 10 people

These guidelines should be considered effective immediately, and the reopening page on our website has been updated with more details on the above changes.

As always, we thank you for your support of Emanu El, and for your partnership in our work to keep our congregation safe and healthy at all times.

# Emanu El Leadership Duo Attend Virtual Professional Conferences

In-person conferences are out and virtual conferences in this year.

During the month of November, Congregation Emanu El Program Director Jason Plotkin attended the Program & Engagement Professionals of Reform Judaism (PEP-RJ) conference before joining colleague and Emanu El Executive Director David Lamden at the National Association for Temple Administration (NATA) conference in December.

The PEP-RJ conference came to a close during the third year of Plotkin's term overseeing membership for the organization. The organization's membership has more than doubled during the last three years, and this past year's conference featured a record 67 synagogue professionals.

During the conference, Plotkin presented a session on how ways synagogues are engaging communities during COVID19 alongside Alexandra Horn of Temple Emanu-El in Dallas. The presentation focused on getting back to basics and concentrating on the intent behind how communities are engaged. Keynote presenters at the conference included Trybal Bootcamp CEO/Founder Carine Warasawski and Spertus Institute Chancellor Dr. Hal Lewis.

Several weeks later, Lamden and Plotkin attended the NATA conference which featured over 250 synagogue administrators.

For Lamden, it was the conclusion of his first year as Vice President of NATA while Plotkin oversaw the technology committee that managed the backend of the conference.

During the conference, Lamden presented with colleagues from across the country a session, entitled "Time Saving Technology Tools." Many institutions including synagogues are trying to consolidate and improve their abilities to work remotely. The session showcased some of the new technologies available and tools that were being used in synagogues.

Keynote speakers at NATA included Abby Fifer Mandell, the executive director of the Brittingham Social Enterprise Lab at the University of Southern California and Joel Brockner, the Phillip Hettleman Professor of Business at the Columbia Business School.






