# From Rabbi Hayon



From its inception, our congregation has distinguished itself by the depth and strength of its connection with Israel and that commitment continues today. I was proud to have had Emanu El participate in our community's city-wide Shabbat of Unity event a couple of weeks ago, when congregations across the Houston Jewish community dedicated time to discuss from the bima during Shabbat services how they connect them-

selves with the Jewish state. The purpose of this event was to achieve a goal that was a high priority for our Jewish Federation and for the leadership of our congregations, as well: to demonstrate and emphasize that a commitment to Israel unites us all, and that connectedness with Israel supersedes the many healthy differences of opinion that run through the Jewish community.

For me, I was delighted that the Shabbat of Unity gave me the opportunity to express the reasons that I prioritize a congregational connection with Israel and to share publicly some of my personal experiences and feelings that bind me to Israel and to the principles of Zionism. On that night, I said, in part:

uniquely privileged position to offer inspiration to our world, to be a source of high moral and ethical standards in the region and across the globe. I'm connected to it because Israel itself is beautiful and inspiring, but because it is an incredibly powerful force that channels and inspires the creative impulses of artists and entrepreneurs and scientists toward moving, beautiful, powerful expression. I'm devoted to it because every time I go there, I find something that I have never seen before; every time, I learn something I never knew before; every time, I glean another Jewish spark to elevate my prayer and my writing and my connectedness to all of you. For me, it is crystal-clear that Israel's greatest gifts are accessible chiefly to those who spend time with her.

It is indisputable that a lifelong relationship with Israel yields rich and transformative benefits. It connects one anew to one's synagogue, to one's faith, to one's history and one's people. This is, of course, not to disregard the fact that remaining in relationship with Israel may feel challenging at times. Her regional neighbors and her history of struggle and conflict mean that Israel can be a demanding partner to dance with at times, but I believe that it is foolish for us to allow these challenges to prevent us from forming and maintaining a thoughtful and comprehensive relationship with Israel. Deciding to stand aloof from this relationship means that one will miss out on all these powerful moments and extraordinary potential that Israel has to offer us and our real lives as American Jews.

And so, as I have gotten to know the Emanu El community better and better over the course of my first year here, I have been thrilled to realize how deep our congregational commitment is to creating openings for individual temple members to forge and nurture ongoing connections with the Jewish state. I'm proud that dozens of our Helfman high school students will be returning for another trip to Israel with the Shirley Barish Memorial Israel Experience this summer, and I am so excited to know that these young members of our congregation will return to us with a renewed sense of self, of history and of Jewish identity.

And for the rest of us, I am delighted to announce that plans are now well underway for our next congregational trip. This trip, an intergenerational opportunity for congregants of all ages, will enable us to experience Israel alongside our families – and to see ourselves in the worldwide family of Israel, as well. This will be an exceptional (and, for many of us, once-in-a-lifetime) opportunity to experience Israel alongside friends and family, in the company of temple clergy.

More information about this congregational trip to Israel, which will take place in early June of 2017, will be forthcoming as it develops. For now, if you're interested – and I sincerely hope you will be – I encourage you to begin saving time on your family's calendar and to keep your eyes open for updates in the Temple *Bulletin* and its website.

There is probably no experience as profound and formative to one's Jewish identity as the experience of getting to know Israel for oneself and forming a personal relationship with the place that has inspired countless generations of poets, sages and thinkers. I hope you will join us to spend time in Israel next summer – and to prepare yourself for a spiritual experience like no other.

#### **BOARD NOTES - MAY 2016**

The Board of Trustees met on May 10th and took part in an icebreaker to introduce new and continuing Board members to each other. Jeff Basen-Engquist asked new members of the Board to reach out to an existing member in order to have a mentor for the coming year.

The Executive Committee has begun implementing the Governance Plan that was approved by the Board last August. The Governance Plan is a set of recommendations that creates an efficient and effective governance structure in which lay volunteers are able to thrive and will further the mission of Congregation Emanu El. The Board will begin looking at their role in this Governance Plan at their June meeting.

One of the recommendations of the Governance Plan is the review and revamping of our bylaws. The Bylaws Task Force is progressing with the overhaul of our current bylaws and the Board will begin reviewing sections in June and continue throughout the summer. The goal is to have the revised final version of the bylaws presented to the congregation by the end of the calendar year for a congregational vote.

Rabbi Hayon announced the hiring of an Experiential Education Coordinator. Robert Goodfriend announced the Audit Committee held their first meeting of the fiscal year as part of the ongoing fiscal responsibility of the Board. Lauren Vines reported that the Youth Committee met four times this past year. The committee is rebuilding and growing. The Youth Committee is drafting questions to send out through Survey Monkey to guide the committee.

Jeff thanked fredi Bleeker Franks and the Cantorial Search Committee for all of their thoughtful work.

conclusion. And we count the Omer as we move from Passover to Shavuot.

Large organizations experience change continuously. It can be jarring, acknowledging change is normal and to be expected, especially within a spiritual and social community such as ours. We greet new faces and sense the absence of old friends. We ask "Who is in that office down the hall now?" We take note of our response to the new lighting in the hallway, gift shop, and gallery.

The month of May brings in our new fiscal year with the installation of new leadership and shifting responsibilities. New personal and working relationships are forming and bonds are developing. Change will be on the agenda, as ever. In May, our Executive Committee began implementing the Governance Plan, a product of almost a year of task force and Board work. Adopted by the Board last August, it provides a blueprint for structure and accountability while recommending specific roles and training for Trustees and Chairs. It also endorses expanded and representative participation at all levels.

Additionally, the Bylaws Task Force is completing its draft for initial Board review. Their charge is to modernize our language and approach while keeping our actions in line with our traditions. Before this affects our operations, information will be shared, input sought, and a congregational vote taken as required by our bylaws. You will be hearing more.

Our music program continues to undergo a significant evolution. While many of us still easily recall Cantor Tunitsky's soaring tones, we bid adieu to Cantor Perman. I want to personally thank Cantor Perman, adding my thanks to those expressed by congregants who have described the joy he has brought to our worship and congregational life. And we will spend the coming year together in anticipation of Cantor Rollin Simmons' arrival in July 2017. I am excited about her authentic Jewish presence and broad musical skills. As any new clergy team member, but uniquely as Cantor, she can enhance our services and guide our learning. While we wait for her to arrive we will not lose a year, but will continue to worship and celebrate with song while we learn and prepare for the future.

Our staff moves ahead as well, with new positions and people. Having set a high bar for the position, Kristina Boshernitzan departs as Membership and Outreach Coordinator. Jill Patir has joined our staff will transition to full time duties in that role in August. Welcome, Jill! With a few modest shifts in responsibilities in our education program, we will bring aboard a Coordinator of Experiential Education to build strong relationships with our congregational youth and their families, assuming responsibility for a number of Helfman's longstanding informal educational programs while broadening an already successful initiative to engage Emanu El youth of all ages.

Our tradition teaches us to engage with our history and to learn from shared experience. We also recognize while new people and practices can be distressing, thoughtful and gradual change leads to growth and increased relevance. The late spring breeze moving through our open windows reminds us of the inevitability of change while encouraging us to savor each moment of it together.

### **Congregation Emanu El Announces Selection of Rollin Simmons As Cantor**



On Tuesday, May 10th, in an email (and subsequent letter) to the Congregation, Emanu El Board of Trustees President Jeff Basen-Engquist announced that following the completion of the Cantorial Search Committee's hard work, Rabbi Oren Hayon has selected **Cantor Rollin Simmons** as the Temple's new Cantor. Cantor Simmons will serve as a full mem-

ber of the clergy team in all aspects of worship, education and pastoral care.

Cantor Simmons has served as the Aspen Jewish Congregation's cantor since July 2010. Prior to that post, she served as Student Cantor at Hebrew Tabernacle Congregation in New York and at Temple Emanu-El in Dallas, where she worked with Rabbi Hayon during his tenure there. Cantor Simmons was ordained as Cantor and earned her Masters of Sacred Music at the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion's School of Sacred Music in New York in May 2010.

Due to her present contract status, Cantor Simmons will begin her tenure at Emanu El on July 1, 2017. She will spend three weekend visits with Emanu El over the coming year as a part of her transition to Houston, all of which will be announced ahead of time through the Temple *Bulletin* and other communications.

Rabbi Hayon is working with HUC-JIR's School of Sacred Music and the American Conference of Cantors to ensure that Emanu El's tradition of excellence in our music program will remain solidly in place until Cantor Simmons assumes her full-time duties next year. Additional information regarding musical leadership at Shabbat and High Holy Day services in the absence of a full-time Cantor will be announced soon. In addition to our regular schedule of worship accompanists, we expect that additional musicians will be enlisted to augment our programs and ensure continuity of service to our congregants. More information will be shared as schedules are confirmed.

On November 9, 1938, known as Kristallnacht, the Nazis unleashed a night of terror for Jews all across Germany. At the same time, the Japanese Imperial Army rampaged through China, tightening its stranglehold on Shanghai, a city that becomes the last haven for thousands of desperate European Jews. Dr. Franz Adler, a renowned surgeon, is swept up in the wave of anti-Semitic violence and flees to Shanghai with his daughter. At a refugee hospital, Franz meets an enigmatic nurse, Soon Yi "Sunny" Mah. The danger escalates for Shanghai's Jews as the Japanese attack Pearl Harbor. *The Far Side of the Sky* focuses on a short – but extraordinary – period of Chinese, Japanese, and Jewish history when cultures converged and heroic sacrifices were part of the everyday quest for survival.
