# Find a Rabbi, Acquire a Friend

Pirke Avot ("Ethics of the Fathers") is an ancient compendium of rabbinic knowledge, which offers bite-sized servings of wisdom and advice for everyday life. One of the most-cited pieces is the rabbis' encouragement for all people to "find oneself a rabbi and acquire for oneself a friend." [Pirke Avot 1:6]

This instruction emphasizes the importance of assuring that Jewish life will be distinguished both by spiritual growth and supportive community. I place these priorities at the forefront of my work as I begin this month's task of searching for Emanu El's next Assistant Rabbi.

Since we received the news of Rabbi Samantha Kahn's relocation to San Francisco, I have been working closely and diligently with my colleagues in the staff and clergy teams, and with our lay leadership partners, to assemble parameters and timelines for the search which will enable me to secure the best possible

candidate to serve as our community's newest rabbi. At this stage, the search will be focused on the newest class of rabbinic ordinees from the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion [HUC-JIR], our Reform movement's seminary. Our listing, along with information about our congregation and about life in Houston, has been shared with these soon-to-be-ordained rabbis, and at the time of this writing, I have already begun receiving résumés and personal statements from interested candidates. In the early days of February, I will travel to Los Angeles to spend a few days on the campus of HUC-JIR and begin in-person interviews. I will be accompanied by Jeff Basen-Engquist and Helen Dreyfus, the chair of our ad-hoc Open Tent Committee, convened to assist with the process of welcoming rabbinic candidates to Houston, facilitating on-site visits, and ensuring that Emanu El's diverse constituencies are represented during our conversations with candidates. Once the right candidate emerges during these on-site visits, we can expect to finalize contractual arrangements in March, and our new rabbi will formally begin his or her service to our congregation over the summer.

I will be excited to welcome a new rabbi to our community, and I know that you share my eagerness about securing a new spiritual leader to build upon Rabbi Kahn's accomplishments during her tenure at Emanu El – the deep relationships she has built, her advocacy for social justice, and her passion for programmatic engagement with our youth and young professionals - and also to bring fresh insights, worship and leadership skills, and new spiritual perspectives from which our congregation will benefit richly. I look forward to working closely as a mentor to our newest colleague and to helping construct a powerful professional springboard from which his or her rabbinic career will be propelled forward. In this way, the traditions of excellence that we prioritize here will continue to be carried forward into the nationwide Jewish community by rabbis whose careers begin at Congregation Emanu El.

During her time with us, Rabbi Kahn has served our community with enduring conscience and deep devotion. As I begin the search for her successor, I am committed to preserving the priority of those critical Jewish values, and am inspired by the future that our newest Assistant Rabbi will assist in building. Like you, I am so grateful to have upheld the teaching from Pirke Avot by having had Rabbi Samantha Kahn as both a rabbi and a friend. I look forward to carrying on in the same way with a new colleague, and I am optimistic about being able to introduce you to our newest Assistant Rabbi in the next few weeks.

The *Jewish Forward* listed Rabbi Levy as one of the 50 most influential Jewish leaders in the nation. *Newsweek* Magazine named Rabbi Levy in its "Top 50 Rabbis in America" list.

A nationally famous author and speaker, Rabbi Levy attended Cornell University where she graduated Phi Beta Kappa and Summa Cum Laude. She was in the first class of women to enter The Jewish Theological Seminary's rabbinical school. At the seminary, Rabbi Levy received honors as outstanding underclass student of Talmud and outstanding underclass rabbinical student. She became the first female Conservative rabbi to head a pulpit on the West Coast.

# From the President - Jeff Basen-Engquist



As I write this on Inauguration Day, I am reminded of the wisdom of our congregation's founders. Our statement of principles ends with "...the membership of Congregation Emanu El resolves that its members shall not be limited in their freedom of thought and speech and that its pulpit shall be free to preach on behalf of truth, a righteousness in the democratic spirit." Their insight continues to support our clergy and set an invaluable example. As an elected leader, I am called to incorporate this tradition in my work. Whether making appointments or analyzing initiatives, representative constituencies and diverse opinions are being sought out.

You have seen the announcement of our Director of Congregational Learning position. The right candidate will identify and implement best practices for education experiences throughout the congregation. Having commenced a national search, Rabbi Hayon met with our learning constituencies, including adult learners, Helfman Religious School parents and teachers, Becker Early Childhood Center parents, and B'nei Mitzvah parents. The learning experiences described by these groups will be applied in both the search and orientation for this position.

Our Board of Trustees nominations process has begun, as we seek experienced and new leadership talent for our Board and Executive Committee. We have sought recommendations via the Bulletin and eblasts. Immediate Past President Rebecca Lunstroth serves as Chair. As per our bylaws, I have appointed three additional Board members – Elizabeth Krohn, Steven Reiner, and Eileen Westerman – and five members with a cross-section of experience – Kristina Boshernitzan, Brad Brookner, Jennifer Reichek, Hilary Rosenthal and Annie Stein. Their combined understanding and knowledge of our membership will support the process of building a slate for the Board to consider. The Board will recommend a slate to the congregation at the Annual Meeting on the evening of Wednesday, April 19th (please save the date – come for the barbeque, stay for the meeting).

Most recently you have received a letter from Rabbi Hayon and me regarding Rabbi Kahn's resignation effective May 31st. With Matt Kahn's appointment as Regional Director of AJC in San Francisco, we are excited for their family's new opportunities yet sad about Rabbi Kahn's departure. As May approaches, we will announce our formal plans to honor Rabbi Kahn for her service. I encourage each of us to take the opportunity to express to her our deep appreciation for her many contributions to our community.

As has been the case previously, our Senior Rabbi will hire for this vacant position. There is a very time-limited, formal procedure established by the Rabbinical Placement Commission, Hebrew Union College – Jewish Institute of Religion for screening rabbinical students who will be ordained this spring. I have named Trustee Helen Dreyfus to lead what we are calling our Open Tent Committee to assist Rabbi Hayon primarily with our internal logistics for the search and interview process. The committee consists of members drawn from across the congregation, including Past President Gary Blumberg, Michelle Blumenthal, Ben Feldstein, Steven Frank, Michelle Frankfort, Stephanie Gabelnick, and Ben Proler, with Greta Pliskin as Executive Committee Liaison. Their collective experience centers around, but is not limited to, the portfolio the Assistant Rabbi will carry as a full clergy partner, particularly involvement with our youth and young professionals programs, young families and new member outreach, as well as their pastoral, preaching and teaching responsibilities.

We have officially entered the placement process, having submitted our formal application. We have begun receiving resumes from students. Helen and I will accompany Rabbi Hayon to Los Angeles in February's first weekend to represent the congregation and assist him with numerous initial interviews. Rabbi Hayon will choose the candidates who will be invited to visit Houston between February 10th and March 6th to meet the clergy team, Senior staff, Open Tent and Executive Committees, and others as needed. Rabbi Hayon will receive feedback particular to each group to consider in making his final selection. Offers may be issued beginning March 7th. With a mutual fit between candidate and congregation, our new Assistant Rabbi will arrive in July.

We foster community by listening to one another. When we embrace the richness of our distinct experiences, we renew the tradition established by the architects of our congregation's success.

# Emanu El Sends Two to Temple Administrators' Conference In Nashville

Congregation Emanu El executive director David Lamden and program director Jason Plotkin recently returned from a combined conference of the Reform Movement's National Association for Temple Administration (NATA) and the Conservative Movement's North American Association of Synagogue Executives (NAASE) in Nashville, Tennessee.

The Emanu El duo were the lone representatives from the Houston area at the conference that attracted over 260 administrators from the Reform and Conservative movements in the United States and abroad. Other countries represented included Australia, Canada and Israel.

Lamden was one of four chairpersons for the conference, which included fellow NATA member Aliza Goland and a pair of NAASE members in Fred Rothstein and Richard Tannenbaum. The quartet spent 18 months putting together the combined conference.

The conference was headlined by a session led by Union for Reform Judaism president Rick Jacobs and Rabbi Steven Wernick, CEO of the United Synagogues of Conservative Judaism. The duo spoke on how partners matter and stressed the importance of collaboration between synagogues and other agencies within the community.

Amongst the entertainment highlights was a Sunday night performance by Gary Burr, Georgia Middleman and Don Schlitz. Each member of the trio performed songs they had written including Schlitz, the two-time Grammy Award winner who wrote *The Gambler* and Burr, who wrote amongst others *Nothin' Bout Love Makes Sense* during a career that includes being honored as Songwriter of the Year by *Billboard Magazine*. On Monday night, the attendees headed to the Country Music Hall of Fame for a tour and a performance by up-and-coming teenage musician Alana Springsteen.

A member of the Congregation Emanu El team since November after previously serving as executive director at Temple Beth Sholom in Miami Beach, Florida, Lamden was re-elected to the board of NATA and formally installed during the conference's closing banquet. The new board is headed by Abigail Goldberg Spiegel of Leo Baeck Temple in Los Angeles.

The NATA conference was the first for Plotkin, who in December was elected to the board of the Program & Engagement Directors of Reform Judaism (PEP-RJ) and will be attending the NATA Institute in March. The Institute provides the foundation for those individuals seeking a certification as a 'Fellow in Temple Administration' (FTA).



# Rabbi Samuel Karff To Close Out Endowment Fund Speaker Series On Thursday, March 9th



Congregation Emanu El's 2016-17 Endowment Fund Speaker Series entitled *Pathway to the Future: A New Look at Reform Jewish Worship* will conclude on **Thursday, March 9th at 7:30 p.m.** as Rabbi Samuel Karff presents, *The Changing Face of Reform Judaism – An Eye Witness Account.* 

Rabbi Karff serves as Rabbi Emeritus at Congregation Beth Israel and is a past President of the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR) and the *Journal of Reform Judaism's* former editor.

During his presentation, Rabbi Karff will speak to the rich history of the Reform Movement through his eyes as it changed from 'Classical Reform' to 'Post-Modern Reform.' He will also share how both are authentic expressions of Liberal Judaism in their time.

Rabbi Samuel Karff formerly served as Associate Director and visiting professor in the Department of Family Medicine at UT Health. After retiring from the rabbinate in 1999, he founded the Health and Human Spirit Program, the precursor to the McGovern Center. He co-created the Sacred Vocation Program and previously served as the program's co-director and instructor. A widely-published author, he has lectured extensively in this country and abroad.

Rabbi Karff earned an A.B., Magna Cum Laude, from Harvard College and a Doctor of Hebrew Letters from the Hebrew Union College. Before joining the McGovern Center, he served for over two decades as the senior rabbi of Congregation Beth Israel, Texas' oldest synagogue. A former president of the Central Conference of American Rabbis, he also taught in the Department of Religious Studies at Rice University.

Rabbi Karff is the third and final speaker in this year's series that are part of a year-long preparation for Emanu El which will transition from the *Gates of Repentance* to *Mishkan Hanefesh*, the Reform Movement's new High Holy Day machzor (prayer book). Emanu El will make this transition in 2017 and each of the speakers will focus on Reform Judaism's dynamic approach to meaningful liturgy and inspiring music.

Cantor Richard Cohn, Director of the Debbie Friedman School of Sacred Music at HUC-JIR visited in December and was followed by Rabbi Elaine Zecher, Senior Rabbi of Temple Israel in Boston.


