
The Hidden Messages of

This time of year is always a favorite for Jewish families - and especially for those of us with young children. How many of us still have vivid memories from our own childhoods about the joy of Purim dressing up in costume, enjoying sweet treats and giggling at the Pu-

rim Spiel? Every time Purim rolls around again, we are reminded of those joyful experiences of youth – but at the same time, we ought not to overlook the more mature elements of the holiday.

While Purim is generally experienced as a children's holiday, its core messages are relevant and meaningful even to the most sophisticated and mature among us. Haman's brutality, Ahasuerus's simple-mindedness, Mordecai's subtle advocacy, and Esther's impassioned pleas for the salvation of her people – the words and deeds of these ancient characters remain compelling in our own day. Congregation Emanu El's Endowment Fund Speaker Series entitled *Pathway* to the Future: A New Look at Reform Jewish Worship concludes on Thursday, March 9th at 7:30 p.m. as Rabbi Samuel Karff presents, The Changing Face of Reform Judaism – An Eve Witness Account.

Rabbi Karff serves as Rabbi Emeritus at Congregation Beth Israel and is a past President of the

Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR) and the Journal of Reform Judaism's former editor.

During his presentation, Rabbi Karff will speak to the rich history of the Reform Movement through his eyes as it changed from 'Classical Reform' to 'Post-Modern Reform'. He will also share how both are authentic expressions of Liberal Judaism in their time.

Rabbi Karff formerly served as Associate Director and visiting professor in the Department of Family Medicine at UT Health. After retiring from the rabbinate in

its New Traditions gift shop for hospitality around Emanu El, providing programs for its Emanu Elders seniors group, support for several local charities (including SEARCH, House of Tiny Treasures, Jewish Family Service, Undies for Everyone, Houston Food Bank, Dress For Success), scholarships at Hebrew Union College, camperships at Greene Family Camp and more.

In addition to the fundraiser, Sisterhood is also asking community members for assistance in collecting items to restock the Jewish Family Services (JFS) which is need of items for emergency relief kits and necessity bags for seniors. The emergency relief kits will provide

those in need with food for three-to-four days in case of an emergency while the necessity bags provide items needed by senior clients in their daily lives.

Items requested by JFS include Kosher food items (K, O or U on the label) such as cracker and cheese sandwiches (Austin brand), unsalted saltine crackers, fruit cups, granola bars, peanut butter, tuna, unsweetened applesauce and low sodium soups. Non-food items include hand or battery can openers, flashlights, toilet paper, paper towels, plastic bags, plastic silverware, unscented soap, shampoo, dental floss, deodorant, razors, shaving cream and incontinence pads. These items can be dropped off outside the Sisterhood office at Emanu El.

modern lives can find powerful resonance in the timeless messages of the *Book of Esther* – but only if we open ourselves up to its truth. Like all Jewish observances, we can only fully appreciate the grown-up power of Purim if we immerse ourselves in it and make room in our busy lives for its moral commands. Every one of us is called by the imperative of Esther 9:22: *Send gifts to one another, and give charity to the poor!*

Mishloach manot (sending gifts to one another) and matanot la-evyonim (giving charity to the poor) are among the central commandments of this holiday, reminding us of our core Jewish responsibilities to live life joyfully and share our blessings with those who are in need. Even though Purim invites light-heartedness, fun and silliness, it is undergirded by these very serious commandments to recommit ourselves to the sustenance of our community. Giving to the needy is always a core Jewish value, but this commandment takes on a new power when rooted in the context of Purim. It reminds us not to be distracted by surface appearances; the farcical nature of the holiday drives home this deep truth in a way no other holiday can. Lest we forget that "there is always more than meets the eye," Purim hastens to remind us of this eternal Jewish truth. Leading ourselves deeper into the practice of generosity – on Purim, of all times – reminds us that even at times of great levity and celebration, we must remain sensitive to the needs of others.

And so, as we enter into this most joyous time of the Jewish year, let us recommit ourselves to the great gifts of Jewish life: celebrating the reassuring warmth of community, and doing all we can to ease the burdens of others. However we engage with it, as children or adults, Purim presents a time of joy and celebration and an invitation to recommit ourselves to the needs of others in our community.

Rabbi Samuel Karff to Close Out Endowment Fund Speaker Series

1999, he founded the Health and Human Spirit Program, the precursor to the McGovern Center. He cocreated the Sacred Vocation Program and previously served as the program's co-director and instructor. A widely-published author, he has lectured extensively in this country and abroad.

Rabbi Karff earned an A.B., Magna Cum Laude, from Harvard College and a Doctor of Hebrew Letters from the Hebrew Union College. Before joining the Mc-Govern Center, he served for over two decades as the senior rabbi of Congregation Beth Israel, Texas' oldest synagogue. A former president of the Central Conference of American Rabbis, he also taught in the Department of Religious Studies at Rice University.

Rabbi Karff is the third and final speaker in this year's series that are part of a year-long preparation for Emanu El which will transition from the Gates of Repentance to Mishkan Hanefesh, the Reform Movement's new High Holy Day machzor (prayer book). Emanu El will make this transition in 2017 and each of the speakers will focus on Reform Judaism's dynamic approach to meaningful liturgy and inspiring music.

BOARD NOTES

Treasurer Richard Schecter and Executive Director David Lamden presented the proposed 2017-2108 Budget for the Board's review. Work on the budget began in December when each department submitted their proposed budgets. Following department head presentations to the Budget Committee, a final version was approved by the committee. The Board will review the document in anticipation of its vote on a final recommended budget to be presented to the congregation for its approval at the Annual Meeting.

The Cemetery presented its report and the Board approved a recommendation to **increase prices May 1st**. Nicole Longnecker presented a brief update for the Social Action Committee. Research continues to identify a significant project for the congregation to volunteer that is in conjunction with goals set from the Board Retreat.

Honorary President Rebecca Lunstroth reported on the schedule for the Nominating Committee. Having received nominations from the congregation in response to *Bulletin* notices and other inquiries, the committee will present a slate to the Board at its March meeting. The Board's recommended slate will be presented to the congregation at the Annual Meeting in April.

Executive Director David Lamden noted that Shel Vedlitz led a training for the staff on responding to phoned threats. President Jeff Basen-Engquist thanked Lamden, Trustee Nicole Longnecker and the Security Task Force for their ongoing work in updating all our safety and security protocols.

Senior Rabbi Hayon reported on his trip, with David Lamden and Jeff Basen-Engquist to Dallas for the Union for Reform Judaism Large Congregations meeting. Data from a benchmarking study we participated in will be presented to the Board at a future meeting. He also reported on his trip to Los Angeles with Jeff Basen-Engquist and Helen Dreyfus, Chair of the Open Tent

Committee, which is assisting Rabbi Hayon with the logistics in his selection of our new Assistant Rabbi. Initial candidate interviews were productive. A few candidates will be invited to visit during February. Offers may be made beginning March 7th. Rabbi Hayon attended the conformation student retreat in Galveston and praised Jamie Aaron for her work with this group.


