FROM RABBI HAYON



One year after Harvey, we have a new sense of Houston's resilience and our strength, our willingness to stand up for each other, and our eagerness to lend a helping hand.

As we prepare to greet the new Jewish year, our tradition charges us to look back over the past twelve months to undertake a "cheshbon nefesh" – an "accounting of the soul."

This practice invites us to contemplate the ways we have fallen short of our best potential selves and to commit ourselves to the changes necessary for self-improvement.

Of course, having just passed the one-year anniversary of Hurricane Harvey and the destruction which followed, none of us can realistically look back over the past year without also noting the ways in which our community has changed over the past year. This year, the exercise of communal recollection can also serve as a resource as we undertake our spiritual work of personal reflection.

How are we different, one year after Harvey?

After last August, it quickly became clear that the damage Houston would suffer from Harvey would become astronomical. Within the Jewish community and beyond it, the losses of things precious to us continued to mount: homes and vehicles, businesses and community institutions, valuable belongings and

irreplaceable heirlooms. Many of us found with dismay that the financial resources we had hoped would last for many years were quickly depleted, and others were concerned to learn that pangs of anxiety would continue for months each time the weather report warned of a coming storm.

At the same time, without minimizing the losses Houston has suffered, we can also look back over the past year and catalog the many things we have come to feel proud of. One year after Harvey, we have a new sense of Houston's resilience and our strength, our willingness to stand up for each other, and our eagerness to lend a helping hand. All of us – the Emanu El community and the Jewish community more broadly – are grateful to those who stepped up to help when they were able. We remain thankful to our community partners at the Jewish Federation for Greater Houston, and the many generous supporters around town and around the country whose tzedakah helped strengthen our ability to help those in need.

Every year, the approach of the High Holy Days presents us with a fresh opportunity for reflection. The things we have done, and the things we have gone through, offer us chances to grieve and to grow. This year, when we step forward into the High Holy Day season, I hope that our resolve will be strengthened and our vision sharpened by the experiences we have shared and the private convictions that belong to each of us individually. And as the new year begins, I will pray that it, and every subsequent new year to follow, will be sweeter and happier than the last.

May your new year be a sweet one, and may you and your loved ones be inscribed for blessing in the year 5779.

EMANU EL ADMINISTRATION – SPECIAL HOURS SUR-ROUNDING HIGH HOLY DAYS

Please note that the synagogue's administration will close on **Friday, September 7th at 4:30 p.m.** ahead of Rosh HaShanah. Any passes not picked up from the synagogue at that time will be available at "will call" located at the Sunset Blvd. entrance of the synagogue. Will call will open at **4:30 p.m. on Sunday, September 9th**. The synagogue's administrative offices will be closed on **Monday, September 10th** in observance of Rosh HaShanah.

On **Tuesday, September 18th at 12:00 p.m.**, the synagogue's administrative offices will close as the building gets ready for Kol Nidre. Similar to Rosh HaShanah, any passes not claimed at that point will move to the "will call" entry located at the Sunset Blvd. entrance of the synagogue. Will call will open at 6:30 p.m. on **Tuesday, September 18th**. The synagogue's administrative offices will be closed on **Wednesday, September 19th** in observance of Yom Kippur.

HIGH HOLY DAY PASSES

Two guest passes are enclosed with the booklet that our congregants received prior to the High Holy Days. We encourage you to offer them to anyone who wishes to attend a single High Holy Day service. **Please note that these passes may not be used on Kol Nidre.** We accept passes from other congregations and also welcome military personnel, college students with ID, and out-of-town patients receiving treatment in the Texas Medical Center along with their families. If you know someone who has moved to Houston within the last six months, please contact Jill Kaplan at (713) 529-5771, ext. 262 or jillk@ emanuelhouston.org to arrange for a newcomer pass.

PARKING

Only individuals with High Holy Days passes or handicap placards will be permitted entry to the Emanu El campus. All parking on Floors 1 and 2 of the Gaylor Parking Facility will be reserved for handicap-accessible use. The West Lot is reserved for Rabbi's Circle members with a required pass. Because there is limited garage parking on Floors 3 and 4, we encourage you to park at the satellite locations. Buses will run continually from the satellite parking lots to and from Emanu El.

For Erev Rosh HaShanah and Kol Nidre, park at the Medical Clinic of Houston, 1707 Sunset Blvd. The parking garage entrance is on Rice Blvd. On Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur Day, park at Rice University. Due to construction on the west side of the Rice campus, we will use the Rice South Stadium Lot (with overflow in the Greenbriar Lot). A special entrance to the South Stadium Lot will be open between Gates 8 and 9, specifically for our Emanu El guests. This entry point is located on University Blvd. between Montclair and Stockton.

CHILDCARE

Childcare for children ages 15 months to 8 years is available during all High Holy Day services, with the exception of the 5:30 p.m. service on Rosh HaShanah. Registration and advance payment MUST be received in order

to prepare for the appropriate number of caregivers. The cost is \$10 per service per child. A light snack will be provided; however, children with allergies are encouraged to bring their own snacks.

The registration deadline for Rosh HaShanah is **Wednesday, September 5th**; the Yom Kippur registration deadline is **Friday, September 14th**. To register, visit us online at emanuelhouston.org, or contact Evon Zionts by phone at (713) 529.5771, ext. 255 or by email at evonz@ emanuelhouston.org.

SPECIAL NEEDS ACCESSIBILITY

For wheelchair or disability accessibility, contact Elizabeth Townsend at (713) 529.5771, ext. 222 or elizabetht@emanuelhouston.org and include the services you plan to attend. Preferred seating will be provided to those who give advance notice. Those requesting special-needs seating may be granted a maximum of four additional seats for family members. Special-needs seating will be released 15 minutes prior to the beginning of services. The deadline for Rosh HaShanah is **Wednesday, September 5th**; Yom Kippur dead-line for requests is **Friday, September 14th**.

Archived videos of the services will be made available within minutes of the conclusion of services. Sermons will be shared in the same digital locations in the days following the services.

HEARING LOOP

The Barish Sanctuary is equipped with an Induction Loop System, which transmits audio signals directly to one's telecoil (T-coil)-equipped hearing aid.

CLOSED CAPTIONING

Brotherhood provides closed captioning for all on-site Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur services (with the exception of the children's services) for all who are hearing impaired.




Kids Meals Celebrates 11 Years at Emanu El

Lindner raised to local and even national notoriety during Hurricane Harvey. The meteorologist served as a reassuring voice during the storm, calmly updating millions via news conferences and Twitter about rising water levels across the greater Houston metropolitan area.

A 2003 graduate with a degree in meteorology at Texas A&M University, Lindner started at the Harris County Flood Control District as an interim in 2003 before coming on full-time a year later. He has since risen to the ranks of Harris County's chief meteorologist.

Over the course of his distinguished 28-year career in the IDF, Attia has commanded a tank, the IDF's Technology & Logistics Forces training program and the Sar-El program for army volunteers around the world.

For Emanu El, this brings full circle and experience that a group of teens from the congregation's religious school had this past summer as they visited a Special in Uniform base during the Shirley Barish Memorial Israel Experience.
