FROM RABBI HAYON



After all of our hurried on-the-job training, we now find ourselves approaching the one holiday on the Jewish calendar which focuses primarily on a domestic construction project: Sukkot.

Soon after Hurricane Harvey brought historic flooding and destruction to our city, hundreds of Houstonians quickly received an uninvited crash-course in home renovation. Many of us, along with our friends and neighbors, quickly acquired new skills we never had before: how to remove carpet, install sheetrock, apply chemical treatments to prevent mold, sterilize dishes, and navigate the labyrinth of insurance and FEMA paperwork. We studied under pressure, and we learned quickly.

We never asked to learn these particular skills, but the timing turned out to have been fortuitous in an unexpected way. After all of our hurried on-the-job training, we now find ourselves approaching the one holiday on the Jewish calendar which focuses primarily on a domestic construction project: Sukkot.

Tracing its lineage to the earliest days of Israelite history when our ancestors constructed crude shacks for shelter in the desert during the fall harvest season, the festival is still observed today by building and spending time in temporary outdoor huts. The custom, we are told, has been faithfully observed for centuries as a way of encouraging Jews to remain spiritually connected to the natural world and its cycles of agricultural growth, and also to encode into our calendar a yearly reminder about the fragility and vulnerability of our lives.

But the observance of Sukkot offers us another spiritual lesson as well. According to tradition, the huts we build for the holiday cannot be sealed tightly against the elements or the outside world. A sukkah's walls must be porous enough to permit contact with the wind and rain; its roof must allow us to see the sun shine during the day and the stars at night. The sukkah urges us to leave the familiar confines of our homes and synagogues, to awaken us to the gifts of nature and open our eyes to the richness of the world outside our doors.

This year, a new addition to our celebration of Sukkot will elevate the holiday in a new way, inspired by the holiday's invitation to embrace the diverse cultural and intellectual gifts of the wider world. At the beginning of this academic year, Congregation Emanu El and the Rice University School of Architecture co-sponsored a juried competition which invited multi-disciplinary teams of students to design an innovative design for a sukkah which would reflect a modern aesthetic while remaining faithful to the requirements of Jewish tradition. The winning design would receive the honor of seeing their design constructed at Emanu El for the holiday of Sukkot.

I was privileged to participate as a member of the jury for the competition, and I was thrilled by the creativity and innovation that all of the entries demonstrated. After the students' presentations and extensive deliberation, our panel of judges selected a winner. The winning design, entitled "PAUSE BOX," was submitted by a team of six students, none of whom had ever designed (or even visited) a sukkah before. In partnership with Emanu El's senior staff and representatives from our Building & Grounds Committee, construction on PAUSE BOX will have begun by the time you read these words, and is scheduled to be completed in time for you to come visit it for Sukkot.

I'm very proud of this project, which upholds our congregation's long tradition of warmly embracing our great city's cultural and intellectual promise, and I am inspired by our community's rising generation of talented thinkers and artists who will be its stewards. I hope you will come and join me in experiencing PAUSE BOX this Sukkot, and in celebrating a construction project blessed by holy purpose.




Partnerships in Action

BOOK REVIEW:

The Black Widow, by Daniel Silva THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 9TH 7:00 PM

Gabriel Allon, legendary spy and art-restorer, is poised to become the chief of Israel's secret intelligence service. On the eve of his promotion, ISIS detonates a massive bomb in the Marais district of Paris. A desperate French government enlists the aid of Allon and other Israeli agents, in order to eliminate the responsible ISIS operative.

Sisterhood Tour of Sam Houston Historical Park

Thursday, October 19th at 10 a.m.

Please join Sisterhood on a docent-guided tour of three historical buildings at Sam Houston Park, located downtown at 1100 Bagby, on Thursday, October 19th, beginning at 10:00 a.m., followed by lunch at a downtown restaurant.

The City of Houston declared this 21-acre tract the first public park in Houston in 1899. Preservation-minded citizens then created the Harris County Heritage and Conservation Society (The Heritage Society), which was responsible for acquiring, relocating and restoring 10 historic buildings to the park.

Sisterhood's tour will include three of the park's historic buildings: The 1868 San Felipe Cottage, an example of the architecture of Houston's late 19th century German population; the 1850 Nichols-Rice-Cherry House, notable for being the home of William Marsh Rice, benefactor of Rice University; and the 1870 Yates House, home of the Reverend Jack Yates, a former emancipated slave who became influential in the African-American community in Houston.

MEDICARE PRESCRIPTION DRUG PLAN (PDP)

Social Action Committee Prepares to Assist with Medicare Prescription Drug Plan (PDP)

Attention Seniors! Your current PDP sponsor should provide you with an *Annual Notice of Change* about your current prescription drug plan. Review that Notice, which may describe changes in your Plan, including changes to the premium, co-pay, and the drugs covered. If you are satisfied with the changes and want to remain in that Drug Plan, you probably will be notified that you do not have to do anything to stay in that Plan for 2018. However, you might be advised that you current plan will be discontinued or merged with another plan for 2018. In such case, you may want to review your options before accepting that change.

If you want to change, or consider changing, to another Plan, the Emanu El Social Action Committee will provide a trained volunteer to assist your analysis of alternatives. To make an appointment (between Monday, October 16th and Thursday, December 7th) please call Donna Fraley at (713) 529-5771, ext. 212 and leave your name, phone number, and the day(s) and time(s) you would like to meet. One of our volunteers will call to help you and schedule an appointment. Do not wait until the last

minute to make changes.

To change your Prescription Drug Plan, you must sign up by Thursday, December 7, 2017. The change will be effective Monday, January 1, 2018.

When you come for your appointment, please bring:

- 1. Your Medicare Card
- 2. Your drug list: name, dosage and frequency of each
- 3. Benefit record from your current PDP Plan or a pharmacy print out of drugs purchased in 2017, if available.

If you want to sign up for a Medicare PDP for the first time, follow the same procedure, and a volunteer will return your call to schedule an appointment.

Appointments may be scheduled no earlier than Monday, October 16th.
