FROM RABBI HAYON



As our national life invites us into the observance of Thanksgiving this month, I hope that we will at the same time remember that the spiritual impulse to give thanks is rooted deeply in the soul of the Jewish people.

As Jews, we are continually urged toward humility and thankfulness – our tradition appeals to us to give thanks, to count our blessings, to acknowledge daily the "everyday miracles" of our lives.

In the Amidah section of every Jewish prayer service, you will find a prayer called the hoda'ah ("acknowledgment"), which includes the following passage:

Let us thank You and praise You – for our lives which are in Your hand, for our souls which are in Your care, for Your miracles that we experience every day...

Each time I pray these words, I am struck by the liturgy's choice of language. How can one really experience "miracles . . . every day"? Most of us live under the assumption that a "miracle" is an event that upends the

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Who do you include in your circles of friendship? Has that changed recently? We are familiar with stories of strain and dissolution resulting from stress on a relationship. And

there is the expression suggesting that, when the chips are down, you find out who your REAL friends are. Two sides of the same coin?

I have heard about and witnessed examples of the most uplifting aspects of friendship in recent weeks. On top of whatever life stresses were apparent in August, the storm and its aftermath shook many of us up. Spouses and families, neighborhoods and communities, found the most fundamental elements of their relationships magnified.

I must acknowledge having experienced some annoyance with the early newsy feel-good stories which seemed to take attention and, potentially, resources away from ongoing tragedy. Like some jokes, too soon. I hope that this note does not raise such feelings for you.

Still, I have observed so much generosity and kindness that I feel compelled to recognize it. There are our dear personal friends who evacuated themselves from their home via their boat and went back to bring others out once they were safe. Individuals and congregations around the country sent us gift cards

High Holy Day Survey Recap

An unprecedented number of respondents – more than 400 families – participated in Congregation Emanu El's third annual post-High Holy Day survey during the month of October.

Responses to the survey revealed very positive feedback, with approximately 87% of those surveyed indicating that they would agree with the statement "this year's High Holy Day experience was meaningful and fulfilling for me personally" and roughly 88% agreeing that they would recommend the High Holy Days at Emanu El to a friend or relative. Both percentages represent increases over last year's survey responses. In addition, we received a higher number of "strongly agree" responses to both questions than in any of the other years in which the survey has been administered.

As in previous years, many respondents took advantage of the opportunity to submit specific comments or feedback. Highlights included an overwhelmingly positive response to the Union for Reform Judaism's new High Holy Day prayerbook, *Mishkan HaNefesh*, which made its debut at Emanu El this year, and to the unifying experience of coming together for a single Kol Nidre service.

By the time of this *Bulletin's* printing, initial reviews of the survey responses and of the entire High Holy Day experience will have been conducted by the senior staff, the clergy team, and the lay leadership of our Ritual and Music Committee. Our entire Emanu El team is grateful to all who took the time to offer their input and comments as part of our ongoing process of assessing our success at meeting the many needs of our diverse community of faith.

laws of nature, representing God's spectacular intrusion into physical space and time, altering the normal course of history to fit God's divine purpose.

But the liturgy of the *hoda'ah* asserts a very different definition of this word. This prayer suggests that a "miracle" is not necessarily an extraordinary or supernatural happening in the world around us; a miracle is the sensation which results when we place ourselves in a posture of recognition, humility and gratitude. For this reason, it is, indeed possible for one to observe miracles multiple times each day.

This season of the year is always the time that we customarily give thanks – for our food, our home, and the blessings of friendship and family. This November, many of us find ourselves experiencing gratitude in new and unfamiliar ways – for some of us, it's still too soon to feel very thankful given the loss and damage we have experienced in our homes and neighborhoods. Others may find themselves newly able to appreciate and affirm the blessing of family and friends, and the reassurance of a congregational home which provides a supportive spiritual community. As for me, this November I find myself grateful for this remarkable congregation, and for its generous outpouring of support and advocacy as we continue our work of recovering from storm damage [see President's Message, page 1.

The fact is that gratitude, like grief, flows along at its own pace, differently for each of us; sometimes it speeds past in a breathtaking rush, and sometimes it plods by in an agonizing crawl. But what our Jewish liturgy – and this American season of thanksgiving – reminds us is that we are called at all times to cultivate and practice the habit of gratitude, to find something every day for which we can give thanks. In this way, we will continually grow to recognize and celebrate the miracles of our own lives, and to give our thanks to God.

and funds for our Clergy's Good Works Fund while others sent truckloads of supplies to Houston. Clergy continue to reach out to members emotionally and financially affected. Congregants volunteered company resources and expertise to address the varied building issues and tasks required to keep our programs running while conducting remediation and repairs. Others have been appointed to a Roof Task Force, as serious decisions must be made about the current condition of and possible replacement of the roof.

Working with a team of volunteers and staff, Shel Vedlitz has been Emanu El's volunteer General Contractor for all things Harvey. He spent countless hours in the building, certainly in the hundreds by now, pricing, scheduling, overseeing, and tracking it all. He has kept us informed at every turn and done so in the most modest good humor imaginable. Thank you, Shel.

Many of you volunteered for the day camp we hosted and donated to our Temple Fund and the Federation. Others have sheltered friends, loaned cars, cut sheetrock and expanded their circles to include strangers.

And having devoted much precious preparation time to the needs of troubled congregants, our clergy team, working together for the first time, elevated our prayers and our sprits throughout High Holidays. Their words comforted and challenged us; music soothed and stirred us.

Over the years, I have been around friends as well as organizations in crisis. I have necessarily been a close observer and participant with staff, clergy and volunteers here of late. Our circles of warmth, affection and friendship have grown in response to recent events. Our new membership tagline – Be a Friend, Bring a Friend – could not be more timely or appropriate. I see new faces at services, attending programs, at Sukkot on Sunset and other events. Whatever your situation, I hope you will find support and meaning by sharing in what we are building at Emanu El and by inviting members of your circles to accompany you here. I'll see you all then.

Repair Update



Remediation and repair should be completed by the time you read this. Items remaining on our checklist include replacing some carpeting, ongoing roof concerns, and some preventive construction and maintenance.

We continue to await the final flood insurance policy determination. Our out-of-pocket expense estimate has been slightly reduced below \$500,000, but many final invoices, insurance decisions and personal financial

decisions are still outstanding.

Staff, clergy and I continue to research and request funds to offset our expenses and revenue losses. As of this writing, we have collected a little over \$100,000 in contributions to the Temple Fund where we are gathering your gifts dedicated to this need (emanuelhouston.org webpage has a direct link). A recent donation of \$50,000 helped us make significant headway – thank you Marc and Judy Herzstein and Brooke and Dan Feather.

Additional gifts, large and small, are critical to making this fiscal year budget whole. Budget planning for next year begins in December. If you can better assist us with a multi-month donation, please speak with Executive Director David Lamden, Rabbi Hayon or me.




Pause Box Constructed by Rice Architecture Students on Emanu El's Front Yard

BOOK REVIEW:

The Black Widow, by Daniel Silva THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 9TH 7:00 PM

Gabriel Allon, legendary spy and art-restorer, is poised to become the chief of Israel's secret intelligence service. On the eve of his promotion, ISIS detonates a massive bomb in the Marais district of Paris. A desperate French government enlists the aid of Allon and other Israeli agents, in order to eliminate the responsible ISIS operative. A reception follows held in memory of Elwood "Woody" Nestvold. MEDICARE PRESCRIPTION DRUG PLAN (PDP)

Social Action Committee Prepares to Assist with Medicare Prescription Drug Plan (PDP)

Attention Seniors! Your current PDP sponsor should provide you with an *Annual Notice of Change* about your current prescription drug plan. Review that Notice, which may describe changes in your Plan, including changes to the premium, co-pay, and the drugs covered. If you are satisfied with the changes and want to remain in that Drug Plan, you probably will be notified that you do not have to do anything to stay in that Plan for 2018. However, you might be advised that you current plan will be discontinued or merged with another plan for 2018. In such case, you may want to review your options before accepting that change.

If you want to change, or consider changing, to another Plan, the Emanu El Social Action Committee will provide a trained volunteer to assist your analysis of alternatives. To make an appointment (between Monday, October 16th and Thursday, December 7th) please call Donna Fraley at (713) 529-5771, ext. 212 and leave your name, phone number, and the day(s) and time(s) you would like to meet. One of our volunteers will call to help you and schedule an appointment. Do not wait until the last minute to make changes.

To change your Prescription Drug Plan, you must sign up by Thursday, December 7, 2017. The change will be effective Monday, January 1, 2018.

When you come for your appointment, please bring:

- 1. Your Medicare Card
- 2. Your drug list: name, dosage and frequency of each
- 3. Benefit record from your current PDP Plan or a pharmacy print out of drugs purchased in 2017, if available.

If you want to sign up for a Medicare PDP for the first time, follow the same procedure, and a volunteer will return your call to schedule an appointment.

Appointments may be scheduled no earlier than Monday, October 16th.

Congregation Emanu El's featured Endowment Fund Speaker in 2017-18 is renown journalist Carl Bernstein who will speak about "Evolving Role of the Media in Dealing with 'Washington'" on Wednesday, January 24th at 7:30 p.m.

No stranger to the grind of Washington, Bernstein began part-time work at the *Washington Star* at the age of 16 and later dropped out of the University of Maryland to work full-time as a reporter. Bernstein made a historic name for himself when along with Bob Woodward, he uncovered the Watergate scandal which led to the resignation of U.S. President Richard Nixon.

Bernstein shared a Pulitzer Prize with Woodward for their coverage of Watergate for *The Washington Post*. Bernstein's most recent book is the acclaimed biography, A Woman in Charge: The Life of Hillary Rodham Clinton. He is the author, with Woodward, of All the President's Men and The Final Days, and, with Marco Politi, of His Holiness: John Paul II and the History of Our Time.

He is also the author of *Loyalties*, a memoir about his parents during McCarthy—era Washington. He has written for *Vanity Fair* (he is also a contributing editor), *Time, USA Today, Rolling Stone*, and *The New Republic*. He was a Washington bureau chief and correspondent for ABC News. At *The Washington Post*, Bernstein also was a part-time rock critic, and he still occasionally writes about music.
