#### FROM RABBI HAYON



Even at the times of our people's greatest suffering, we Jews do not abandon hope for redemption; even when our fortunes are good and our lives are comfortable, we do not allow ourselves the complacency of ignoring the call of tikkun olam.

I'm writing this month's article while traveling on this summer's 75th anniversary trip through Central Europe.

Our travels through Prague, Vienna, and Budapest have led us through many unique perspectives on the Jewish past and brought us to a number of new discoveries – some delightful and inspiring; others heartbreaking and tragic. I look forward to sharing some of the insights from the trip in future articles and sermons.

One of the experiences that will stay with me for a very long time came during our tour of Terezin, the medieval garrison town, which was seized by the Nazis and used as a concentration camp where Jews and political dissidents were imprisoned en route to their eventual deportation and murder. Like many of you, I had learned from books and films about the experiences of those who were incarcerated there, but I had never known of the existence of Terezin's secret synagogue.

The synagogue is a single tiny, low-ceilinged room hidden in a former stable. In it, the Jews who were imprisoned at Terezin would gather in secret to offer prayers expressing

their innermost hopes for protection and salvation, while hiding from the violent retribution of their captors. Painstakingly calligraphed on the walls, and partially whitewashed by the families who acquired this property after the war, are a number of Hebrew phrases from the Bible and the prayer book's liturgy that expressed the yearning that the world would someday become a place where the world's Jews could be safe.

Standing in that secret synagogue, reading those words, I felt a window into the past open inside me. Through it, I could peer into a vanished Jewish world and catch a glimpse of how much has been lost. At the same time, however, the Terezin synagogue also reminded me of that most critical Jewish resource which has never disappeared, no matter how desperate our circumstances: Jewish hope.

Even at the times of our people's greatest suffering, we Jews do not abandon hope for redemption; even when our fortunes are good and our lives are comfortable, we do not allow ourselves the complacency of ignoring the call of tikkun olam. This is, to me, a central motif of our existence, reliably present and inspiring wherever we have lived across the globe and across the centuries of Jewish history. To be Jewish is to retain hope as a constant companion.

Traveling with this group of inquisitive, thoughtful members of our congregation has been a great joy to me as we have explored some of the historic capitals of European Jewish history and become even more deeply acquainted with our people's past. I know that your prayers for safe travel have remained with us, and all of us look forward to sharing with you more details of our experiences after we return.
