FROM RABBI HAYON



Let me hasten to point out: building alliances with significant figures and institutions outside our own does not mean that we agree with them about everything.

A central component of my long-term vision for our congregation is that Emanu El will strive to address the most relevant and pressing issues of our day, and that our doors will be opened to significant thinkers from whose contributions to public discourse we can learn. My hope for our Temple is that we will serve the moral and intellectual needs of the community at large, not just those of our members.

I am delighted that this vision will come one step closer to its realization later this month when Rev. William Barber will speak from our pulpit. His talk, "Working cross Faiths to Develop Moral & Social Change," will be held on the evening of **Wednesday, March 27th**, and I strongly urge you to reserve your spot today if you have not already done so. Rev. Barber offers one of the strongest spiritual voices of conscience in our generation, addressing the plagues of poverty, racism and inequality in America with a powerfully prophetic sense of the mission of contemporary religion.



value that Emanu El places on building connections and alliances with leaders beyond the Jewish community. In this case, we are proud to partner with the clergy and membership of the historic Wheeler Avenue Baptist Church, which is co-sponsoring Rev. Barber's appearance at Emanu El.

Let me hasten to point out: building alliances with significant figures and institutions outside our own does not mean that we agree with them about everything. Indeed, Rev. Barber and I part ways on a number of political and theological issues. But powerful networks of alliance can bring about great strides forward in our communities because they invite us to recognize the value for justice of working in common cause with those who are different from ourselves.

Doing this work in partnership with others widens our vision and increases our spiritual agility; alliances like these are a vital component of our work together, and they strengthen our congregation's ability to achieve its grandest ambitions.

On a related note, I want to invite you to become a part of another sort of relationship-building in the work of Jewish social action as well. For the last 18 months, the Religious Action Center [RAC], our movement's social justice arm in Washington, DC, has been building a presence in Texas – a coalition called RAC-TX. Our congregation is proud to be among the RAC's partners, and we are excited that RAC-TX's inaugural campaign will address the issue of school finance reform, which is likely to be among the top priorities of our state legislature this session.

I would like to invite you to join us at Temple for a lunch-and-learn conversation about this issue following Shabbat services on **March 16th, from 12:00-1:30. p.m.**And if you are moved by this issue, please consider joining Rabbi Fixler and over 100 other Reform Jews from around Texas at the RAC's lobby day in Austin on **March 25th and 26th**. Civic justice and Jewish social values have always been at the center of Emanu El's mission and identity. Our voices – and the voices of all people of conscience – are always stronger when combined with others. I am grateful to all those who step forward to do acts of loving-kindness in our community, and to those who add their voices and their presence to strengthen our congregation's ability to repair the broken places in our world.




Shabbat Care Packages in Use at the University of Texas

Rev. Dr. Barber is on a mission to lead this country in what he calls a national moral revival, giving a new face to the 1968 Poor People's Campaign started by the Reverend Martin Luther King Jr. that linked the civil rights struggle for African-Americans to demands for equality for all poor people.

In addition to serving as co-Chair of the Poor People's Campaign, Rev. Dr. Barber is the President and Sr. Lecturer of the Repairers of the Breach, which seeks to "build a moral agenda rooted in a framework that uplifts our deepest moral and constitutional values to redeem the heart and soul of our country".

This organization declares that the moral public concerns of our faith traditions are how society treats the poor, women, LGTBQ people, children, workers, immigrants, communities of color and the sick, therefore he believes that it is imperative that these must be handled in a compassionate and justice-seeking manner.

One of 25 winners of the MacArthur Fellow's 2018 "Genius Grant", Rev. Dr. Barber started gaining national attention when in 2013 as the head of the North Carolina NAACP, he spearheaded the "Moral Monday" movement in the state. A series of weekly protests, the group, which numbered in the tens of thousands in the fight for voting rights, education funding and other progressive causes.

The pastor of Greenleaf Christian Church, Disciples of Christ in Goldsboro, North Carolina, Rev. Dr. Barber has given keynote addresses at hundreds of national and state conferences, including the 2016 Democratic National Convention.

These speaking appearances have included addressing large groups of leaders within the Christian, Muslim and Jewish faiths. In 2017, he addressed over 5,000 attendees of the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ)

Biennial in Boston. It is largely a result of this compelling presentation that Emanu El moved to bring Rev. Dr. Barber to our community.

A 2015 recipient of the Puffin Award and the Franklin D. Roosevelt Four Freedoms Award, Rev. Dr. Barber is regularly featured in media outlets such as MSNBC, CNN, New York Times, Washington Post, and The Nation Magazine, among others.

Rev. Dr. Barber's appearance at Emanu El is generously underwritten by the endowment funds of the synagogue including the Nathan Berg Lectureship Fund, the Eleanor & Frank Freed Lectureship Fund, the Milton Popkin Endowment Fund, the Helen & Harry Reichek Lectureship Fund and the Julius Zinn Fund and is part of a larger slate of events associated with Emanu El's 75th anniversary in 2019.

A beacon of social justice in the community since its founding, Emanu El's mission under the leadership of Rabbi Oren Hayon is to make a visible and consequential impact on Houston's moral and spiritual, cultural and intellectual life.

In this pursuit, Emanu El has been a leader in areas of social action and welfare, dating back to its involvement in the civil rights movement and serving the blind to feeding the hungry and working across faiths to bring about change – which aligns with that of Rev. Dr. Barber's efforts across the country.

He discussed specific fears, generalized anxiety, social anxiety, separation anxiety and more. Each child is different, and using appropriate tools and suggestions, parents can help their child normalize their anxiety.

behaviors. We are then able to stick to our decisions and help our children be successful as they navigate life. She reminds us that by supporting our children through their mistakes as well as not always getting what they want, helps build the characteristics that creates strong, responsible adults.


