FROM RABBI HAYON



Passover falls halfway through the Jewish year. It presents to us an opportunity to check back in on the progress we have made toward the resolutions we made at Rosh HaShanah: Am I living the life I promised? How have I grown into the self I pledged to create this year – or fallen short? What contributions have I made to the redemption of my soul - and of my world?

Now that April is here, we have all begun making our preparations for the arrival of Passover and the festive seder meal, at which we retell the story of the Exodus and celebrate our people's redemption from Egyptian bondage. But the seder is not primarily intended as a time of recitation; instead, it is meant to be a time of inquiry, when all in attendance are invited to ask penetrating questions about our history and our values.

In their examination of Jewish history, a group of first-century rabbis posed an odd question: In what month was the universe created? One answer to the question comes from Rabbi Eliezer, who reasons that since Rosh HaShanah celebrates the arrival of a new year, the universe must have been created on New Year's Day, the first day of the Hebrew month of Tishrei. His colleague Rabbi Yehoshua differs, concluding instead that God's creation would have had to take place during the Passover season, in the

Hebrew month of Nisan. The debate continues, with no resolution, through several folios of the Talmud.

A thousand years later, a 12th century French rabbi called Rabbeinu Tam arrived at an answer to the question: the universe was created both at Rosh HaShanah and on Passover. How can this be? Rabbeinu Tam's reasoning was as follows: on Rosh HaShanah God conceived the idea to create the universe; on Passover the work of creation was actually undertaken.

In addition to resolving the rabbis' millennium-old dispute about the timing of God's creation, Rabbeinu Tam offers us a helpful perspective with which to approach our seder tables and this season of deliverance. Both festival seasons celebrate new beginnings: Rosh HaShanah acknowledges the possibility of new beginnings within, and Passover recognizes the complicated, messy work of renewal that is undertaken in the external world. Put simply: where Rosh HaShanah is spiritual, Passover is political.

Passover falls halfway through the Jewish year. It presents to us an opportunity to check back in on the progress we have made toward the resolutions we made at Rosh HaShanah: Am I living the life I promised? How have I grown into the self I pledged to create this year – or fallen short? What contributions have I made to the redemption of my soul – and of my world?

Every year, the words and rituals of our Passover seder remind us of the redemptions from our people's past, butit does not permit us to stop there. Passover refuses to be treated like a history lesson – it is a handbook for modernspiritual living. Each year, we are strengthened by the commitments we made months ago at Rosh HaShanah, sothat we can lift our eyes from the pages of the haggadah and see the world around us with clear eyes. Passover cannot simply be a reminder of the past – it encourages us to do our part to ease the suffering of others and resist the tyranny that too often still reigns in God's world.

Passover is the force that counterbalances Rosh HaShanah, reassuring us that the fullness of our Jewish identity must include a focus on spiritual and political imperatives alike. As we make our way toward Passover's important questions, I pray that their answers will draw each of us closer to God, closer to each other, and closer to the realization of our spiritual mission as "a light unto the nations" in a world yearning to be redeemed. *Chag sameach!*

Wednesday, February 27th was a celebratory day for Congregation Emanu El, which was honored on the floor of the Texas House of Representatives as House Resolution 266 (HR266) was adopted by unanimous vote and filed in the records of the Texas House.

A group of 19 staff members and lay leaders boarded a bus from Emanu El at 6:00 a.m. and arrived at the Texas Capitol just after 9:30 a.m. with the obligatory stop at Buc-ce's along the way. Upon arriving, the group headed to the Texas House to watch the day's proceedings.

Shortly after 11:00 a.m. with several members of the Emanu El delegation on the dais and the remainder in the gallery, Representative Sarah Davis came before the elected body to read HR266, which was drafted with the assistance of Emanu El's program director Jason Plotkin.

The Resolution, which can be found in the box, will be put on display at a later date at Emanu El along with a Texas state flag that was flown over the state capitol on the same day.

After sharing pleasantries and taking a photo with Representative Davis, the group gathered back on the charter bus to return to Emanu El. En route back home, the group stopped in Ellinger to partake in either Hruska's or Peter's BBQ.

WHEREAS, In 1949, Congregation Emanu El moved into what has been recognized as one of the most innovative and creative buildings in the country; designed by congregant Lenard Gabert and architectural firm MacKie & Kamrath in the style of Frank Lloyd Wright, the building was formally dedicated on September 9, 1949; and

WHEREAS, Originally a congregation of 190 families in 1944, Congregation Emanu El has grown into one of the largest synagogues in the Union for Reform Judaism under the guidance of Rabbi Kahn and Rabbi Roy A. Walter, who took over in 1978; the congregation is currently led by Rabbi Oren J. Hayon; and

WHEREAS, Congregation Emanu El, which means "God be with us" in Hebrew, has continued to make a visible and consequential impact on Houston's moral, spiritual, cultural, and intellectual life; the synagogue has been a leader in many areas of social action and welfare, from serving the blind and feeding the hungry to supporting the civil rights movement and working across faiths to bring about change; and

WHEREAS, Congregation Emanu El has long served as a source of inspiration and guidance to those who worship there, and its continued existence is a tribute to the unwavering commitment of its members, both past and present; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas Legislature hereby commemorate the 75th anniversary of Congregation Emanu El and extend to its congregants sincere best wishes for the future; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be prepared for Congregation Emanu El as an expression of high regard by the Texas House of Representatives.






