FROM RABBI HAYON



At times, the world around us can seem quite dark indeed. But each year, during the darkest days of winter, the festival of Chanukah reminds us of our great potential to bring brightness and hope to the places we live.

When he assumed leadership of the renowned Ger dynasty at the age of 23, Rabbi Yehuda Leib Alter had already come to be widely recognized as one of Hasidic Judaism's most revered spiritual figures.

Despite his young age, however, he had known great sadness and loss, having been orphaned as a child and sent off to live with his grandfather. Nevertheless, his collected writings, which were published after his death in 1905, contain consistent themes of spiritual hope and yearning.

In his masterpiece publication, the *Sefat Emet* ["Holy Language"], Rabbi Alter draws a previously unexplored connection between the holidays of Chanukah and Passover. He points out that the Chanukah menorah may be compared to the candles which, in olden times, were traditionally used to search for crumbs of leaven as part of preparing one's home before Passover. Before Passover, the *Sefat Emet* points out, we search and purify our external environment; on Chanukah, we search and purify our inner selves. Specifically, the work of spiritual exploration should lead us to pay renewed attention to the moral and ethical commandments that guide and

strengthen our community.

Rabbi Alter suggests that the Hebrew word for candle, ner, might be understood as an acronym standing for the words *nefesh* (biological life-force) and *ruach* (soul or spirit). His point is that we ought to apply ourselves fully – body and soul – to our work of bringing holiness into the world. In that way, we help to illuminate a dark world in the same way a Chanukah menorah brightens a room.

At times, the world around us can seem quite dark indeed. But each year, during the darkest days of winter, the festival of Chanukah reminds us of our great potential to bring brightness and hope to the places we live. Our task is to search continually for opportunities to apply ourselves to the spiritual obligations that guide us. This holiday of joyful rededication invites us to celebrate the opportunities, which present themselves even in dark days, to rededicate ourselves anew to serving God and each other.

Roe v Wade – Jewish Faith, Jewish Action Sunday, January 10, 7:00 p.m.

January marks the 48th anniversary of the Supreme Court's historic *Roe v Wade* decision. To commemorate this anniversary, Congregation Emanu El will partner with the NCJW – Greater Houston Section for a program featuring NCJW chief executive officer Sheila Katz and our clergy.

Our clergy will teach what our Jewish text teaches about abortion and reproductive justice.

Katz will then share the work that NCJW is leading nationally on the subject, including their fight to protect reproductive rights in the newly constituted supreme court. She will also introduce NCJW's 2020 initiative, "Rabbis for Repro" which has engaged nearly 1,000 Jewish clergy and educators, including Rabbi Hayon, Rabbi Silk, Rabbi Fixler and Cantor Simmons.

This program will be held on Zoom. Registration is required and must be completed by **Saturday, January 9**. A Zoom link for the program will be sent out by mid-day on the day of the gathering to all registered participants.

During the eight days of Chanukah Heroes & Lights, Emanu El will be joined by Congregation Beth Israel, Congregation Beth Yeshurun, Congregation Brith Shalom, Congregation Or Ami, Houston Congregation for Reform Judaism, Temple Sinai, and United Orthodox Synagogues. 


