FROM RABBI HAYON



Although few of us will have had experiences this summer which are as memorable and transformational as those enjoyed by the teenage participants on our Shirley Barish Memorial Israel Experience, I still hope that all of us will find the chance to relax and recharge.

When this month's edition of the Temple Bulletin arrives in your mailbox, our Temple teens will just be preparing to return home from an amazing four-week stay in Israel on this year's Shirley Barish Memorial Israel Experience. It is not an exaggeration for me to say that every single participant on the trip – students, staff and clergy – all come back different.

Immersing oneself in the extraordinary history of the Jewish people and the Jewish state is always a transformational experience. For some, a trip like this deepens their feeling of connectedness with their people; for others, it strengthens their resolve about upholding Jewish tradition in their adult lives; for still others, it brings about a new level of spiritual insight and fortifies their relationship with God.

I am reminded of a famous Hasidic story about a young boy who had developed the habit of sneaking out of his house to go wander alone in the woods. Not Our Kind by Kitty Zeldis THURSDAY, JULY 14, 7:00 PM (digital)

A young Jewish teacher and a WASPy married woman find an unexpected connection in post–World War II New York. This is a compelling tale of friendship, class, prejudice, and love.

Eleanor Moskowitz is used to experiencing anti-Semitism. On the way to a job interview, her cab is hit. It isn't a serious accident, but the other cab's passenger, Patricia Bellamy, insists on taking Eleanor home with her so she can freshen up. It's there that Eleanor meets Patricia's daughter, Margaux, a polio survivor who recently scared off a tutor with her surly attitude. Margaux takes a liking to Eleanor and asks Patricia if she can be her tutor. Patricia, who rarely interacts with Jewish people, doesn't know what her stodgy husband and her status-obsessed friends will think. She hires Eleanor, and Margaux begins to flourish. Eleanor, who has never had much money, is sucked into the Bellamys' world of glamour and privilege. But when Eleanor begins a romance with Patricia's bohemian brother, things start to get complicated. Could Eleanor ever really be part of the Bellamys' world, or is she just too different?

Zeldis paints a vivid picture of two separate New Yorks in the 1940s – Eleanor's shabby clothes and budget meals versus Patricia's fancy dresses and staff-prepared dinners. Their twin journeys toward independence – Eleanor's from her mother and Patricia's from her husband – show that no matter how much money a woman had, she was still constrained by the misogyny and stifling gender roles of the time.

An Observant Wife by Naomi Ragan THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 8, 7:00 PM

In this rich and compassionate novel, *An Observant Wife*, Naomi Ragan continues the love story between newly observant California-girl Leah and ultra-Orthodox Yaakov from *An Unorthodox Match*. From the joy of their wedding day, surrounded by supportive friends and family, Yaacov and Leah are soon plunged into their new lives together as Yaacov leaves his

beloved Yeshiva to work in the city, and Leah confronts the often-agonizing restrictions imposed by religious laws governing even the most intimate moments of their married lives. Adding to the difficulties is the hostility of some in the community who continue to view Leah as a dangerous interloper, questioning her sincerity and adherence to religious laws and spreading outrageous rumors. Compromise and love lead Leah and Yaakov on their future path with happiness and contentment.

Mah Jongg Mondays: A Memoir About Friendship, Love and Faith by Fern Bernstein THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 7:00 PM

Bernstein illustrates the benefits of Monday mah jongg, threading the mental challenge, support, and deep bonds of devoted friendships. This heartwarming story illustrates the wonderful things that can happen when five women are destined to come together to play an old Chinese game, sitting around a table with tiles, dice, and a mah jongg card.

Congregation Emanu El Responds to Ukraine Crisis

Ever since Russia invaded Ukraine in late February 2022, we've all been following along, praying for peace, and wondering what we could do to help. As is often the case with crises in foreign countries, we are not always sure what we can do to help. We often do not know what organizations we can trust, which people are really making a difference, and how what I have to offer can really help.

Congregation Emanu El clergy and congregants stepped up in a big way to help. Individual donations and a contribution from the Clergy Good Works Fund sent over \$18,000 (that we know about!) to the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee (JDC) Ukraine Crisis Fund. JDC is on the ground, providing aid to those Jews remaining in Ukraine, those willing and able to evacuate, the thousands of refugees who have fled to neighboring countries. Not only did our congregation provide financial support but also one of our congregants is making an enormous difference on the ground. Ed Wayne, who has been a member of Emanu El for over 30 years, is doing amazing and heroic work in and around Ukraine. Ed has facilitated the purchase and delivery of 2 ambulances as well as an emergency vehicle to transport patients to the Lviv Regional Psychiatric hospital. He has been instrumental in several shipments of food, medications, medical supplies, and more between JDC offices in Warsaw and JDC offices in Lviv. Ed and his wife Tanya purchased bullet proof vests for ambulance drivers and ensured that surgical supplies were available for surgeons on the front lines in Ukraine. Ed explains, "The needs do not stop." Congregation Emanu El is so proud of the work that Ed and Tanya are doing for the people of Ukraine.

Rabbi Hayon adds, "Our hearts have been moved by the stories of families displaced and separated from each other and our souls have been chilled as we track the rising tally of casualties throughout Ukraine. We should also be inspired by the generosity of our community and

in awe of the impact that Ed and Tanya are making on the ground in Ukraine."

Shirley Barish Memorial Israel Experience

By the time this *Bulletin* hits your mailbox or email, the Shirley Barish Memorial Israel Experience group will be back from their adventure.




