FROM RABBI HAYON



However, you spend your time this summer, I hope that the months ahead will bring you fulfillment, joy, and rejuvenation.

As June arrives in our community, it brings with it the same series of endings and beginnings that accompany every summer: graduations and awards banquets, departures for summer vacation, and the start of new jobs, new universities, and new homes.

Here too, our congregational community moves through similar series of endings and beginnings. We are welcoming our new officers and Board members to their positions of leadership. political and social movements, and integrated into several layers of Iranian society. This talk will explore the landscape of Jewish identity in Iran, with a special focus on Jewish-Muslim interactions, political engagement, and the intersection of education and integration. As we analyze how Iranian Jews navigated between their Iranian and Jewish identities in an era of new nationalisms, we gain insight into what Jewish emancipation and assimilation looked like in a Muslimmajority country.

Dr. Farah is a 2021-2023 Samuel W. and Goldye Marian Spain Postdoctoral Fellow in Jewish Studies at Rice University. She received her PhD in Jewish History from Stanford University in 2021. Dr. Farah's scholarship, which lies at the intersection of Jewish history, Middle Eastern history, education history, and transnational studies, examines interreligious encounters, national belonging, and Jewish identity formation in modern Iran and Turkey. As an Iranian American Jewish woman, her work aims to give voice to Middle Eastern Jews' experiences.


Young professionals are invited for special sessions from 7:30 - 9:00 p.m. and babysitting will be provided during the same time.

Not Our Kind by Kitty Zeldis

Sisterhood hosts bi-monthly book reviews throughout the year that are open to the public. May's book review will be led by our congregant, Shelly Cyprus.

A summary of our July book selection can be found below:

One rainy morning, two years after the end of World War II, a minor traffic accident fatefully brings together Eleanor Moskowitz and Patricia Bellamy. Eleanor, a teacher and recent Vassar graduate, needs a job. Patricia's difficult thirteen-year-old daughter, Margaux, recovering from polio, needs a private tutor at their Park Avenue home.

Eleanor's mother, a hatmaker with a shop on Second Avenue, disapproves of the arrangement; the Bellamys live in a restricted building where Eleanor will have to conceal the fact that she's Jewish. But Eleanor, who has formed an immediate bond with Margaux, loves her new position despite her mother's misgivings.

Soon after Eleanor arrives at the Bellamys' country home in Connecticut, she meets Patricia's charming bohemian brother, Tom, recently returned from the war. The spark between Eleanor and Tom is instant and intense, and Eleanor begins to feel more comfortable in their world, undeterred by the fact that she's an outsider. Then one hot summer evening a line is crossed, and Eleanor will have to make a decision with consequences for all of their lives.

Gripping and vividly told, *Not Our Kind* looks at two women on the cusp of change – and asks how much our identities can and should define us.
