flavors and vivid memories of the past. The Torah relates that, during their wanderings in the desert, our Israelite ancestors found themselves nostalgic for Egypt. They brought their unhappiness to Moses, complaining specifically about the food that they missed from their former home: "We remember the fish that we used to eat in Egypt, the cucumbers, the melons, the leeks, the onions, and the garlic!" (Num. 11:5)

Although the Israelites were wrong to yearn for a return to their servitude under Pharaoh, we can sympathize with the way in which they were drawn too strongly to the memories of the refreshing foods

they used to eat in Egypt. Sometimes we, too, find ourselves fantasizing about the scents and savors of our idealized memories about "the good old days." And so, with a nod to our nostalgic ancestors who lived many centuries ago, I'll end this month's message with a simple summer recipe. This is a quick and refreshing summer salad that combines cucumbers, melons and onions, the same flavors that the ancient Israelites longed for in the desert:

In a large bowl, combine 1/2 large cucumbers (peeled and sliced), 1/2 small cantaloupe (chopped), and 1/4 cup thinly-sliced red onions (fresh or pickled). In a separate bowl, whisk together 2 tablespoons of extravirgin olive oil, 1 tablespoon of red wine vinegar, and salt and pepper to taste. Pour the dressing into the large bowl and toss. Season with more salt and pepper, and garnish with sunflower seeds and fresh basil leaves. Serve and enjoy with the people you love!

Those requesting accessible seating may be granted a maximum of four additional seats for family members. Please note this seating will be released 15 minutes prior to the beginning of services.

The deadline for Rosh HaShanah is **Sunday, September 10**, and Yom Kippur is **Tuesday, September 19**.

HEARING LOOP

The Barish Sanctuary is equipped with an Induction Loop System which transmits audio signals directly to one's telecoil (T-coil)-equipped hearing aid.

CLOSED CAPTIONING

To ensure those who are hard of hearing can enjoy and participate in our beautiful High Holy Day services, we will be providing closed captioning for all Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur services in the Barish Sanctuary except for the children's services.

For those watching remotely, we intend to use the StreamText platform for a second straight year and will provide the appropriate URL in upcoming synagogue communications.

Emanu El is excited to announce that we will be using digital passes for our High Holy Day services this vear. We will email each adult member of your household a digital pass which may be used for all holidays and services. You must be a member in good standing to receive High Holy Day passes. You will receive an email from orders@simpletix.com which will be sent to the email address on file in your ShulCloud account in early September. You can print your pass at home or simply save it on your phone to be scanned when you

arrive at the building for services. Passes will be scanned before you can enter the building. Your name will be on your pass, and passes are NOT transferrable.

Please be sure that you have a current email address on file with the congregation. If you aren't sure, you can log into your ShulCloud account to check or contact Jessie Cassorla at jessiec@emanuelhouston.org.

Watch for more information about our new digital passes in your email and in our High Holy Day information packet that will be mailed in August.

Celebrate July 4th with Emanu El!


Our July 4th Celebration is back!

BOOK REVIEW

My Grandfather Would Have Shot Me: A Black Woman Discovers Her Family's Nazi Past by Jennifer Teege & Nikola Sellmair TUESDAY, JULY 27, 12:30 P.M.

This fascinating memoir by German writer Jennifer Teege and Nikola Sellmair recounts Teege's discovery at age 38 that her grandfather was Amon Goeth, the vicious Auschwitz commandant depicted in Steven Spielberg's film *Schindler's List*. Teege was adopted and learned about her family history after reading a biography of her biological mother. This book details Teege's discovery of her ancestry and her attempts to come to terms with this revelation by researching her family and traveling to Israel and Krakow.

Announcing the Yahrzeit Wall Replacement

The new wall will include automated and programmable lighting, new brass plaques replacing all current plaques, and room for an additional 1,000 names.


This project is being made possible through the generous support of our congregant and board member, Nancy Parkans-Ehrenkranz. Nancy explains, "As a lifelong member of Congregation Emanu El, I have watched the evolution of our sacred space change and age with the passage of time. I have also experienced the loss of many family members – including eight whose names are memorialized on our current Yahrzeit walls. My parents, Morissa and Lloyd Parkans, of sacred memory, were also long-time members of our congregation who cherished their connection to the temple. As the last remaining member of my family in Houston, I have long wanted to do something meaningful to honor my parents' memory and leave a continuing legacy, while I am here to witness it. It is my hope that the new format and more consistent

look of these remembrance walls provides a home of dignity and affection for those named, and peace and comfort to all temple members whose family shares space in this holy way."

Rabbi Hayon adds, "The incredible impact of Nancy's generosity will live on for generations through the new Yahrzeit wall. This new fully functional memorial will allow us to remember our beloved ones in a dignified way in keeping with the classic aesthetics of our sanctuary. We are so grateful for Nancy's ongoing dedication to our congregation and for her willingness to make such a generous gift which will benefit all the generations of Congregation Emanu El – past, present, and future."

The installation of the new wall should be complete by the 2023 High Holy Day season. Additional information about the timing, how plaques will be arranged, and more will be communicated directly to those congregants with loved one's names currently on the wall.

The **Honor Roll Award** honors the second 10% of the confirmation class as determined by their teachers and the director. Students are recommended for this award based on their participation, behavior and attendance in high school.

The **Noble Campership Award** is presented to Confirmands who have exhibited outstanding leadership in youth group or in class.

WINNER: Ethan Taylor

The **Rose Goodfriend Award** was created by her children, Norris and Dr. Barry Goodfriend and their families, in memory of their mother. The Goodfriend Award is given annually to a Confirmand who has achieved academic excellence, has been a leader, and who commits to continue his/her Jewish education through high school graduation. This year is the 40th anniversary of the creation of the Goodfriend award.
