FROM RABBI HAYON



During these next few weeks of summer, whether we spend them here in Houston or someplace more exotic, we may find the opportunity to try out Ari Goldman's observations about what it feels like to live life without a

watch for a few

days.

Ari L. Goldman is a professor at Columbia University's School of Journalism who grew up in a Jewishly observant family. A number of years ago, he wrote a book – part memoir and part practical handbook – which he titled *Being Jewish*. In the section of the book about Shabbat, Goldman writes the following:

The important thing about Sabbath observance is that you make the day different in big ways and in small ways. For example, I was brought up not to carry my wallet on the Sabbath, which is a good idea because it keeps me from carrying money [because] Shabbat is not a day for commerce. . . . Several years ago, when I was a reporter who lived by the watch, I stopped wearing my watch on the Sabbath. By the strict laws of Shabbat, there is nothing wrong with wearing a watch, but not wearing one liberated me from my enslavement to time. Shabbat gives us the opportunity one day a week to live for ourselves and not for the clock.

I think that Goldman's awareness of the way we are beholden to our schedules and calendars opens up an interesting and fruitful way for us to think about Shabbat and the way a day of rest can enrich and enliven


Book of Memory 2023

Annual Meeting 2023

On Sunday, April 23, the congregation held our annual meeting, which was preceded by the 2023 Ernest Krautkopf Congregant of the Year luncheon. For over 50 years, we have honored outstanding congregants who have exemplified the admirable traits of compassion, leadership, a love of our congregation and the Jewish people, and a deep and abiding love of our Jewish value of *tikkun olam*, repairing the world.

Our honorees, Elyse Spector Kalmans and Cheryl Levy, spoke of their families' involvement in the congregation, going back several generations. They talked about the relationships they have built through their volunteer work and their passion for leaving a legacy of leadership and volunteer engagement to their children. Many thanks to our Brotherhood members who selected these very deserving role models to receive this award.

At the annual meeting, I spoke about our terrific clergy, staff, and teachers and how their leadership and commitment to our congregation is at the core of our success. The heart of our congregation, however, is our volunteers. There are over 30 committees whose volunteerism supports our schools, our facilities and security, and our clergy. Besides our active committees, we have many ways for our members to get involved in our congregational family.

Our Kids Meals effort, ably chaired by Donnie Bundman and Ron Nodler, has made over 12,000 sandwiches this fiscal year. Sandy Harris heads up our efforts for SEARCH, making snack packs. Phyllis Berman, along with other Emanu El volunteers, organizes The Gathering Place, monthly social events for community members living with mild to moderate memory loss due to Alzheimer's or other dementias.

These are only a few of the ways in which our members can volunteer together, building relationships with each other that will ultimately strengthen our entire congregational family. 

United Against Hate Initiative

In September of last year, Attorney General Merrick Garland launched the "United Against Hate Initiative," designed to make it safer and easier for minority populations in America to report hate crimes in their communities.

Here in Houston, the United States Attorney's Office has formed a collaborative partnership with the ADL and Interfaith Ministries for Greater Houston to gather representatives of minority communities and share information and resources about hate crime and how to report it. The Hate Crimes & Bias Incident Reporting Initiative was designed to support Attorney General Garland's initiative by forming a cooperative pilot group for local faith leaders representing communities traditionally impacted by hate crimes. Rabbi Hayon represented Emanu El at the inaugural meeting of this group to learn more about how to respond to and report bias-related incidents.

As the Reporting Initiative continues to do its work in the weeks and months ahead, we look forward to sharing important information with you about hate crime in our community, as well as offering some specific details about how to remain alert to these issues in our city and how to report bias-related crime most efficiently to law enforcement agencies.

A Message from Stefani Carlson

In Jewish tradition, when we reach the end of one of the five books of the *Torah* in our annual cycle of reading, as we did recently with the book of *Leviticus*, it is customary to take a pause and say: "Chazak, Chazak, v'Nitchazek," which translates to, "be strong, be strong, and together we will be strengthened." In its use of both singular and plural verb forms, this phrase reminds us of the power of being together in community. Our individual efforts are significant and important. Combined, they make a whole that is stronger than the sum of its parts.



For our Becker School community, the news that Sarah Williams will soon be leaving her role as Director of the Becker School to take a newly created position at the Houston Jewish Federation provides us with a similar opportunity to pause and reflect on our strengths. The three years of Sarah's tenure at Becker have been ones of great challenge and tremendous growth. Thanks to her vision and leadership, we are well-positioned for the future. Our faculty is world-class, and has formed a

cohesive, effective unit. Our shift to the Reggio Emilia philosophy has taken the learning that happens at Becker in exciting new directions and re-energized our teachers as they grow alongside their students. Our classrooms, hallways, and outdoor spaces are filled with love, laughter, and learning.



It has also been a time of significant change for the Congregation Emanu El community as a whole. Not only have we endured a global pandemic together, we have emerged from it with renewed vision and commitment to our spiritual home. During this time, our Emanu El schools have shifted how we think about our work together: from being two completely separate entities, the Becker School and the Helfman Religious School, to being one education team, under my leadership, with a united vision, operating at different times with different ages.



For the last two years, Becker and Helfman teachers have joined together for professional development and celebrations to build community and share expertise across the two schools. The administrative staffs of both schools meet monthly as a full education team for information sharing and goal setting. Even prior to Sarah's announcement, she and I were working together to reorganize the education staff team to better serve both school communities. We are confident that the plan we have made will lead us from strength to strength, through the coming school year and beyond. I am pleased to share that plan with you now.

As I assume my new role as Director of Lifelong Learning, with an expanded focus on the educational programming at Congregation Emanu El as a whole, the Helfman Religious School remains in capable, familiar hands. Beginning this summer, Lucy Mosbacher, who has served as Assistant Director for the last four years, will have a new title – Helfman Religious School Principal – to reflect her expanding responsibilities. We are confident that Helfman Religious School will continue to flourish under her skilled leadership.



Becca Schwartzberg, Youth and Young Adult Engagement Coordinator, will be continuing in her role of providing excellent programming for our teens and young adults, including our exceptional TA program. Tobi Flick, B'nei Mitzvah Coordinator, who joined our staff last month, has already begun getting to know our B'nei Mitzvah students and their families. Elizabeth Townsend will continue to provide administrative support to me and to both schools and answers to just about any Emanu El related question you can come up with! – in her role as Education Assistant and Helfman Registrar. This year, Helfman Religious School students and families have also benefitted from the presence on Sunday mornings of Rachel Kossar, LSC, our new Helfman Religious School Counselor, who has worked with teachers to ensure that every student has a positive learning experience. Rachel will be expanding her role next year, to add some mid-week hours for follow-up conversations.

To provide a seamless transition in Becker School leadership, Erika Roberts, who has served the Becker School for more than 10 years, first as a teacher and for the last three years as Licensing and Logistics Coordinator, has graciously agreed to serve as Interim Principal of the Becker School for the 2023-24 school year. I am confident that our Becker School community will continue to thrive under Erika's skilled leadership, supported by her longstanding relationships and deep institutional knowledge. A Becker School Leadership Task Force, led by Barry Lichman, Vice President of Education for Congregation Emanu El, will be convened this summer to provide oversight and evaluation of the transition plan, and to conduct a nationwide search for a permanent leader of the Becker School.

Just as our tradition teaches us that we are stronger together, Erika will be supported in her new role by an expanded Becker School administrative team. As

Director of Lifelong Learning, I will provide Erika with supervision and mentorship, as well as with a vision for Jewish learning at Becker. I will also be a supportive resource for teachers, staff members – and especially parents and families. Judy Lazor, beloved to the Becker community for an amazing 23 years, will be continuing in her role as Admissions Director for the Becker School. And Sarah Kronman will continue to be the warm, welcoming presence at the school reception desk.

We will also be adding two new positions to the Becker School administrative team, both of which will be filled by current Becker teachers. Brooke Lewis, who in addition to having taught at Becker for several years holds a certification in Early Childhood Intervention, will be joining the administrative team as Child Development Coordinator. In this new position, Brooke will be responsible for ensuring that every child at Becker is fully supported in their learning. She will coordinate with teachers, therapists, and other specialists, and will maintain student records and clear lines of communication with parents and other caregivers. Brianna Francis, known to her students as "Ms. Bubbles," will be taking on the newly created role of Teacher and Parent Engagement Coordinator. Among other duties, she will be working with the ECAC to expand Becker's reach beyond our classrooms, building community among our parents and families, and engaging families with young children in the wider Emanu El community. She will also be developing enriching professional development opportunities for our teachers, as well as taking on responsibility for maintaining teacher files and onboarding new teachers. We are excited to be able to grow from within by building upon the strengths of our teachers to provide a strong administrative foundation for our school.

So, as we pause and reflect and say together, "Chazak, Chazak, v'Nitchazek," my prayer for us all is that we can do so thinking of our Congregation Emanu El leaning community. 


