FROM RABBI HAYON



We would do well to remember as well the other vital parts of the Jews' legacy throughout the story of human civilization: our insistent resistance in the face of oppression, our morality in an immoral world. and our stubborn survival despite those who would prefer to see us disappear.

I'm filing my *Bulletin* article this month from Poland, where I am accompanying 22 teens (and four marvelous staff members) who are participating in this year's Shirley Barish Memorial Israel Experience. At the time I'm writing these words, we have just begun our travels, exploring the long proud history of Jews in this part of Europe, where Jewish life thrived for a thousand years before it was decimated in the Holocaust.

As we welcomed our first Shabbat together this week, we gathered on an upper floor of the Krakow JCC, where the local community has built a robust community to benefit the Jews of Krakow – as well as countless others who are not affiliated with the Jewish community. The JCC does extraordinary, inspiring work for thousands of beneficiaries in and beyond Krakow: Holocaust survivors and their descendants, elderly and impoverished Jews throughout Poland, and hundreds of Ukranian civilans who have been displaced from their homes because of the violence and destruction of the war with Russia, which has now stretched on for longer than a year.

We shared Shabbat dinner together with members of the JCC community, and as we were enjoying our meal, we had a chance to speak with Jonathan Ornstein, the Center's CEO. While reflecting on the contrast between the violent and tragic past of Polish Jewry and the

In the summer, that number more than doubles because Kids' Meals feeds not only preschool-aged children but all children in the home.

joyful, robust state of Jewish life here today, he offered a comment that moved me, and which I have continued thinking about ever since: "Just because you have been victimized does not mean that you are a victim."

His insight was a helpful frame for our students to view their difficult experiences during these days in Poland, which included visits to the concentration camps of Auschwitz-Birkenau, Majdanek and Treblinka. Even the most cursory study of European Jewish history reveals extraordinary victimization – over the span of hundreds of years and thousands of square miles. But it would be a mistake to conclude that the core enduring message of Jewish history in Europe is that the Jews who made their home here are merely victims of those who held power over them.

It is also helpful and enlightening for us to spend time studying the various forms taken by Jewish resistance to the victimization and oppression they experienced. How did they push back against antisemitism and other poisonous ideologies of hate? How did they fight back? How did they offer help and support to one another?

Under what circumstances did they find innovative solutions and helpful alliances to preserve their lives and their futures?

Not only is this a helpful lens through which our students can examine the Jewish past, it is also a useful way for us to examine our own role in, and relationship with, the developments of Jewish communal life unfolding today in our own community. What does Jewish resistance look like in today's world? How do we embody the confidence and pride that our ancestors had when we feel the pressure to assimilate or downplay our own Jewishness? How do we emulate their strength and their unwillingness to abide harmful and untrue speech when we encounter it in our schools, our workplaces, or our social media feeds?

It is undeniably true that Jews have been repeatedly victimized and oppressed in countless places around the world during the millennia of our existence.

Nevertheless, it would be a grave mistake to conclude that the Jews are primarily history's victims. Instead, we would do well to remember as well the other vital parts of the Jews' legacy throughout the story of human civilization: our insistent resistance in the face of oppression, our morality in an immoral world, and our stubborn survival despite those who would prefer to see us disappear. This is the heritage of our Jewish past, and it is the promise of our shared Jewish future.



It has been around five months since we told the congregation about our audacious goal of raising \$20 million to ensure Emanu El's future. SBMIE 2024 is Underway!



Airport

The fifth cohort of the Shirley Barish Memorial Israel Experience (SBMIE) departed Houston for a four-week trip of a lifetime to Poland and Israel on June 10, 2024. The 22 rising juniors and seniors were accompanied by Rabbi Oren Hayon; Stefani Carlson, Director of Lifelong Learning; Becca Schwartzberg, Youth and Young Adult Engagement Coordinator; Stephen Carlson, High School Teacher; and Kenneth Taylor, Public Programs and Outreach Coordinator, Holocaust Museum Houston (HMH). We are grateful to HMH for partnering with us to bring Ken's expertise as a Holocaust educator to our students on the first half of the trip.

The group will be guided on the full trip, including Poland, by Mickey Medzini, who also guided SBMIE groups in 2018 and 2022, and who, along with his father, Professor Meron Medzini, spoke at Congregation Emanu El in September. Cantor Rollin Simmons, Rabbi Joshua Fixler, and Elizabeth Townsend, Education Assistant and Helfman Registrar, will each be joining the group later in our travels. We are pleased to be partnering for the second time with Ayelet Tours as our travel provider.



Warsaw Ghetto

This year, we are pleased to announce that we have been selected as a RootOne Trip Provider, joining a prestigious group of excellent Israel educational experiences that also includes BBYO Passport and the URJ's Yallah! Israel (formerly known as NFTY in Israel). Our grant from RootOne provides financial and educational support for SBMIE, including pre- and post-trip learning opportunities for our students, as well as a multi-day "mifgash" (gathering) with Israeli teens from Leo Baeck High School while we are in Jerusalem.

RootOne, LLC is seeded through a generous grant by The Marcus Foundation and powered by The Jewish Education Project. In addition to the RootOne voucher, all students who celebrate their B'nei Mitzvah at Congregation Emanu El and commit to participating in the Helfman Upper School program through high school graduation are eligible for full scholarships for SBMIE from the Barish Israel Fund (less a small registration fee). We are grateful to the Barish Family, and their extraordinary commitment to Israel education, for making this amazing gift available to our students!
