#### FROM RABBI HAYON



I hope that 2024 will be a year of growth and goodness for all of us and the people we love. May it bring all of us closer together, and bring us to a new and deeper appreciation for the most meaningful and beautiful aspects of the world we share.

The start of a new year is, of course, traditionally a time when many people begin thinking about how to improve themselves over the course of the next twelve months. Specifically, it's very common for people to make new year's resolutions about the way they will improve their bodies over the coming year. angle, consider the online "52 Book Club," which provides a different prompt each week to diversify your reading choices and expose yourself to new authors and titles.

• Commit yourself to visit a different Houston museum each month. Did you realize that there are 18 different institutions in the Museum District alone? Spending time in contemplation and study of visual art is good for the mind and the soul. Visiting some of our wonderful local museums is a wonderful way to expose yourself to artists, media, and viewpoints with which you might not otherwise have become acquainted. I encourage you to make time over the year ahead to explore some of the remarkable collections that we are fortunate to have right here in our own backyard.

• Resolve to set aside technology-free time each week. Countless scientific studies have firmly established the detrimental effects that constant cell-phone usage has on our sleep, our mental health, and our attention spans. Carving out some inviolable time each week – even just an hour – when we separate ourselves from technology is an excellent way to retrain our brains to capture the richness of analog thought and communication. (It's also a great way to give yourself the priceless gift of peace and quiet during Shabbat each week!)




