FROM RABBI HAYON



Our predecessors who lived thousands of years ago knew that successful leadership must be a shared endeavor, one in which the responsibilities and rewards of authority are shared in partnership between likeminded people.

The 18th chapter of *Exodus* is a brief intermission in the Torah's storytelling, falling squarely between the Israelites' escape from Egyptian slavery and the giving of the Ten Commandments at Mt. Sinai. It is a short moment of relative calm in the biblical epic, and Moses finds himself exhausted.

He's just accomplished the extraordinary feat of parting the sea and leading his entire people away from Pharaoh's oppression and into the safety of their new lives. But there is no rest for this weary leader: "The people stood around Moses from morning to evening," the text reports, surrounding him and seeking advice and encouragement during a time of deep uncertainty.

Moses' father-in-law Jethro sees the signs of burnout in him, and counsels him that in order to relieve the burden of leadership, he must find some trusted partners with whom he can share his responsibilities. "Seek out some capable and faithful people, trustworthy individuals who spurn ill-gotten gain.... Make it easier for yourself by letting them share the burden with you." (Ex. 18:21-22) Jethro knew, as we do today, that the demanding work of leadership cannot be held by a single person; rather, it must be shared with trusted partners and colleagues – for the well-

MAZEL MOMENTS



Dear Congregants,

I wanted to share an update on the L'Dor VaDor: For Emanu El's Future with all of you. Since our community-wide announcement in February, many of our congregants have made incredibly generous gifts to ensure that this transformational project becomes a reality. As of the print deadline for the May *Bulletin*, we have raised \$16.6 million

towards our \$20 million goal. We are so grateful to those who have contributed already to this project!





Rachel comes to Becker with nearly 20 years of educational leadership experience and a strong commitment to academic excellence and holistic student development. She is excited to be bringing together her love of Judaism, her love of learning, and her love of children at Becker.

Throughout her career, Rachel has assumed diverse leadership roles, both at the campus level as a principal of elementary and junior high schools and at the district level as a special education coordinator. Her expertise encompasses a wide range of areas, including social-emotional learning, behavioral management, inclusion of students with disabilities, differentiated instruction, and fostering teacher growth through professional learning communities. She holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Texas A&M University, a Master of Education in Educational Leadership from Texas State University, and a superintendent of schools certification from Lamar University.

As she writes in her educational statement:

Families must be valued as partners in their child's education, contributing insights, expertise, and cultural perspectives to enrich their collective experience. I strive to cultivate strong relationships built on trust, respect, and open communication. By involving families in the educational process, we create a supportive network that empowers children to thrive both inside and outside the classroom.

I aspire to create a learning environment that honors diversity, fosters creativity, and celebrates the exceptional strengths and identities of each child. I am a committed lifelong learner who is continually refining my approach to best meet the evolving needs of the children, staff, and community I serve.

Above all, I am dedicated to nurturing compassionate, lifelong learners who are empowered to explore, question, and contribute to a more just and equitable world.



Holocaust Museum Houston to Offer Free Admission Days in May

Museum admission will be free in honor of Holocaust survivor Walter Kase on **Sunday, May 5**, the anniversary of his liberation by the 71st Infantry Division of the United States Army in 1945. Kase passed away on March 4, 2015. The Free Admission Day in Honor of Walter Kase is supported by the Walter Kase Endowment Fund. The free admission day is also in observance of Yom HaShoah.

The museum will offer free admission **Wednesday, May 15**, in honor of Holocaust survivor Stefi Altman. During WWII, Altman was sent to several camps and eventually managed to escape the labor camp of Dorohucza. For the remainder of the war, she hid in a coffin-like space underneath a barn that belonged to a sympathetic Polish farmer. After she was liberated by the Soviets, she learned that her entire family had perished. Stefi Altman passed away in December 2017. The Free Admission Day in Honor of Stefi Altman is supported by the Stefi Altman Endowment Fund.

HMH will also participate in the Blue Star Museums program with free admission for active-duty service members and their families starting **Armed Forces Day, Saturday, May 18** and ending on **Labor Day, Monday, September 2**. Blue Star Museums is a partnership between the National Endowment for the Arts and Blue Star Families, in collaboration with the Department of Defense and museums across America.


