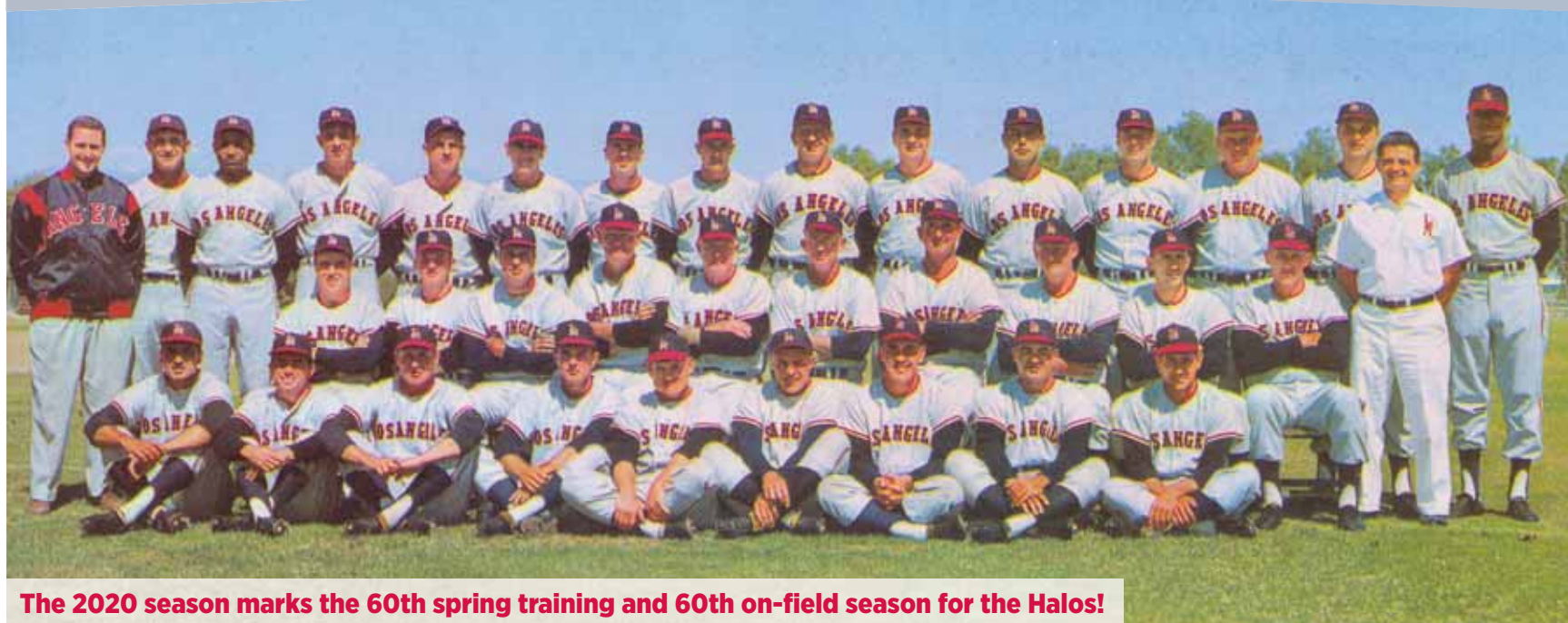

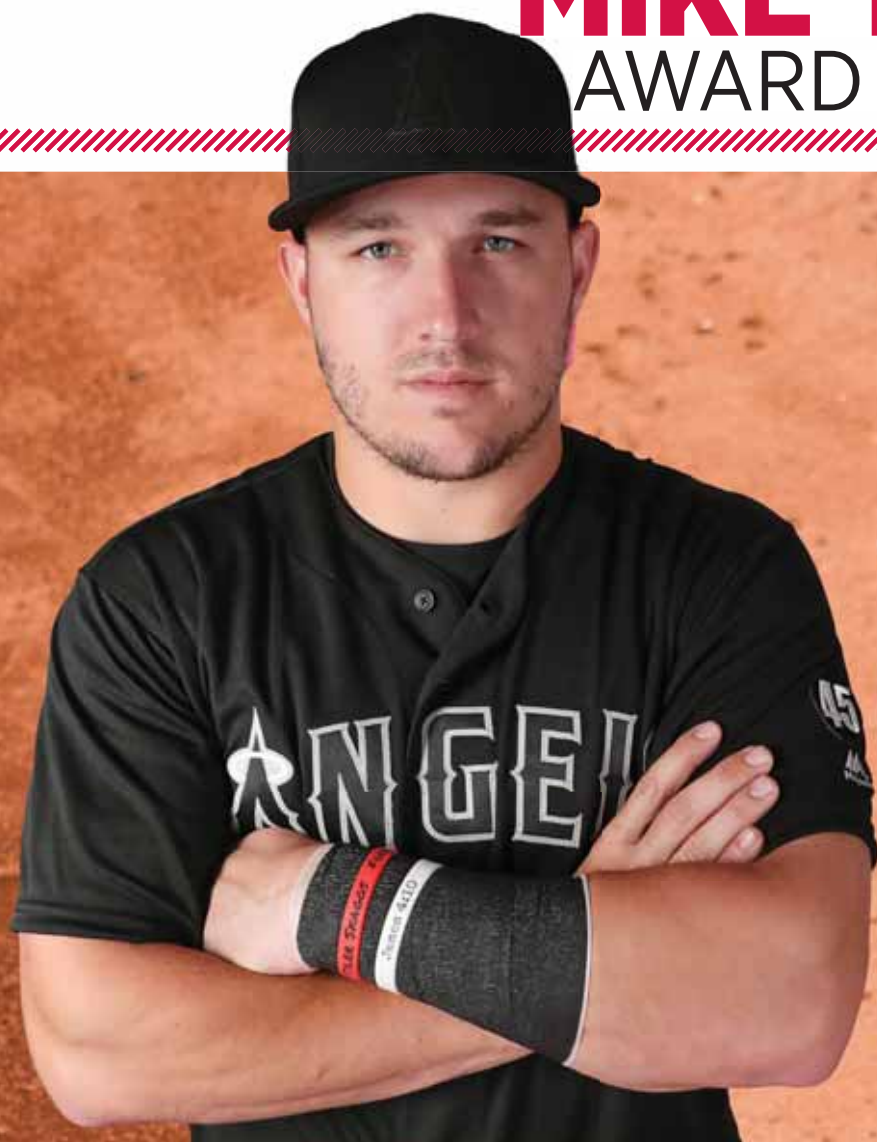

AWARD WINNER



Mike Trout in 2019 received the following awards following another banner season with the Angels.

- **2019 American League Most Valuable Player**
- **2019 Hank Aaron Award**
- **2019 Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Award**
- **2019 Sporting News Player of the Year**
- **2019 All-MLB Team (outfielder)**
- **2019 Baseball Digest/eBay MLB Player of the Year**
- **2019 Los Angeles Sports Council Sportsmen of the Year (co-winner with Cody Bellinger)**

AWARD WINNER

The 28-year-old and two-time A.L. MVP, completed his 2019 season batting .291 with 27 doubles, two triples, 45 home runs, 104 RBI, 11 stolen bases, 110 walks and 110 runs scored. Below is a list of some of his accomplishments in what was his ninth big league season:

- Ranked in the Top-10 in several of the American League's offensive categories including home runs (2nd), OBP (1st), slugging (1st), OPS (1st), walks (2nd), runs (T-5th) and RBI (T-8th).
- Scored 100 runs for the seventh time in career and became the fifth player in MLB history to score 100 runs seven times by his age-27 season, joining: Alex Rodriguez, Hank Aaron, Mickey Mantle and Mel Ott.
- 2019 marked second time leading the league in both OBP and slugging percentage (also, 2017)...Joins Ty Cobb and Mickey Mantle as the only center fielders to lead their league in both categories in multiple seasons.
- 2019 marked his fourth 100 R/100 BB season (also, 2013, 2016 and 2018)...Only players with more prior to their age-28 campaign were Mickey Mantle (5) and Frank Thomas (5).
- First player in A.L. history to have 25+ HR and 10+ stolen bases in eight consecutive seasons...Only N.L. players to do so are Barry Bonds, Darryl Strawberry and Willie Mays.
- Joined Mickey Mantle and Alex Rodriguez as only A.L. players to have eight consecutive 20+ home run seasons by their age-27 season.
- Fifth player in A.L. history with an OPS above 1.070 in four straight seasons, joining Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig, Jimmie Foxx and Ted Williams.
- Became first player ever with 275 home runs and 200 steals before their age-28 season and just the seventh player in American League history to reach those marks in a career.

- According to Baseball Reference, finished 2019 with 8.3 Wins Above Replacement (WAR) this season, which led the American League and ranked second in the Majors...Sixth time in career with a bWAR above 6.0...Only other players to have six seasons with a 6+ bWAR within their first nine big league campaigns are Albert Pujols (7) and Ted Williams (6).
- His 72.5 career bWAR is the best ever by a player before their age-28 season, ahead of Ty Cobb (69.0) and Mickey Mantle (68.1).
- Trout's 184 OPS+ led the A.L. for a fifth consecutive season...Only other players to do so are Ty Cobb (1907-15), Babe Ruth (1919-24, 1926-31) and Mickey Mantle (1958-62).

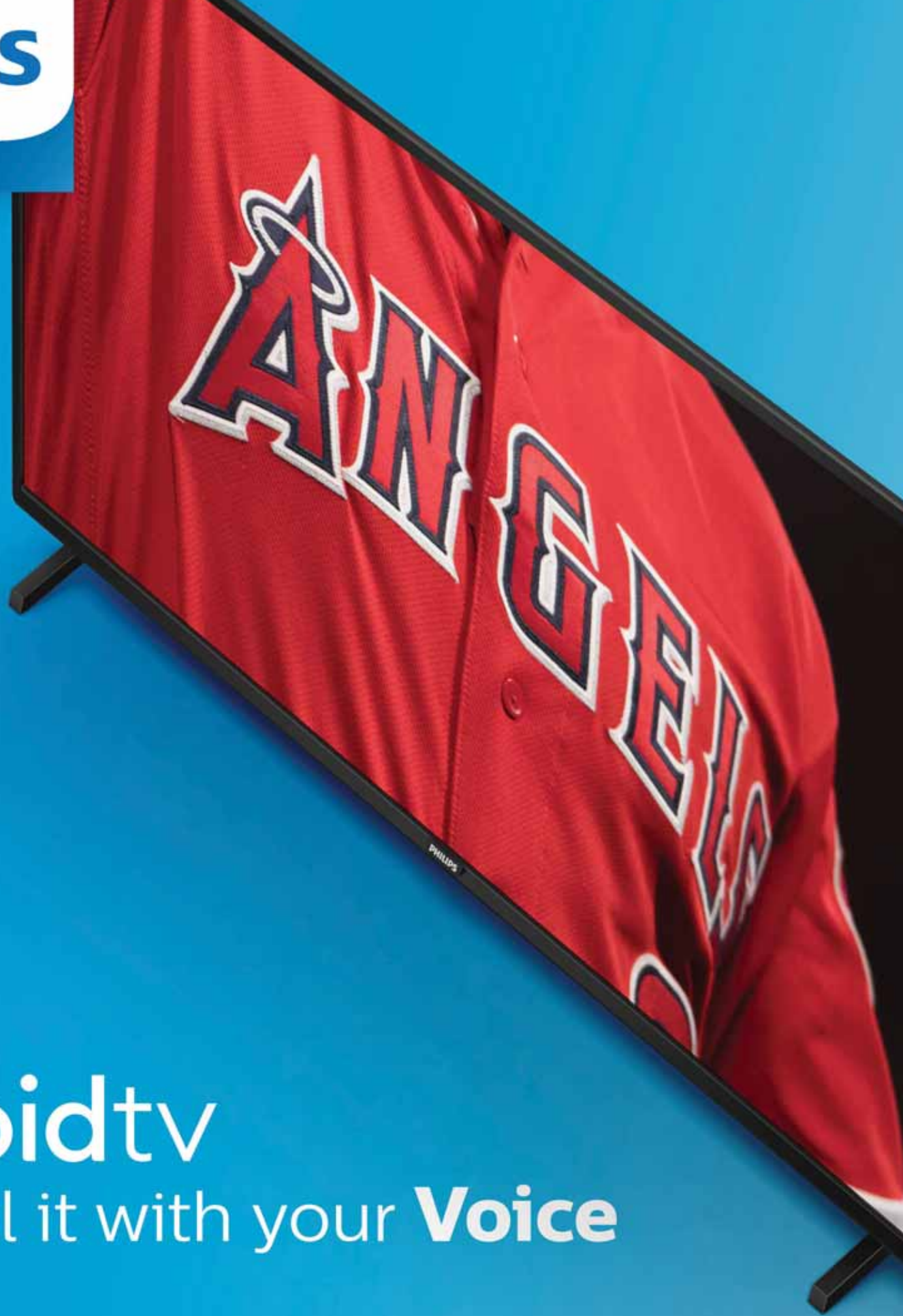

WELCOME, **ANTHONY RENDON**



In October, Anthony Rendon was lifting the World Series trophy. In December, he was wearing an Angels jersey.

How quickly things can change.

The Angels made one of the biggest moves of the offseason when they agreed to terms with third baseman Anthony Rendon on a seven-year contract. The deal came together quickly; just weeks after he won a title with the Nationals and just a few months removed from a season in which he was named to his first All-Star team in addition to earning his second Silver Slugger Award.

The decision to jet west, Rendon said, was made very quickly after the Angels approached him.

"The fact that Arte and Carole were adamant about reaching out to [agent] Scott Boras and saying that they really wanted me to be a part of the Angel organization means so much to me and my family," said Rendon upon being introduced to the media at Angel Stadium.

“To have that respect, to feel wanted and to want someone to come and be part of your family. That was the one important thing we always talked about when trying to look for an organization we wanted to head to or stay at was a family atmosphere. Somewhere we can plant our roots, build a foundation and just grow our family together.”

At the press event Rendon was flanked by family — specifically his wife Amanda and their young daughter Emma. The couple is expecting their second child soon.

It was a special moment to culminate an incredible 2019.

For the 2019 season, Rendon led the National League in RBI (126), tied for first in doubles (44), ranked second in OBP (.412) and was third in batting average (.319), slugging (.598) and OPS (1.010). Additionally, he was named as the third baseman for the 2019 All-MLB First Team.

Rendon has always been a known commodity in baseball-circles. But his red-hot October certainly opened a lot of eyes nationwide.

“I was watching a lot of baseball last October and knowing in the back of my mind that the Angels do need pitching, I was watching Rendon in particular very closely, along with Juan Soto, and those guys really stood out to me,” said Mark Langston. “The at-bats he was able to produce in those high leverage, high pressure situations were impressive. You sort of see his pulse rate. You see

how he slows the game down. That is what the best of the best can do. It was fun to watch then and it is really going to be fun to watch with the Angels now.”

Rendon is not a shy guy but he is also not necessarily someone who seeks a great deal of attention despite playing the game with considerable joy. A native of Houston, Rendon is a product of Rice University who was drafted by the Nats in the first round (sixth overall) in 2011.

In our nation’s capital, his career took off.

“I was in contact with Tony and I have so much respect for that guy and for that family and everything he represents,” said Washington right-hander Stephen Strasburg. “I just wanted him to be in a situation that was best for him and his family. I’m happy for him. Some guys might think that there’s a better solution out there and that’s respectable. He’s earned that right.”

Strasburg knows Rendon’s accomplishments well. Rendon is a career .290 hitter with 245 doubles, 136 home runs and 546 RBI across his seven Major League seasons, all with the Nationals. Since 2016, he ranks second in the National League (fourth in the Majors) in Wins Above Replacement (24.2), according to *FanGraphs*, and he also places among N.L. leaders in doubles (1st; 167), RBI (3rd; 403), OPS (6th; .910), slugging (7th; .524) and OBP (8th; .384).

He is also as good at third base as he is at the plate. In that span since 2016, Rendon rates second among all Major League third basemen (led N.L.) in *Fangraphs’* Defense metric (34.2). Three times he has led the senior circuit in fielding percentage at the hot corner.

Said Langston: “As a left-handed pitcher I know how hard the left side of the infield has to work and with the addition of Rendon it got increasingly better. David Fletcher has been very, very good at third with Andrelton Simmons, and in Rendon you are talking about a Gold Glove guy. I love defense and that area of the team is as improved as you can get.”

Though he is new to the Angels roster and the American League, it certainly is not lost on Rendon who his new teammates are, even if some of it is uncharted territory for the 29-year old.

“Looking at the roster, when and where guys were born, I am suddenly feeling like one of the older guys,” Rendon admitted. “With the Nationals I was always one of the youngsters guys because we were such a veteran team. I bring experience to this ballclub



and I can express knowledge and wisdom when these guys do have questions. I am here to help in any way possible.”

On Mike Trout, Rendon said: “Everyone knows what Mike Trout does on a baseball field. I am not sure I can teach him anything there. But I am looking forward to developing a friendship.”

On Simmons, Rendon said: “He has been amazing and he has stolen a lot of hits from me when he was with Atlanta. I have always been amazed at how good his glove has been and then when you see the bat come around like it has the past few seasons, I am excited to be next to him and to be on the same squad.”

And on Joe Maddon, Rendon said: “I feel like his is a millennial trapped in the wrong body. He is eccentric. He is out there and he is out-spoken. He fights for his team.”

That fight now in Southern California is for postseason baseball. A veteran of four postseasons, Rendon appeared in 17 games during the 2019 playoffs, batting .328 with seven doubles, three home runs, 11 walks and 15 RBI en route to leading the Nationals to their first World Series championship.

The Angels have not made the playoffs since 2014 and last hoisted a World Series Trophy in 2002.

As Anthony Rendon can tell you, however, a lot can change very quickly.

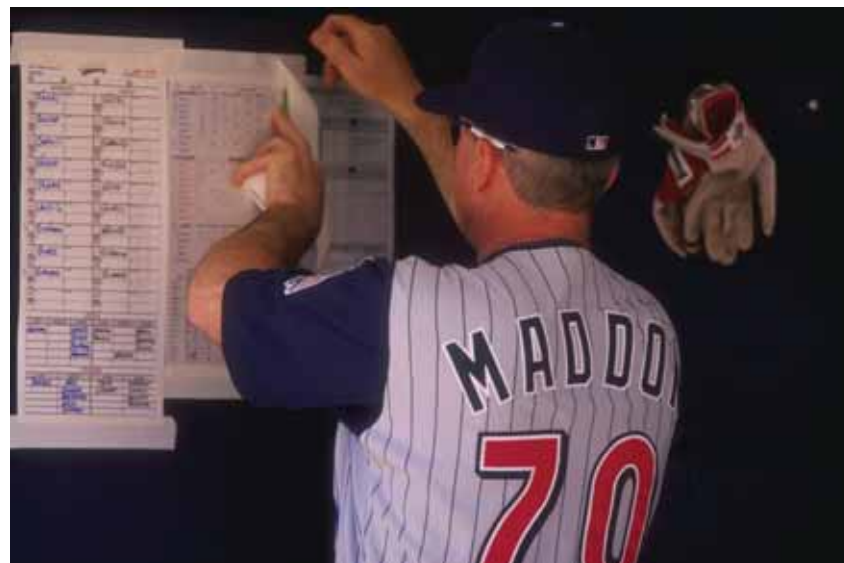


After spending the first 30 seasons of his professional baseball career as a member of the Angels organization, Joe Maddon — a three-time Manager of the Year and World Series winner with the Cubs — has returned to the franchise as the club's new manager.

Maddon departed the Halos prior to the 2006 season to manage Tampa Bay. Since, he has amassed a 1,252-1,068 (.540) managerial record with eight postseason berths, two pennants (2008 and 2016) and one World Series title (2016). His three Manager of the Year awards were earned with Tampa Bay in 2008 and 2011, and in 2015 with the Cubs where he made history when he helped lead the North Siders to a World Series win for the first time since 1908.

Maddon initially signed with the Angels as a free agent catcher and he went on to play parts of four seasons (1976-79) in the minor league system before moving to a scouting role. From 1981-86, he managed at three different levels of the Halos farm system and then transitioned to the franchise's roving hitting instructor from 1987-93.

Maddon's first stint on a big-league coaching staff came in 1994. After starting the year as the Club's player development manager, he was named the Angels' bullpen coach in May. Maddon was then elevated to first base coach on manager Marcel Lachemann's staff in 1995. He would serve as bench coach for most of the final 10 years (1996-05) of his Angels career, including six seasons (2000-05) under Mike Scioscia.



Additionally, Maddon made two different stints as interim manager for the Halos in 1996 and 1999, and the highlight of his time in an Angel uniform came in 2002 when he was part of the coaching staff that won the first World Series title in team history.

Maddon spent the last five years (2015-19) at the helm of the Cubs. He compiled a 471-339 (.581) record with four postseason appearances (2015-18), culminating with that historic World Series championship in 2016. Maddon became the first manager in Cubs history to lead the club to four straight postseason appearances and his 471 wins rank fifth in club annals.

Prior to his time in Chicago, Maddon was tabbed as the fourth manager in Rays history. Under Maddon's nine-year tutelage, the Rays went 754-705 (.517) and made four different trips to the playoffs. In 2008, Maddon led the franchise to their first postseason appearance and guided the Rays to a World Series appearance against the Phillies.

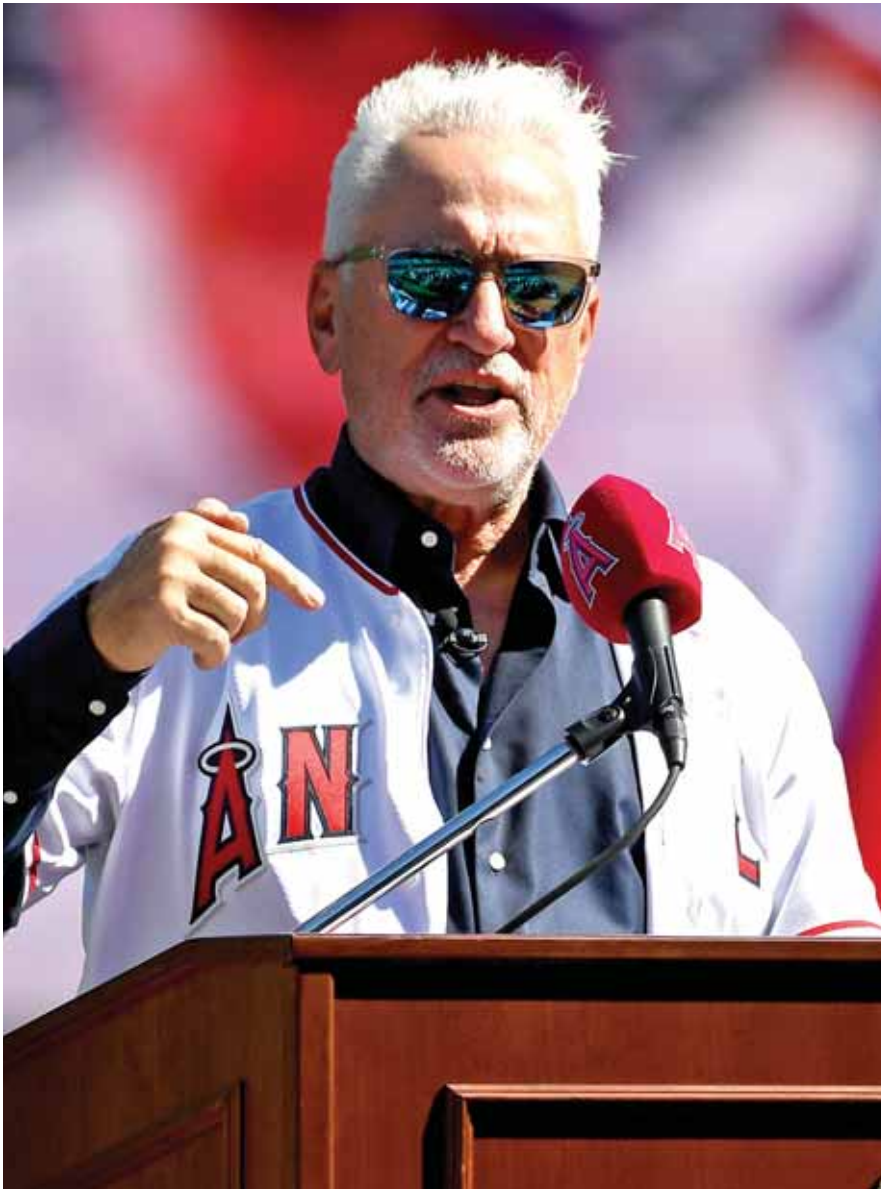

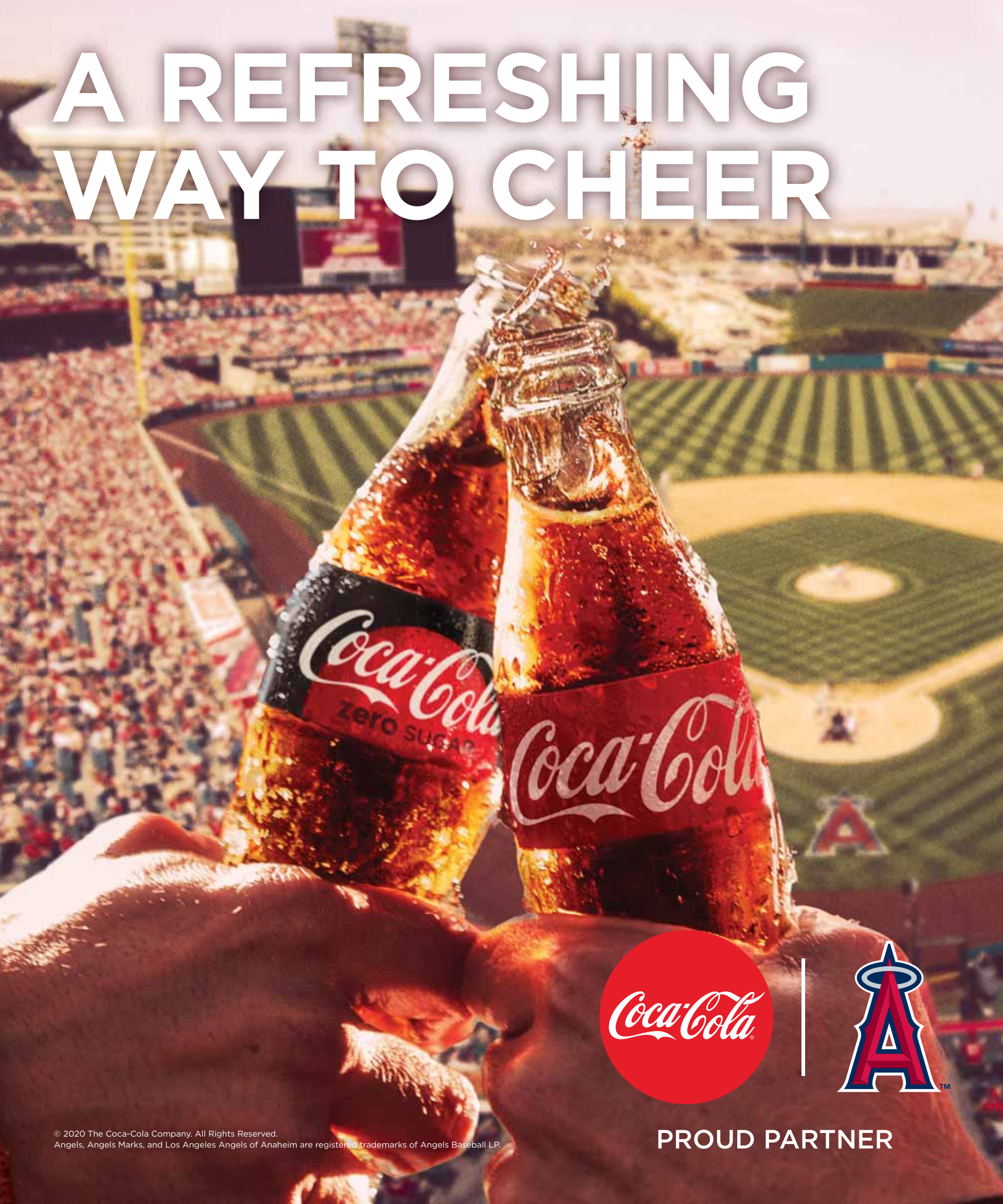

OWNERSHIP

In May of 2003, Arte and Carole Moreno were introduced as the third owners in Angels' franchise history and their impact was immediate. The Morenos have guided the franchise to six A.L. West Division titles and 17 consecutive seasons drawing over three million fans, resulting in a total home attendance of over 52 million fans. In July of 2018, Arte received the distinct honor of being elected to the Board of Directors for the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum in Cooperstown, NY.

The Moreno's focus is balanced between baseball, business operations and fan experience. In 2009, the Halos were voted the top franchise in professional sports in "Fan Value and Experience" in a fan poll by *ESPN the Magazine*. In the poll, the Angels ranked in the top three among Major League teams for 10 consecutive seasons (2003-2012).

During their tenure, Arte and Carole's support of the baseball operations department has resulted in the acquisition of many key players, including three-time N.L. MVP Albert Pujols, perennial MVP candidate Anthony Rendon, nine-time Gold Glover Torii Hunter, 2009 World Series MVP Hideki Matsui, 2005 A.L. Cy Young Award winner Bartolo Colon, Hall of Famer Vladimir Guerrero, four-time Gold Glove winner Andrelton Simmons and several others. In 2019, the Morenos signed three-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout to a 12-year contract extension, and most lucrative in North American sports history. The contract will effectively keep the eight-time All-Star a member of the Halos for the remainder of his career. Additionally, in December of 2017, the Moreno's oversaw the successful recruitment of two-way player Shohei Ohtani, the offseason's most highly sought after free agent.

Since purchasing the Club on May 22, 2003, the Angels have logged a 1,444-1,266 record (.533 winning pct.) while boasting a Top 10 payroll in 15 of their 18 seasons, including six campaigns in the Top 5. During the family's tenure, the organization has continued to cultivate players from its farm system. Their dedication has paid dividends in the development of significant current players such as Trout, David Fletcher, Griffin Canning, Justin Anderson, Keynan Middleton, Cam Bedrosian and Jaime Barria.

Over the past 17 years, Carole and Arte have strengthened the Club's commitment to local communities and beyond. In 2004, the Morenos established the Angels Baseball Foundation concentrating on investments in education, health care, arts & sciences and community-related youth programs to experience the positive attributes of baseball. The Foundation distributes annual grants to various youth programs within Southern California. The Angels



Scholars program works with the Orange County Office of Education and the college preparatory AVID program to award several annual college scholarships. Since purchasing the Club in 2003, the Moreno's, Angels and Angels Baseball Foundation have contributed over \$20 million dollars to various charitable efforts with a primary focus in the Orange County area.

In 2010, the Angels were privileged to host their third All-Star Game (also 1967 & 1989). In conjunction with MLB's All-Star Legacy Fund, the foundation funded renovation of softball fields at Anaheim's Pioneer Park (into the MLB Angels All-Star Complex) as well as the special-surfaced field for the Miracle League of Orange County for disabled youth. The Foundation regularly donates tickets, memorabilia and ballpark experiences to the various groups and fundraisers.

In addition to their responsibilities with the Angels and various committees within MLB, the Morenos were part of ownership of the former Single-A Salt Lake Trappers of the Pioneer League. Under their leadership, the Trappers won three championships. Arte and Carole were also original investors in the Arizona Diamondbacks (including their 2001 World Series championship) and in a partnered ownership of the NBA's Phoenix Suns.

The Moreno family is also active in their own philanthropic efforts. In 1997, they established the Moreno Family Foundation to support nonprofit organizations focusing on youth and education as well as investing in educational scholarships in K-8, high school and college. Their favorite charities include St. Vincent de Paul, St. Mary's Food Bank, the Barrow Neurological Institute, Boys & Girls Clubs, UMOM Homeless Shelters, American Heart Association and Fresh Start Women's Foundation. The Morenos were previously members of the Little League Foundation's Board of Trustees, which assists Little Leagues in every state and more than 70 other countries. For her continued philanthropic efforts, Carole Moreno was honored by the Girl Scouts of Orange County as their 2019 G.I.R.L. (Go-Getter, Innovator, Risk-Taker, Leader) honoree.

Carole was born in Reno, NV, and moved often as the daughter of a career Air Force man. She spent much of her youth in Fredonia, KS, and went on to earn a degree in journalism from the University of Kansas. Arte is a native of Tucson, AZ, and served his country in Vietnam as a member of the U.S. Army. After his tour of duty, he attended the University of Arizona, graduating with a degree in marketing. In 2005, *Time Magazine* selected Moreno as one of the '25 Most Influential Hispanics in America.' Arte and Carole are the parents of three children.

CHAIRMAN



Dennis Kuhl begins his 17th season with the Angels after joining the Club on November 10, 2003. He was initially appointed as the Angels' seventh President before a promotion to Chairman on November 14, 2009. Kuhl's focus centers on renewed efforts in the area of civic affairs and community outreach. Kuhl also oversees the Angels' flagship radio station KLAA AM830 and was recently named the President of the Angels Baseball Foundation.

Under his leadership, the Angels have shown tremendous growth and advancement in key business initiatives, including sponsorship and marketing revenues, as well as nationwide expansion and promotion of the Angels' brand. Kuhl also played a key role in working with Major League Baseball in hosting of the 2010 All-Star Game.

Kuhl is actively involved in several Southern California charities. He serves as president of the "Light the Night" event which supports the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society and is a founding board member of The Pacific Club IMPACT Foundation/Lott Trophy. Kuhl works with Susan G. Komen for the Cure serving as one of the "Pink Tie Guys," a select group of advocates speaking out to find a cure for breast cancer. Additionally, he

serves on the advisory boards for the South County Outreach, Anaheim YMCA, Rivals For The Cure, Irvine Public School Foundation and the Angels Baseball Foundation Board of Directors.

A champion of community involvement, Kuhl's efforts span across Orange County and beyond. He is a member of the Board of Governors at Chapman University and on the board of directors for several nonprofits: The Children's Education Foundation of Orange County, the Los Angeles Sports Council, Boys and Girls Club of Anaheim, The Tiger Woods Foundation, the Noble Vikings Charity of Orange County, the Literacy Project Foundation and the Alzheimer's Association of Orange County & Newport Beach.

In 2014, Kuhl served as a co-chairperson for the United Cerebral Palsy Golf Classic and a co-chairperson for the annual Red, White & Greens Golf Tournament to benefit the Susan G. Komen Foundation.

A Boonton, N.J. native, Kuhl graduated from the University of Arizona in 1970 with a degree in business administration. In honor of his late father, he established the Bud Kuhl Wood Bat Invitational in 2007 with annual proceeds donated to local charities. Kuhl also initiated scholarships in his father's name to the Eller School of Management at the University of Arizona. In 2009, he was named the 'Business Man of the Year' by the Anaheim Chamber of Commerce. Kuhl currently resides in Newport Beach.

JOHN CARPINO

PRESIDENT



John Carpino was named the eighth president in Angels' history November 14, 2009. He oversees all areas of business, sales, marketing, finance and communications. Carpino's top priority is fan value and experience in all areas of the game including concessions, merchandise, promotions and ticketing. As the principal executive in charge of business operations, he has helped welcome over three million fans through Angel Stadium turnstiles for 17 straight seasons. He was also an integral part of the Angel Stadium hosting the 2010 MLB All-Star Game, a key member in the Club's negotiations to keep the Angels in the City of Anaheim through and oversaw the negotiations for the extension of the Club's television agreement with FOX Sports West. *ESPN The Magazine* rated the Angels as the #1 MLB franchise in nine of Carpino's first 11 years with the organization.

The Chicago native continues to create value for fans, focusing not only on the game inside the lines, but on the entire ballpark experience. He has guided the Angel brand with a focus on affordable pricing while providing a quality family environment, including continual stadium improvements and enhancements. Under his leadership, Carpino's staff has established Angel Stadium as one of the premiere destinations in California for non-baseball events such as concerts, Supercross, Monster Truck and corporate events.

As one of the initial executives appointed by Owner Arte Moreno after purchasing the Club, the 2020 season marks Carpino's 17th with the team, having previously held the post of senior vice president. Carpino has led the Angels to unprecedented financial growth in sponsorship, marketing and ticketing. He oversaw the general manager selection processes in 2011 & 2015, assisted in the acquisition of high-profile players such as Albert

Pujols, Anthony Rendon, Andrelton Simmons and Shohei Ohtani as well as the historic 12-year contract extension for 3-time MVP Mike Trout.

He has created a stronger, more viable partnership with Los Angeles-based radio and television partners, and oversees KLAA AM830, the radio flagship of the Angels. His vision and creativity have brought an emphasis on the Angels' heritage with a reintroduction of the Club's Hall of Fame with yearly inductees, hosting of fan events and celebration of team history. Popular giveaways have included several world record-breaking items and those showcasing the popularity of the Rally Monkey. His efforts continue to create a brand that connects socially and in sync with current cultural trends.

Carpino's promotion followed six seasons as the Angels Senior Vice President of Sales and Marketing during which he oversaw all aspects of marketing, promotions and ticket sales. He began his professional career in 1982 in the billboard industry, including stints in Tucson, Chicago, Phoenix and Los Angeles. In 1985, he joined Moreno at Outdoor Systems, a billboard company (which later became Viacom Outdoor in 2000 and CBS Outdoor in 2005) and spent 18 years in the Phoenix and Los Angeles markets. Carpino oversaw \$200 million in sales for the western region.

Carpino is a 1982 graduate of the University of Arizona with a degree in business administration. He has served on CHOC Children's Foundation Board of Directors as well as the Executive Board for the Orange County United Way. In 2017, he was inducted into the National Italian American Sports Hall of Fame.

He and wife Elizabeth are involved in numerous charitable efforts throughout Southern California and support the Angels Baseball Foundation. John and Elizabeth have three children and reside in Laguna Beach.

GENERAL MANAGER



Billy Eppler enters his fifth campaign in 2020 as the Angels General Manager. He was named the 12th GM in team history on October 4, 2015, agreeing to a four-year contract through 2019. Eppler oversees all aspects of the Club's baseball operations and reports to Owner Arte Moreno.

Eppler, 44, is a native of San Diego, CA. He graduated from the University of Connecticut with a finance degree in 1998 and began his sports career as an intern in the Washington Redskins Scouting Department. He started his baseball career with the Colorado Rockies organization, where he was hired in January, 2000 as an area scouting supervisor for Southern California. He would eventually join the front office in 2003 as the Assistant Director of Pro Scouting & Player Development (2003-2004).

From 2004 thru 2015, Eppler worked his way up the New York Yankees

Baseball Operations Department. He was initially hired as the Assistant Director of Baseball Operations on November 1, 2004. Eppler would eventually be promoted to Director of Professional Scouting (2006-09) and again as the Senior Director of Professional Personnel (2010-11). He finished his fourth season as Yankees Assistant General Manager and first as Vice President in 2015. While assisting General Manager Brian Cashman, his responsibilities included player acquisitions, roster composition & management, staffing & personnel and player contract negotiations. In addition, he oversaw all phases and personnel in the Yankees' Major League and Professional Scouting Departments both domestically and internationally.

Eppler and wife, Catherine, have two sons and reside in south Orange County.

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER



Steve Martone (mar-TONE), 39, came to the Angels in 2016 following nine years in baseball operations with the New York Yankees, including the 2009 World Championship campaign. From 2014-15, he served as Yankees Manager of Professional Scouting.

Originally hired by New York in April of 2006 as a baseball operations intern, Martone was promoted to Assistant of Baseball Operations in

December that same year. In that capacity, he focused on player tracking & data collection, research for arbitration & grievances as well as technology initiatives. In March of 2014, Martone was promoted to Manager, Professional Scouting where he dealt with 40-man roster composition, departmental budget, MLB depth charts and targeting of players.

The Houston, TX native graduated from the University of Houston in 2005. Martone and wife, Laura, have three children.

Jonathan Strangio, 31, enters his ninth year with the Angels in 2020, fifth as Assistant General Manager. Following the 2014 season, Strangio moved up to Manager, Major League Operations where his responsibilities included 40-man roster construction, rules and CBA compliance, baseball analytics, salary arbitration, and contract negotiation. He joined the Club

as a baseball operations intern in 2012 before a promotion to Coordinator, Baseball Operations after the 2012 campaign.

Dana Wells joined the Angels in late 2019 as Executive Vice President, a role which focuses on all aspects of the Club's business efforts including, business development, tickets sales and special projects.

Wells brings with him a successful track record of over 27 years of sales experience in the outdoor billboard industry. Starting in 1992 as an Account Executive with Outdoor System, he quickly grew through the ranks making stops as the Sales Manager and General Manager of the Kentucky, Florida and New York markets. Following an impressive tenure in New York, he was promoted to National Sales Director in which he managed not only the company's national sales efforts but the day-to-day business operations of the New York market.

Molly Jolly became the highest ranking woman in the Angels organization in just her third year with the team (2003) and remains an integral part of the primary operations of the Club. She is in her 20th season with the Angels as Senior Vice President, Finance & Administration. Molly spent three years (2001-03) as Director of Finance for the Angels and Anaheim Ducks before her current appointment.

A native of Naples, Florida, Molly oversees all financial matters, including strategic initiatives, reporting and planning, budgeting, accounting and payroll. She is also responsible for office administration, including legal and risk management, human resources and information services. 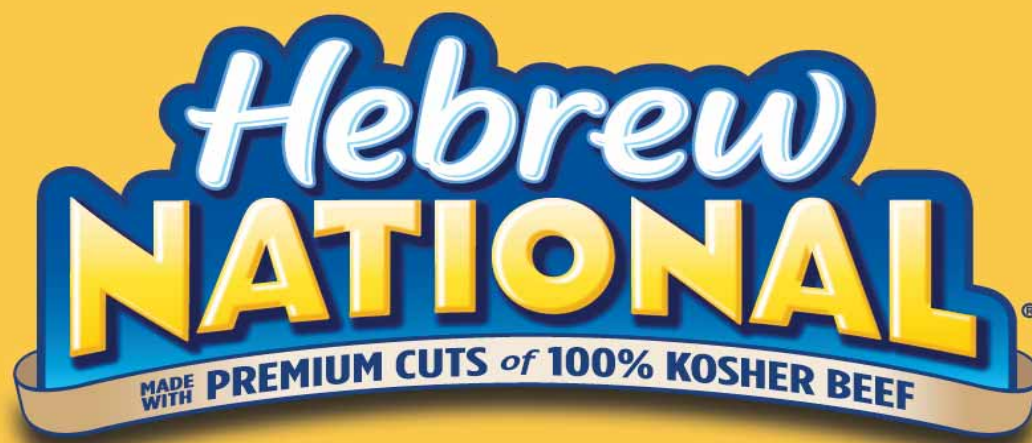

Other than experience.

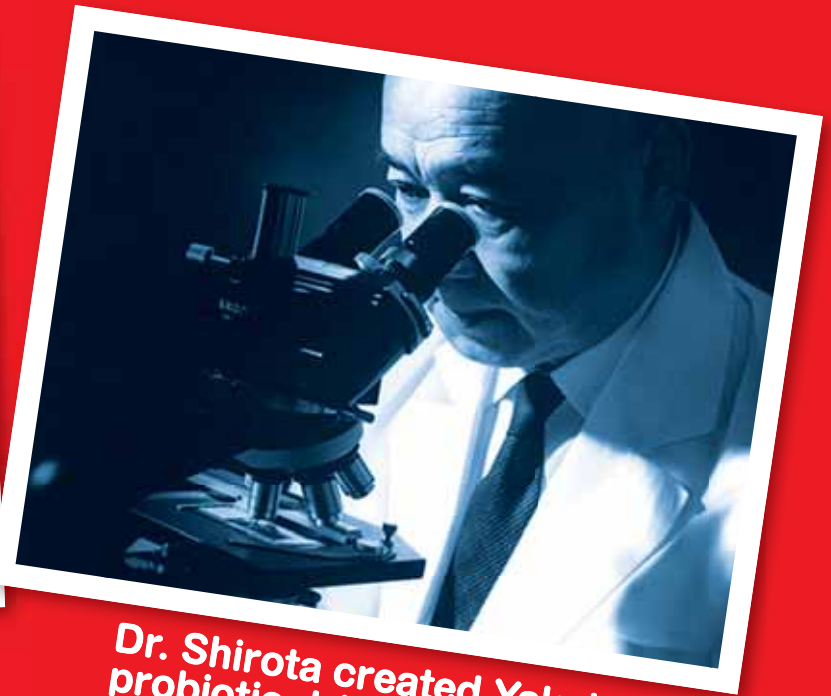

DUAL THREAT

Shohei Ohtani played in 106 games with the Angels last season. He hit .286 with 18 home runs and 62 runs batted in. He led the team in triples and stolen bases. He hit for the cycle.

And, yet, heading into 2020 Ohtani is a viable candidate for ... American League Comeback Player of the Year?

Yes and no. After all, Ohtani last season did not throw a single pitch due to injury. That changes in 2020.

The famed two-way player who burst upon the big-league scene in 2018 from Japan to earn A.L. Rookie of the Year honors with the Halos is set to return to his unique dual role now that he is physically fit. Ohtani, who underwent successful Tommy John surgery in early October 2018, had been "limited" to hitting only ever since.

Of course, most players with that type of injury do not produce a 2.5 WAR during that time.

Of course, Ohtani is not most players.

With Ohtani expected to pitch a full season, the Angels plan to implement a six-man rotation again this season to limit Ohtani's workload. In his 10 starts as an Angel in '18 he dazzled, compiling a 3.31 ERA and a 2.86 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

Ohtani will be closely scrutinized this spring as his overall health is the top priority. Also this season a rule change implemented by MLB affects Ohtani. The Angels can send Ohtani on an actual rehab assignment as a pitcher, and then the very next day use him in a big league game as a hitter if the team so chooses. However, the Angels must play shorthanded (with a 25-man roster) on the days Ohtani is out on assignment.

Joe Maddon, in his first season as Angels manager, will be heavily involved in all-things-Ohtani. He sees Ohtani and a green light.

"Don't treat your guys like China dolls," Maddon told reporters over the winter. "They're not. He's gone through some tough moments. He's gone through his rehab, and now it's time to be a baseball player. Sometimes we do go overboard, I think, with the protection of athletes and players and pitchers.

"This guy is special."

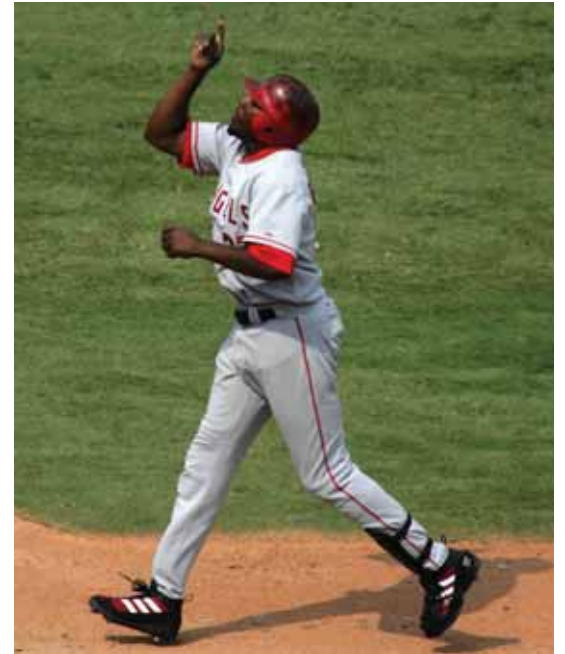

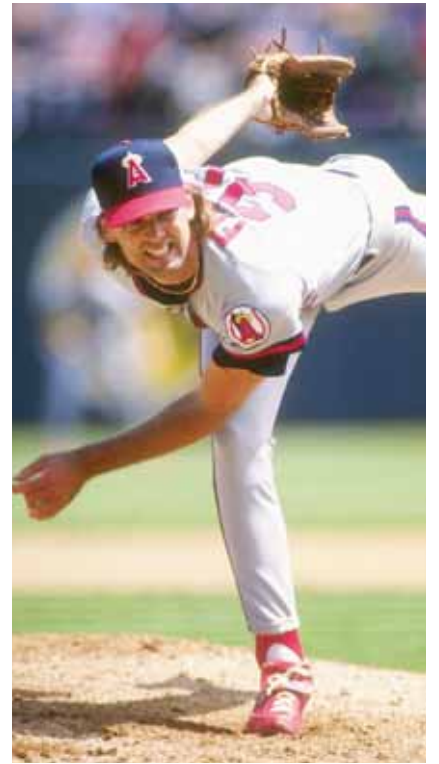

THE BIG A



On December 4, Anaheim Mayor Harry Sidhu and the City of Anaheim announced a proposed agreement to keep the Angels in Anaheim until at least 2050. As part of the proposal, SRB Management, LLC, of which Angels owner Arte Moreno is a partner, would purchase the 153-acre land that includes Angel Stadium of Anaheim and the surrounding stadium land from the City.

“We appreciate the Mayor’s leadership in working to keep the Angels here in Anaheim, which has been our home for over 50 years,” Moreno said then in a club statement. “Today is the first step in enabling us to invest in our future by building a winning team and delivering a high-quality fan experience.”

On December 20, the Anaheim City Council voted to sell Angel Stadium and the surrounding parking lots to SRB Management.

The 2020 season represents the Angels 55th season playing in Anaheim following the team’s move to Angel Stadium prior

to the 1966 campaign. Since opening its doors on April 9, 1966, Angel Stadium has seen more than 122 million fans come through its gates including a current stretch of 17 straight seasons of three million fans.

In that span, the ballpark affectionately known as the “Big A” has played host to some of the franchise’s most memorable events including seven Western Division clinching games (1979, 1982, 1986, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2014), three All-Star Games (1967, 1989, and 2010) and the 2002 World Series, including the Angels’ Game 7 victory over the San Francisco Giants to clinch the franchise’s first World Championship.

The ballpark has also been home to some of Anaheim’s more memorable special events including concerts by U2, the Beach Boys, the Rolling Stones, the Grateful Dead, Pink Floyd and Aerosmith as well as Supercross, Monster Truck and other corporate events.
