Product Description: Pressbooks is a free and open source book content management system that allows users to publish books to the public web and produce exports in multiple formats, including EPUB and PDF. Pressbooks is built on top of WordPress Multisite but makes significant changes to the admin interface, web presentation layer and export routines of a standard WordPress installation. Pressbooks is typically installed with a suite of complementary plugins and themes which extend the tool's default publishing capabilities.

Evaluation Methods Used: Testing was conducted by the Inclusive Design Research Centre at OCAD University and Pressbooks staff. Testing was done on the following browsers: Firefox 105, Safari 16, and Chrome 109. Tools used for testing include: NVDA 2022.4 screen reader, VoiceOver screen reader, WebAIM Wave Toolbar, Nu HTML checker, ARC Toolkit, TPG Color Contrast Analyzer.

1.4.2 Audio Control (Level A)	Not Applicable	No automatically playing audio observed on the site.
2.1.1 Keyboard (Level A)	Supports	All Pressbooks administration menus can be fully navigated by keyboard.
2.1.2 No Keyboard Trap (Level A)	Inconclusive	A keyboard trap for Windows/Linux users was observed on the Custom Styles page. Users can move into the Theme Web Styles input box using the TAB key. On a Mac `Option+TAB` can be used to move out of the Theme Web Styles or return to other page controls, but no PC equivalent has been discovered. This issue appears to come from WordPress' implementation of the CodeMirror editor and is being further investigated.
