It Shall Be Resolved

Conduct and incorporate a full life cycle assessment of all air pollution and greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions for all LCFS pathways

Eliminate credit generation for emissions reductions attributable to livestock methane that otherwise would have occurred or were legally or contractually required to occur.

Eliminate avoided methane crediting.

Immediately initiate formal rulemaking for the regulation of livestock methane pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 39730.7(b).



Avoided Methane Crediting Must be Avoided

Avoided methane crediting for livestock gas does not belong in a program that is supposed to be decarbonizing our transportation sector

Avoided methane crediting is actually keeping us from reaching our methane reduction targets (SB 1383 (2016); Health and Safety Code Section 39730.7)

Avoided methane crediting has little to do with science, and much to do with the state's decision not to implement an effective, fair and reasonable regulatory framework for livestock methane
