Monetizing Instagram: The E-commerce Experience of Young Colombian Women in the Context of Labor Precarization

Presenter: Alexandra Choconta, PhD Candidate, University of Minnesota Join Alexandra Choconta as she delves into the fascinating world of Instagram entrepreneurship among young Colombian women. In her presentation, she analyzes the accounts of 12 women across three major cities, revealing how they use the platform to generate income and foster social networks. Through her in-depth research, Alexandra highlights the often-overlooked aspects of labor—specifically, the caring and affective work that goes unrecognized and uncompensated. She argues that while these women face challenges due to their precarious economic circumstances, third parties significantly benefit from their contributions within a gendered and youth-driven economy.

Presentation: Therapeutic attention in clinical psychology and sexual psychoeducation with deaf population, an experience in Bogotá Colombia.

The presentation titled "Therapeutic Attention in Clinical Psychology and Sexual Psychoeducation with the Deaf Population: An Experience in Bogotá, Colombia," delivered by Professor Cindi Fabiana Cordero from Universidad Iberoamericana, focuses on addressing the unique mental health needs of the deaf community. Emphasizing the critical role of clinical psychology in enhancing quality of life through evidence-based assessment and intervention strategies, the presentation outlines persistent global mental health challenges exacerbated by sociocultural variables and communication barriers faced by minoritized groups, particularly the deaf. With a commitment to diversity and inclusion, the research aims to develop tailored guidelines for psychological care and effective use of sign language interpreters while also exploring sexual psychoeducation's significance within this population. Ultimately, the presentation advocates for a collaborative and adaptive approach to mental health services that encompasses the deaf community's specific needs without exclusion.
