

Severe Methyl Mercury Poisoning Linked to Adulterated Mexican Face Cream

A Sacramento-area woman has been hospitalized in a semi-comatose state after using a Mexican Pond's cream that contained methyl mercury. The mercury was <u>not</u> added by Pond's but by a third party. She purchased the cream through informal networks in Sacramento to remove blemishes and wrinkles.

This is the first time this extremely dangerous form of mercury was found in a face cream in the United States. There have been over 60 California poisonings linked to foreign brand, unlabeled, and/or artisanal skin creams in the last decade that contained the less toxic form of mercury, mercurous chloride or calomel. Calomel can still cause severe illness in adults and children, but is not as profoundly dangerous as methyl mercury.

If your patients use skin creams from Mexico, urge them to:

- If the cream was <u>not</u> purchased from a major retailer, stop using it immediately
- Place the creams in a closed sealable bag

<u>Mercury poisoning signs and symptoms can be non-specific</u>, but may include those in the table below. If patients are using a suspect cream, CDPH recommends conducting a total mercury analysis in blood and urine.

General Signs and Symptoms Children with prolonged exposure Pink hands and feet, flaking skin Difficulty concentrating, memory loss Nervousness, irritability, anxiety Excessive saliva or thirst, gum • Depression, insomnia disease (gingivitis) Irritability, poor appetite Headaches, Hypertension Poor muscle tone, leg cramps Weight loss, fatigue • Shaking, tremors, paresthesias, ataxia High blood pressure Numbness or tingling in hands, feet, lips Rash
