DCIS is authorized to operate the Body Worn Camera (BWC) Pilot under H.R. 1163 (IH), Federal Police Camera and Accountability Act. DCIS will use BWCs to collect audio and video recordings of interactions between DCIS agents and the public under the conditions of, and in accordance with DCIS Instruction 37, Body Worn Cameras.  DCIS agents in the BWC Pilot offices will be required to activate the BWCs when engaging in certain DCIS enforcement activities, excluding covert or undercover activities. The information is stored in MPEG-4 format media file. The footage is uploaded in whole, daily to Evidence.com, where it is maintained under the custody of DCIS.

BWCs are capable of capturing primary evidence in a manner that portrays a compelling and indisputable account of an incident. The information from the BWC is primarily used to support case investigations in accordance with DCIS's law enforcement mission. BWCs capture audio and video recordings of an agent's interactions with a subject and the surrounding environment.
