TOP FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- 1. e-Manifest begins nationwide June 30, 2018.
- 2. e-Manifest is <u>available</u> for testing now.
- 3. All facilities that receive manifested wastes ["receiving facilities"] (federal or state-only hazardous waste or PCBs) must submit those manifests to EPA either in paper or electronically. Receiving facilities will pay a fee for each manifest, based on the way it was submitted.

TOP FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- 4. Handlers must <u>register</u> for e-Manifest to submit/sign electronically and to make corrections. Handlers include generators, transporters, and others handling hazardous waste listed on the manifest.
- 5. e-Manifest <u>data</u> will be available to the public 90 days after the manifest is entered into the system (no pre-June 30 data).





E-MANIFEST - PURPOSE & BENEFITS 6/7/2018 6

PURPOSES OF E-MANIFEST

- > Modernize the system and make it more accurate and efficient
- Establish and host a nationally consistent electronic manifest system
- Establish a national, one-stop hub for collecting and distributing manifests
- > Establish a national data repository for waste shipment data
- > Provide the public with appropriate access to program data

EXPECTED BENEFITS OF E-MANIFEST


- Cost savings and paperwork burden reductions
- > Accurate, more timely information on waste shipments
- > Enhanced "cradle-to-grave" tracking of hazardous waste
- > A self-sustaining system funded by fees, not taxpayers
- > A potential reduction of biennial reporting




E-MANIFEST ACT SIGNED INTO LAW 10/5/2012

e-Manifest

Note: These benefits are derived from the collaborative development EPA utilized with the regulated community and states and through extensive user testing over the last several months.













E-MANIFEST ACT SIGNED INTO LAW 10/5/2012

- > Establish national IT system funded with user fees
- Scope: All federal or state regulated wastes subject to manifest
- > Users may *elect* to use electronic *or* paper manifests
- > EPA may set reasonable fees to recover costs
- ➤ Nationwide effective date [June 30]
- Establish an e-Manifest Advisory Board (meets at least annually)

SCOPE OF E-MANIFEST

e-Manifest

Covers all wastes shipped on a manifest

- Federal RCRA hazardous waste
- Regulated PCB waste shipped on a manifest
- "State-only regulated" hazardous waste (if manifest required by state)
- > Imports of hazardous waste shipped to U.S. facilities
- Non-hazardous waste shipped on a manifest

SCOPE OF E-MANIFEST

e-Manifest

Current focus of program is on highway transport

Exceptions:

- > HW exports not included in e-Manifest at this time.
- Non-manifest documents (e.g., LDR notices) not included at this time.

USER FEE FINAL RULE – ISSUED JANUARY 3, 2018 (83 FR 420) e-Manifest

Receiving facilities ...

- 1. ... responsible for fees when they submit manifests
- 2. ... submit manifests to EPA within 30 days of waste receipts
- 3. ... will be invoiced monthly and make payments to <u>Pay.gov</u>

Fee formula allocates system costs by submission type. Fees will be revised at two-year intervals (but no <u>Federal Register</u>).

KEY DECISIONS IN USER FEE FINAL RULE

e-Manifest

Corrections to data records can be made at anytime by named parties (i.e., GEN, TRN, TSDF) on the manifest that are registered in the system

- > Open corrections process conducted by electronic submissions
- Waste handlers and states may participate

Receiving facilities may not mail paper forms to EPA after 30 Jun 2021

KEY DECISIONS IN USER FEE FINAL RULE

e-Manifest

Public module will not disclose certain chemical security info

Financial penalties and RCRA civil enforcement sanctions for non-payment of fees

Exclusively federal (no state actions)

e-Manifest

Purpose:

Provide independent advice to the Agency on system operations

Required to meet at least annually, with meetings open to the public

e-Manifest

Appointed by the EPA Administrator and must include:

- > EPA Administrator (or designee) as the Advisory Board Chair
- At least two members with expertise in information technology
- At least three members who represent industry users of the manifest
- ➤ At least three members who represent States that process and track manifests



e-Manifest

- > e-Manifest is a module of EPA's RCRAInfo system.
- > RCRAInfo has three industry applications.

E-MANIFEST SYSTEM DEVELOPMENT

e-Manifest

Receiving facilities have a variety of options for manifest submission to EPA (lowest cost first):

- directly in the e-Manifest system,
- hybrid process manifest starts as a paper manifest and then transitions to electronic manifest at the transporter
- > uploading manifest data from an industry system,
- > submitting a PDF copy of a manifest, and
- > mailing in a hard copy manifest.

Uses CROMERR-compliant signature process.

e-Manifest

EPA's RCRAInfo system allows users to register for several permission levels (e.g., Viewer, Preparer, Certifier).

One permission level, newly launched in 2017, is Site Manager.

e-MANIFEST - USER REGISTRATION 20

e-Manifest

A Site Manager can:

- view,
- prepare,
- sign forms (certify), and
- > approve other users in their company for these activities

Registering as a Site Manager through myRCRA ID or Biennial Report gains you automatic access to e-Manifest.



e-MANIFEST - USER REGISTRATION 28

e-Manifest

Facilities without an EPA ID number may need obtain one from their state (Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska) or EPA Region 7 (Iowa). To obtain an EPA ID, complete the Site Identification form (EPA Form 8700-12).

e-Manifest

To participate/work the system – users must register in e-Manifest

- All receiving facilities <u>must</u> register in the e-manifest system before June 30, whether they are paper or electronic submitters.
- Transporters need to register in the e-manifest system to sign manifests electronically in e-Manifest or to make changes or view manifests in the system (before they are available to the public).

e-MANIFEST - USER REGISTRATION

e-Manifest

To participate/work the system – you must register in e-Manifest

- > Generators need to register in the system if they wish to:
 - create and sign electronic manifests; view or correct their manifests
 - Without system registration, generators can not make changes to their manifests nor can they view them until they are available to the public.



RCRAInfo (Pre-Production)

RCRAInfo is EPA's comprehensive information system, providing access to data supporting the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) of 1976 and the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) of 1984. The system enables cradle-to-grave waste tracking of many types of information regarding the regulated universe of RCRA hazardous waste handlers. RCRAInfo characterizes facility status, regulated activities, and compliance histories in addition to capturing detailed data on the generation of hazardous waste from large quantity generators and on waste management practices from treatment, storage, and disposal facilities.


