WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives wish to recognize the national historic importance and legacy of Nance Legins-Costley and William Costley; and

WHEREAS, For Juneteenth this year, Tazewell County will be dedicating a new memorial in Downtown Pekin to honor Nance Legins-Costley and William Costley, a mother and son who were both born into slavery and recognized throughout the world as the first enslaved individuals emancipated by then attorney Abraham Lincoln in 1841; and

WHEREAS, While born into slavery in 1813, Nance Legins-Costley firmly asserted her claim to freedom by age 14, beginning what would be 14 years of legal challenges to her enslaved status; and

WHEREAS, Nance Legins-Costley finally gained freedom for herself and her children, as their legal status was a direct reflection of their mother's, when Abraham Lincoln presented her case before the Illinois Supreme Court in the famous Bailey vs. Cromwell case in 1841; and

WHEREAS, Nance Legins-Costley married Benjamin Costley in 1840; together, they raised five daughters and three sons, living in Pekin for over 50 years; and

WHEREAS, Nance Legins-Costley became the first and only enslaved individual to own property in Pekin in 1849; and

WHEREAS, William Costley, Nance Legins-Costley's oldest son, answered President Abraham Lincoln's call to defend the Union during the American Civil War by volunteering for the Union Army in 1864, joining the famed 29th U.S. Colored Infantry; and

WHEREAS, William Costley's military service included participating in the Siege of Petersburg, where he was injured in battle, and the Appomattox Campaign in Virginia in 1865; and

WHEREAS, William Costley was transferred with the 29th U.S. Colored Infantry to Galveston, Texas, where he assisted General Gordon Granger in enforcing the Emancipation Proclamation, liberating the last stronghold of slavery in the United States on June 19, 1865; and

WHEREAS, This enforcement of the Emancipation Proclamation in Galveston, Texas on June 19, 1865 is celebrated and observed today as the holiday Juneteenth in the State of Illinois and by the federal government; and

WHEREAS, The new memorial to preserve the legacy of Nance Legins-Costley and William Costley's lives was made possible by the efforts of Tazewell County Clerk John C. Ackerman, the City of Pekin, the Pekin Chamber of Commerce, the Pekin Main Street Organization, the Dirksen Congressional Center, the Pekin Library, the Tazewell County Genealogical & Historical Society, the YWCA Coalition for Equality, and Pekin Historian Jared Olar; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize the national historic importance and legacy of Nance Legins-Costley and William Costley; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the citizens of the State of Illinois to celebrate the new memorial honoring Nance Legins-Costley and William Costley in Downtown Pekin and learn more about the impact these fellow citizens of Illinois had on the history of the United States; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to Tazewell County Clerk John C. Ackerman, the City of Pekin, the Pekin Chamber of Commerce, the Pekin Main Street Organization, the Dirksen Congressional Center, the Pekin Library, the Tazewell County Genealogical & Historical Society, the YWCA Coalition for Equality, and Pekin Historian Jared Olar as an expression of our esteem and respect.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 233

WHEREAS, On April 30, 1975, Saigon, the capital of the Republic of Vietnam, popularly known as South Vietnam, was overthrown by the North Vietnamese army, and the Republic of Vietnam was dissolved; and

WHEREAS, Vietnamese and Americans worked together to organize the largest helicopter evacuation in history from the United States Embassy in Saigon, helping over 7,000 people, including 5,500 Vietnamese, leave within 24 hours; and

WHEREAS, Further operations supported by Americans that spring, summer, and autumn helped approximately 125,000 Vietnamese refugees leave their country, and the eventual creation of a refugee program with the assistance of the United Nations helped over 500,000 Vietnamese people immigrate to the United States; and

WHEREAS, Vietnamese American communities annually commemorate the Fall of Saigon, known as "Black April", in order to recognize the sacrifices of those in their communities who fought in defense of the ideals of democracy, freedom, and human rights; and

WHEREAS, Over the past half century, hundreds of thousands of Vietnamese people have settled in the United States and have worked to build vibrant communities that contribute to the rich diversity of the United States; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has its own vibrant community of Vietnamese and Vietnamese Americans, including refugees who helped establish a "Little Saigon" neighborhood in a corridor along Argyle Street in Chicago's Uptown area, building businesses and social service organizations; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois community of Vietnamese and Vietnamese Americans has grown over the past half century from just hundreds of people to between 30,000 and 40,000 today; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we honor the contributions of Vietnamese and Vietnamese Americans to the United States and their values of upholding human rights, freedom, and democracy and recognize the sacrifices made in order to support these values, including losses of family, home, and life; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we honor the courage, dignity, strength, and resilience of Vietnamese refugees who were forced to flee their home to escape persecution and rebuild their lives and recognize the need to build empathy and understanding for the plight of refugees; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge all Illinoisans to take time to learn about the history and contributions of Vietnamese and Vietnamese American people to Illinois and the United States.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 31

WHEREAS, Donald Stephens was born in Chicago on March 13, 1928; and

WHEREAS, Donald Stephens was the first village president (mayor) of Rosemont; he was first elected in 1956 and re-elected until his death on April 18, 2007; and

WHEREAS, Prior to the village of Rosemont's incorporation, Donald Stephens was the president of the homeowner's association of the neighborhood that later became Rosemont; and

WHEREAS, Donald Stephens was believed to be the longest-serving mayor in the United States at the time of his passing; and

WHEREAS, Donald Stephens oversaw the construction of the 18,500 seat Allstate Arena and the Rosemont Theatre; and

WHEREAS, Donald Stephens was an avid collector of Hummel figurines and established a museum holding his collection in Rosemont; the Donald E. Stephens Museum of Hummels claims to be the largest public display of Hummel figurines in the world; therefore, be it
