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STATEMENT OF METHODOLOGY SurveyUSA is an independent, nonpartisan, applied research company that conducts opinion surveys for media, academic institutions, commercial clients, non-profit organizations, agencies, and elected officials. SurveyUSA's opinion research is conducted through telephone interviews. In January 2017, SurveyUSA conducted a national survey of 1,000 adults aged 18 and older. The survey was conducted from January 17-18, 2017 in English. To ensure that hard-to-reach populations were represented, the number of completed unweighted interviews (1,000) is larger than the number of reported weighted interviews (1,000). At the beginning of the questionnaire, each respondent was randomly assigned a unique identification number. All responses were collected via computer-assisted telephone interviewing (CATI) through a toll-free number. The survey was conducted in English only.
