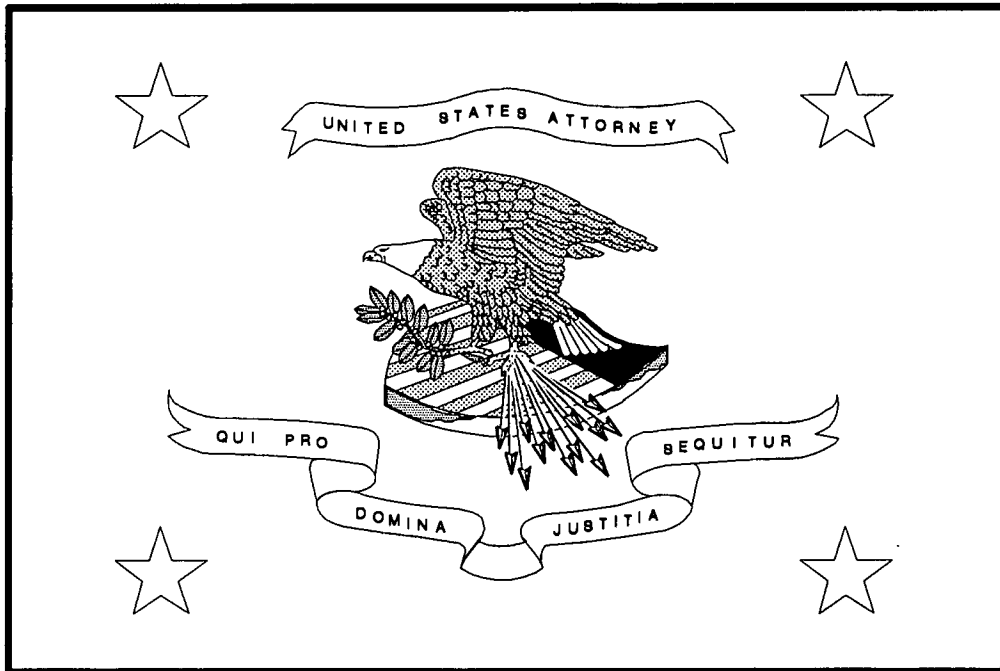

INTRODUCTION

The United States Attorneys, under the supervision and direction of the Attorney General, are responsible for the investigation and prosecution of those who violate our Nation's laws, and for asserting and defending the interests of the United States, its departments and agencies, through the conduct of civil litigation. The United States Attorneys, appointed to serve in the 94 federal judicial districts throughout the country, are charged with carrying out these prosecution and litigation responsibilities within their respective districts. The United States Attorney in each district directs and supervises the work of attorney and support personnel located in the district's headquarters office and, as needed, in staffed branch offices. In Fiscal Year 1991, the United States Attorney system nationwide consisted of the 94 headquarters offices and an additional 85 staffed branch offices. As of the end of Fiscal Year 1991, the offices employed a total of 3,901 attorneys and 4,359 support personnel, which represents a 24.88 percent increase in staff over the previous fiscal year. The total budget for all United States Attorneys' offices for Fiscal Year 1991 was \$741,644,000.

As a part of their prosecution and litigation efforts, the United States Attorneys report to Washington information on the criminal and civil matters and cases they handle. A centralized computer database containing this information is maintained by the Executive Office for United States Attorneys. Currently, United States Attorneys' offices located in 42 of the 94 judicial districts report information to the centralized computer database using Prime minicomputers and PROMIS/USACTS-II software. The offices located in another 50 districts use personal computers and PC-USACTS software to report information and, in the two remaining districts, TALON software on EAGLE system equipment is used. The United States Attorneys' Statistical Report summarizes and presents the matter and case-related information reported by the United States Attorneys.

In addition to maintaining the centralized computer database of matter and case-related information, the Executive Office for United States Attorneys has installed Project EAGLE equipment, which links the United States Attorneys' offices into a nationwide communications exchange network, in 72 judicial districts. Project EAGLE installation in offices in the remaining districts is scheduled to be completed in Fiscal Year 1992. With the installation of TALON, the EAGLE-based case management system, it is anticipated that the 52 United States Attorneys who now use PC-USACTS will use this Project EAGLE equipment to report matter and case-related information to Washington during Fiscal Year 1992.

CRIMINAL PROSECUTION

The United States Attorneys' offices are responsible for the investigation and prosecution of a wide range of criminal activities. The United States Attorneys receive most of their criminal case referrals from federal investigative agencies, or become aware of criminal activities in the course of investigating or prosecuting other cases. They also receive criminal case referrals from state and local investigative agencies. Occasionally, criminal violations are reported to the United States Attorneys by citizens. After careful consideration of a criminal referral or "matter," a United States Attorney decides the appropriateness of bringing criminal charges and, when deemed appropriate, initiates prosecution. Except for misdemeanor offenses and instances in which an alleged offender waives the right to a grand jury indictment, the United States Attorney presents evidence against an alleged offender to a grand jury. The grand jurors decide whether to return an indictment. If an indictment is returned, the United States Attorney then presents the criminal charges in an open court at the arraignment of the defendant.

Although only 10 percent of all criminal prosecutions are concluded by a trial, the United States Attorneys must always be prepared to go to trial. Consistent preparation for trial minimizes the risk of dismissal for noncompliance with the Speedy Trial Act and strengthens the government's position in negotiations with defense counsel for a guilty plea. When a guilty plea is not obtainable, a trial becomes necessary. The United States Attorney then presents factual evidence to convince the jury, or the judge in a non-jury trial, of the defendant's guilt. If the defendant is convicted, the United States Attorney defends the conviction at post-trial hearings and appeals. The United States Attorneys' offices handle most criminal appeals at the intermediate appellate level. After filing a brief, the United States Attorney may be required to participate in oral argument before the United States Court of Appeals. If there is a further appeal, the United States Attorneys may be called upon to assist the Department's litigating divisions and the Solicitor General in preparing the case for review by the United States Supreme Court.

In Fiscal Year 1991, the United States Attorneys' criminal prosecution workload increased by 18 percent in the number of criminal referrals or "matters" received and by six percent in the number of criminal cases filed when compared with the previous fiscal year.

CRIMINAL PROSECUTION PRIORITIES

In carrying out their criminal prosecution responsibilities, the United States Attorneys are guided by the law enforcement and special prosecution priorities of the Attorney General. Such priorities, designated by the Attorney General to focus national attention on the prosecution of certain categories of crime, include economic crime and violent crime.

Economic Crime

The United States Attorneys address economic crime activities as diverse as financial institution fraud, Medicare and Medicaid fraud, defense procurement fraud, securities and commodities fraud, computer fraud, insurance industry fraud, and telemarketing fraud.

Financial Institution Fraud. Financial institution fraud is a threat to the Nation's economic health and to the well-being of the American public. The Department of Justice is committed to dealing firmly and swiftly with those who perpetrate financial institution fraud. The United States Attorneys have shouldered primary responsibility for prosecuting the perpetrators of crimes that threaten to undermine public confidence in the Nation's financial institutions. The allocation of additional attorney and support personnel to United States Attorneys' offices around the country has resulted in significant accomplishments in the battle against financial institution fraud. In Fiscal Year 1991, the United States Attorneys brought criminal charges against 1,085 defendants in major financial institution fraud cases, bringing the total number of those charged since October 1, 1988, to 2,295. A total of 855 defendants were convicted in major financial institution fraud cases during Fiscal Year 1991. This represents a 95 percent conviction rate for the fiscal year. The total number of those convicted since October 1, 1988, is 1,770, which represents a 96 percent overall conviction rate. Of those convicted during Fiscal Year 1991, 80 percent were sent to jail.

Medicare and Medicaid Fraud. Medicare and Medicaid fraud remains a top priority of the Attorney General's Economic Crime Council. Health care analysts from the Blue Cross/Blue Shield National Plan estimated in a 1988 National Report that between five and 15 percent of all health care monies are misspent as a result of criminal activity. Health care fraud involves health care professionals who dispense and fraudulently bill for medicines and services. By 1994, health care is expected to cost the American public \$1 trillion. Using a conservative estimate equal to five percent of the \$1 trillion as monies misspent as a result of criminal activity, the Nation's bill for health care fraud will be \$50 billion.

Defense Procurement Fraud. The monitoring of thousands of military contracts, totalling billions of dollars, by numerous defense investigative agencies and Inspectors General results in the investigation and prosecution of defense contract fraud by the United States Attorneys. The Department of the Army's response to a Justice Department client agency survey indicated that there are approximately 1,050 open procurement fraud investigations at present, and half are expected to be referred to the Department of Justice. Over the last six years the number of investigations has doubled. The Department of the Army further indicated that it foresees no decline in the future.

"Operation Ill Wind," a multi-district United States Attorney investigation and prosecution effort, targeted individuals who illegally obtained or provided information

that permitted corporations to have unfair advantages in bidding for contracts. Two years after the highly publicized execution of 44 search warrants across the country, the investigation has resulted in 52 convictions of major corporate officials including presidents and senior vice-presidents, high-level government officials, numerous consultants, and six Fortune 500 companies. The sixth major corporation pled guilty on September 6, 1991, and agreed to pay a record \$190 million. In addition to convictions, the government has recovered in excess of \$225 million in Operation Ill Wind. Investigations and prosecutions continue.

Securities and Commodities Fraud. Securities and commodities fraud continues at a high rate despite prosecutions by the United States Attorneys' offices in New York City and Chicago of high-profile individuals. Data compiled by the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) reveal that complaints by investors against penny stock brokers have more than doubled in two years, and represent 33 percent of all complaints the SEC receives against broker-dealers. Investigation and development of these cases is complex, labor intensive and long term.

Computer Fraud. The mode of operation of criminals who perpetrate fraud is becoming ever more sophisticated and often involves the use of computers. Computer-aided attacks on government and corporate entities are becoming more numerous. Sometimes the attacks are by "hackers" who merely browse through computer files without authorization. Frequently, however, technologically-sophisticated thieves clandestinely break into computers and steal, alter, or destroy records. The theft of information and vandalism often goes beyond individual computers and is extended to entire networks. Recognizing the growth in computer crime, the United States Attorneys are becoming more involved in this area and are uncovering schemes which victimize both governmental and non-governmental entities. Some of these schemes resemble traditional thefts, except that the computer is the instrument of the crime instead of the forger's pen or fraudulently prepared documents. The United States Attorneys have demonstrated a resolve to attack this criminal activity. For example, the United States Attorney's office in the Western District of Pennsylvania successfully prosecuted two individuals after they used a computer to generate calls to "900" numbers registered to companies which they owned, and then sold the falsely generated bills to a collection company. Training courses on the subject are also being sponsored by the Attorney General's Advocacy Institute.

Insurance Industry Fraud. Insurance industry fraud is looming on the horizon. In a 1990 report titled "Failed Promises," the House Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations warned of growing problems. In the report, the panel asserted that "the parallels between the present situation in the insurance industry and the early stages of the savings and loan debacle are both obvious and deeply disturbing. They encompass scandalous mismanagement and rascality by certain persons entrusted with operating insurance companies along with an appalling lack of regulatory controls to detect, prevent, and punish such activities." About 20 percent of all insurance company

insolvencies, averaging 40 to 45 a year the past five years, are fraud-related according to the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. With insurance company failures spiraling in recent years, the Department of Justice has established a special unit to monitor and combat insolvencies caused by fraud. As with most areas of criminal prosecution, the United States Attorneys will prosecute the majority of these cases.

Telemarketing Fraud. Telemarketing fraud is a burgeoning source of income for a large number of unscrupulous criminals. Investment fraud schemes involve the sale of worthless certificates with guaranteed rates of return, the sale of collectibles such as stamps and coins, and the marketing of franchise businesses. A much greater area of telemarketing fraud involves high volume operations selling such items as vacation packages and water purifiers.

Violent Crime

Operation Weed and Seed. Operation Weed and Seed, a priority program of the Attorney General, represents a coordinated approach to attacking violence and drug activity in embattled neighborhoods. The central premise of the program is that the criminal justice system, social service agencies and the community must work together to eliminate violence and drug activity from an area, and then prevent drug activity and violence from returning. The two major components to the Weed and Seed program are law enforcement, which must "pull the weeds," and neighborhood entities, which must "plant the seeds."

The United States Attorneys are on the front line of the Weed and Seed effort. Within a designated neighborhood, federal, state and local investigative agencies coordinate and target resources to eliminate drug dealers, gang leaders and violent criminals. Federal social service providers (including the Departments of Health and Human Services, Education, Housing and Urban Development, Labor and Transportation) will work with local public and private providers, as well as with business and community groups, to coordinate and target social services resources within the neighborhood. These social services will improve housing, stimulate economic growth and improve residents' education and health. The tax incentives of Enterprise Zones should also stimulate economic growth and create jobs.

Operation Weed and Seed will reduce the direct toll of violence and drug activity in targeted neighborhoods. It will also reduce residents' and businesses' fear of crime as well as social and economic dependence upon crime and drug activity.

Project Triggerlock. According to statistics released by the Federal Bureau of Investigation on April 28, 1991, the violent crime level jumped 10 percent between 1989 and 1990. This startling statistic demonstrates why millions of Americans feel at risk and helpless within their own communities. Many of these violent crimes involve weapons.

Over the last three fiscal years, the number of weapons offense case filings reported by the United States Attorneys jumped from 2,334 in 1989, to 2,889 in 1990, and to 3,747 in 1991. The number of defendants convicted for these offenses rose from 2,035 in 1989, to 2,382 in 1990, and to 2,975 in 1991.

Project Triggerlock, which was initiated on April 10, 1991, is a comprehensive effort to use federal laws pertaining to firearm violence to target the most dangerous violent criminals in each community and put them away for hard time in federal prisons. Armed career criminals with three or more prior felony offenses now face a mandatory minimum sentence of 15 years to life without parole, while use of a firearm in the commission of certain offenses brings a mandatory minimum five year federal prison term. As a result of Project Triggerlock, more cases that would have been prosecuted at the state or local level will be prosecuted in federal court to ensure the maximum sentence for violent offenders.

Gangs. The United States Attorneys, in cooperation with the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, are investigating and prosecuting the growing number of violent gangs and non-traditional organized crime groups, including Asian, Jamaican and other ethnic gangs, motorcycle gangs, and domestic gangs such as the Crips and the Bloods. These gangs engage in various criminal activities and generally are violent. Because the criminal activity crosses many jurisdictions, federal rather than state resources are necessary for investigation and prosecution of these groups. The success of these violent gangs in terrorizing society is due to organized membership, and it is only with an organized and united law enforcement effort that they will be overpowered.

CIVIL LITIGATION

Civil matters and cases represent a significant portion of the United States Attorneys' workload. In their work in the civil arena, the United States Attorneys initiate civil actions, or affirmative litigation, to assert and protect the interests of the United States. They also defend the interests of the government in lawsuits filed against the United States, or defensive litigation. The affirmative litigation handled by the United States Attorneys includes, for example, actions brought to enforce the environmental, admiralty and civil rights laws, to recoup money and recover damages as a result of federal program fraud, to take possession of assets seized by federal, state and local law enforcement agencies, and to enforce administrative summonses. As of the end of Fiscal Year 1991, affirmative litigation represented 29 percent of the United States Attorneys' pending civil workload nationwide.

Defensive litigation represented 55 percent of the United States Attorneys' pending civil workload nationwide as of the end of Fiscal Year 1991. Such defensive litigation includes, for instance, tort suits brought by those who suffered damages as a

result of government action, the adjudication of Social Security disability claims, contract violations, habeas corpus, and race, sex and age discrimination suits. Other civil cases such as when the United States is a third party plaintiff or defendant represented the remaining 16 percent of the pending civil workload nationwide.

Civil Debt Collection Cases. Also in their work in the civil arena, the United States Attorneys are responsible for filing suits to collect money from those who owe debts to the United States. The United States Attorneys receive these "debt collection" cases from federal agencies that have tried but are unable to collect the debts that arise out of the federal programs they administer. The United States Attorneys, for example, bring suits against those who have defaulted on the repayment of Department of Education student loans, and those who received but were not entitled to receive benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) or who defaulted on a VA home loan. This area of civil litigation is both necessary and important in ensuring the integrity of the programs the government administers and in recouping the money that belongs in the United States Treasury.

Bankruptcy. The United States Attorneys' civil litigation responsibilities include proceedings in bankruptcy. This litigation can be defensive or affirmative. For example, a federal agency may request that the United States Attorney object to the debtor's claim that a debt is dischargeable in bankruptcy. Debts arising from student loans, other forms of educational assistance, criminal fines, restitution and civil penalties are common sources of this type of litigation. The type of priority to be accorded to an agency's debt in bankruptcy may determine whether the agency will receive any payment. In these cases, the United States Attorneys will be asked to defend the agency's claim for priority treatment. An example of this type of litigation arose in the District of Colorado where the United States Attorney prevailed in a dispute over the value of a HUD-sponsored 227-unit multi-family retirement project and successfully argued HUD's entitlement to the project's cash collateral, netting the federal government a \$9.5 million recovery in the bankruptcy proceeding.

The United States Attorneys also receive requests to commence affirmative proceedings in bankruptcy court. For example, the United States Attorney may seek to lift the automatic stay so that foreclosure proceedings can be completed. Other proceedings may be commenced to protect an agency's loan collateral from depreciation or damage if it is to be used for the reorganization of the debtor. The United States Attorney also receives requests to compel the debtor to pay its trust fund and other taxes. In some instances, the United States Attorney will commence litigation to dismiss the bankruptcy proceeding in order to protect a federal agency's claim. In the Eastern District of Virginia, for example, the United States Attorney succeeded in dismissing a bankruptcy proceeding filed by a debtor who had received a PHS scholarship for her medical education and then refused to perform her service. The doctor, who owed PHS \$719,000 has now agreed to meet her obligation under the PHS scholarship program and is providing medical care to an under-served community.

Debtors who file for bankruptcy protection may owe debts to more than one federal agency and the United States Attorney will represent the interests of all federal entities in the bankruptcy proceeding. The United States Attorneys litigate claims filed under every chapter of the Bankruptcy Code from liquidations, sometimes called straight bankruptcy (Chapter 7), to individuals with a regular income, often referred to, incorrectly, as wage earners, and farmer reorganizations (Chapters 12 & 13), to reorganization proceedings (Chapter 11). During FY 91, the United States Attorneys also participated in Chapter 9 proceedings (municipal reorganizations), which are still relatively infrequent.

Bankruptcy filings have continued to grow at a tremendous rate. According to statistics maintained by the Administrative Office of the United States Courts, bankruptcy filings have climbed from 380,000 in 1981 to 943,987 in 1991. The role of the United States Attorneys in bankruptcy court also continues to grow to meet the needs of the federal agencies.

OPERATION GARBAGE OUT

In Fiscal Year 1991, the Executive Office for United States Attorneys initiated a major effort, called Operation Garbage Out, to improve the quality of the data contained in the United States Attorneys' automated case tracking systems. Operation Garbage Out involved a three-prong process to: (1) update the civil and criminal database in each United States Attorney's office to reflect correct and current information; (2) provide additional training to docket personnel and their supervisors to ensure that they had the necessary skills to maintain the data and to recommend steps to improve system quality and utilization locally; and (3) increase management accountability for, and line attorney involvement in, the quality of the local database. The United States Attorneys were required to certify to the accuracy of the case-related information contained in their local databases.

Under the first phase of Operation Garbage Out, all matters and cases more than five years old were reviewed by the United States Attorneys' offices. This review had a major impact on the information contained in the automated case tracking systems nationwide. In addition to improving the quality of information on pending cases, the number of pending matters and cases was reduced by more than 10 percent, or from 244,208 to 215,357, as a result of the review and cleanup process.

The results of Operation Garbage Out are reflected throughout the United States Attorneys' Statistical Report. The beginning balances on numerous reports have been reduced to reflect the effect of closing out stale matters and cases. In order to continue to provide the most up-to-date and accurate statistical information available, Operation Garbage Out has been extended into Fiscal Year 1992.

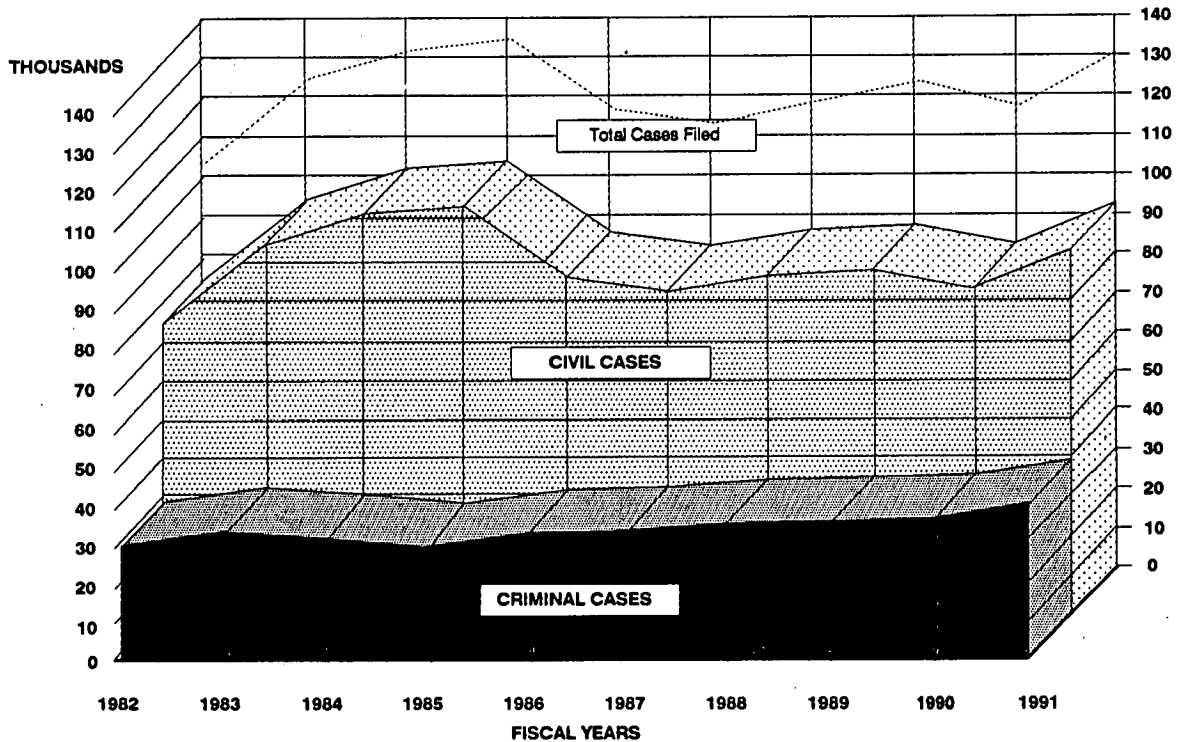
WORK HANDLED BY UNITED STATES ATTORNEYS' OFFICES
DURING FISCAL YEAR 1991

CASELOAD

CASES FILED - Criminal filings amounting to 38,374 showed an increase of 2,332 or 6.47 percent more than the number filed in the previous fiscal year. In addition, 6,255 criminal appeals were filed. Civil cases filed amounted to 92,363, an increase of 10,130 or 12.31 percent over the previous fiscal year. In addition, 3,749 civil appeals were filed. Criminal filings increased in 59 districts ranging from three additional cases in the Western District of Arkansas to 429 cases in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Criminal filings decreased in 35 districts ranging from one in the Northern District of Indiana to 949 in the Southern District of Texas.

Civil filings increased in 63 districts ranging from three in the District of South Dakota to 1,607 in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Civil filings decreased in 31 districts ranging from two in the District of North Mariana Islands to 221 in the Southern District of Texas.

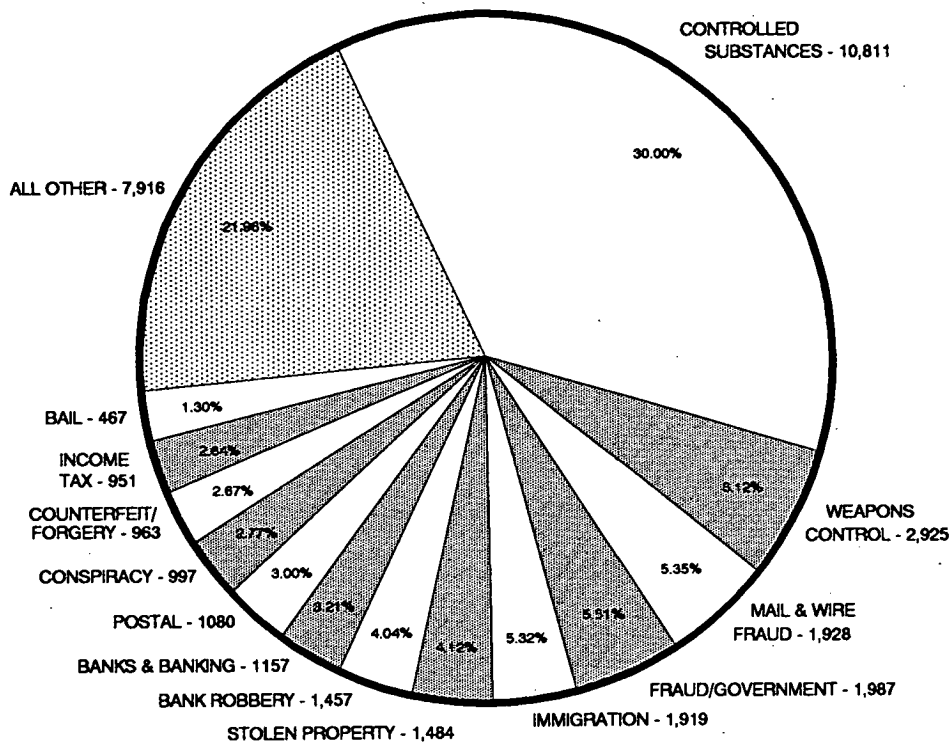
Chart 1 | Criminal and Civil Cases Filed in United States Attorneys' Offices

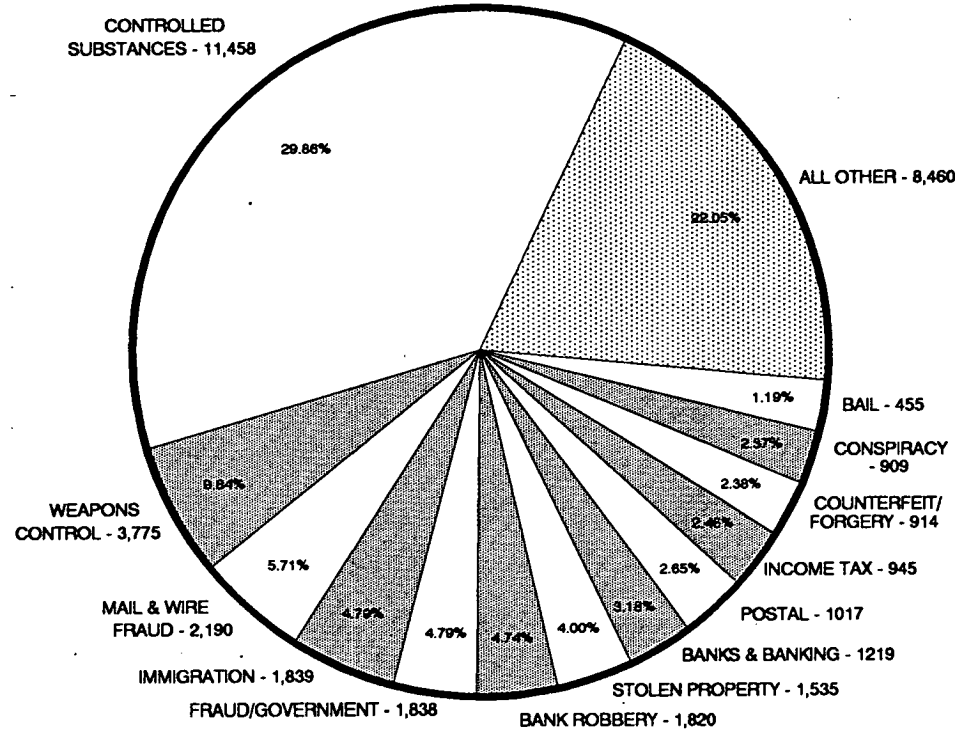
Chart 2 | Criminal Cases Filed by Offense in United States Attorneys' Offices

As of September 30, 1991



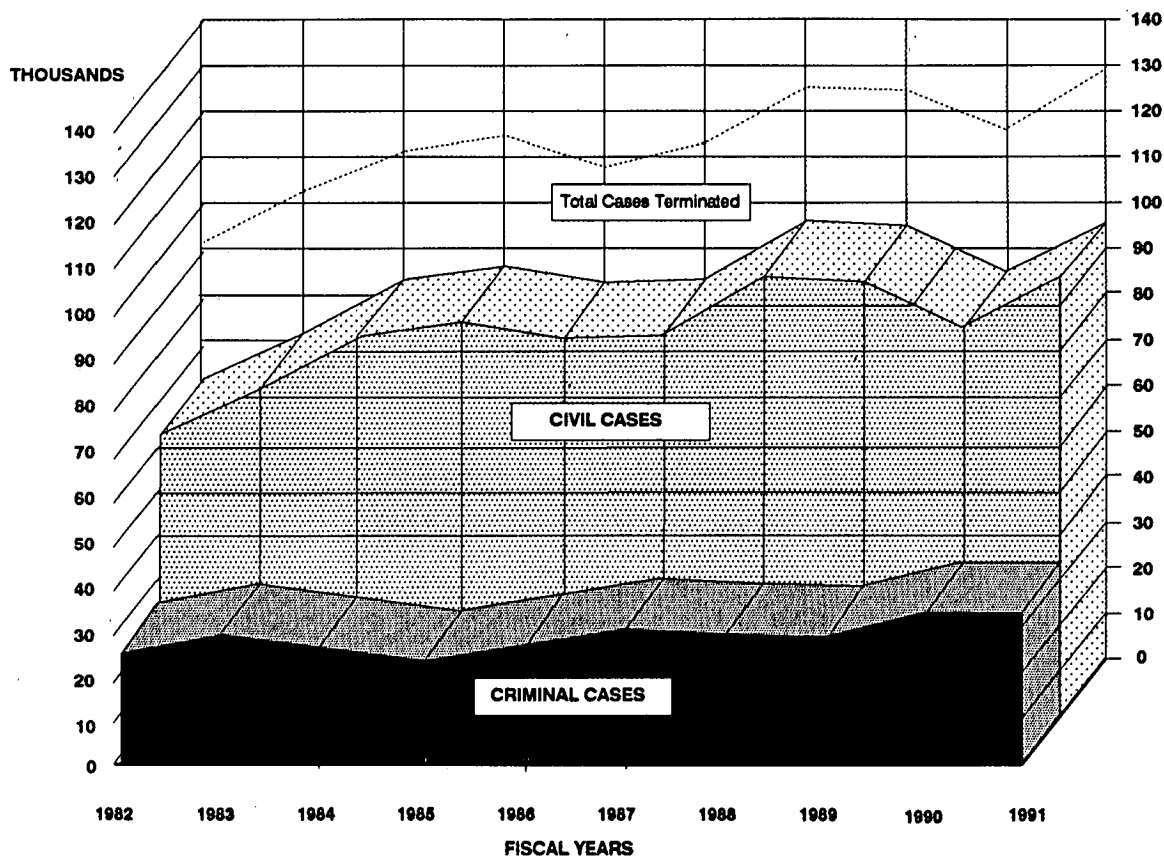

CASES TERMINATED - Criminal cases terminated totaled 33,834 involving 50,596 defendants with 61 districts showing an increase, and 33 districts showing a decrease. This is a 5.06 percent increase over last year. In addition, 5,259 criminal appeals were terminated. Of the total of 33,834 closed, 25,551 (involving 36,800 defendants were pleas of guilty), 3,643 (involving 5,743 defendants) were found guilty after trial and 564 (involving 1,226 defendants) were found not guilty (including 17 verdicts of not guilty by reason of insanity).

With 63 districts showing increases and 30 districts with decreases, civil cases terminated increased by 10,891 to 95,586. This represents an increase of 12.85%. In addition 3,670 civil appeals were terminated.

Chart 3 | Criminal and Civil Cases Terminated in United States Attorneys' Offices



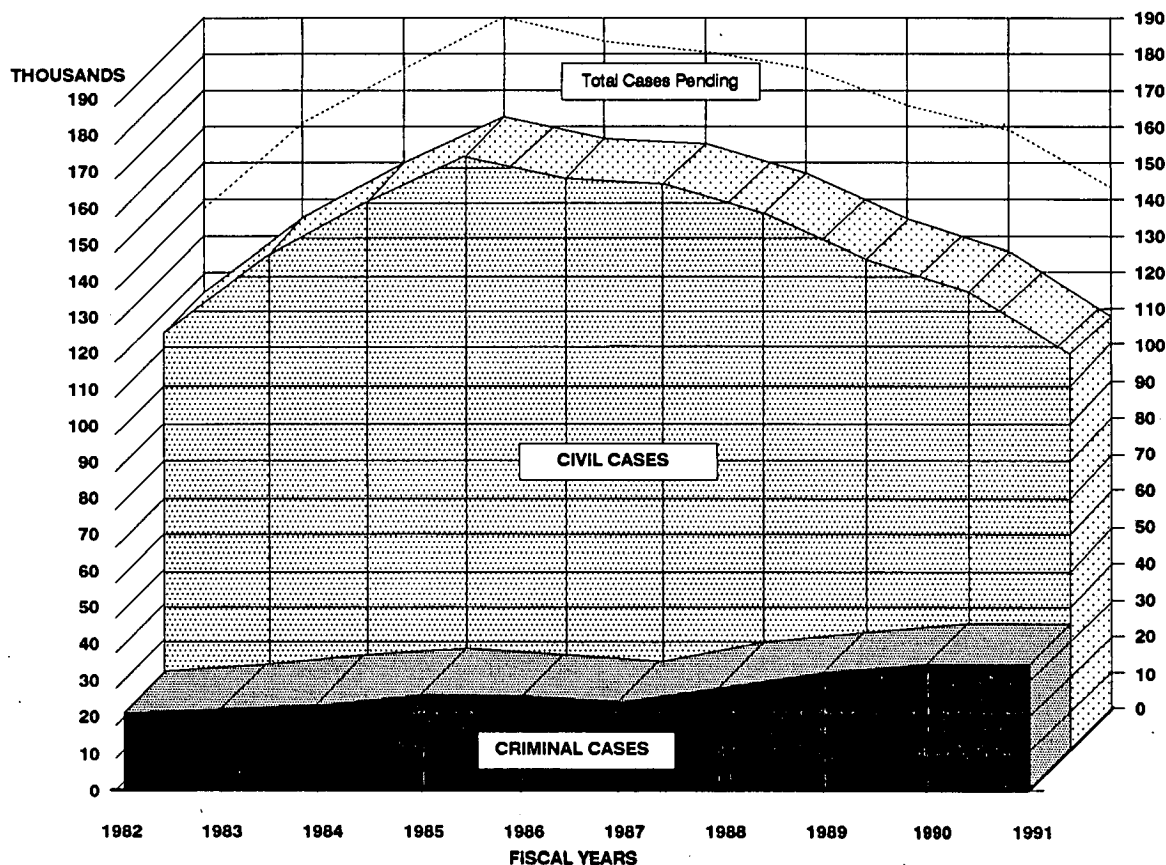

CASES PENDING - With 34,645 cases, the Criminal pending caseload showed an increase of 4,540 or was 15.08 percent more than the 30,105* cases pending at the close of fiscal year 1990. In addition, 7,057 criminal appeals were pending. Of the pending cases, 434 cases were in pretrial diversion programs, while 9,409 were fugitives.

Civil cases pending as of the close of the fiscal year decreased by 3,223 or 2.88 percent to 108,776. In addition, 4,218 civil appeals were pending. Tax Lien cases decreased to 23,262 or 21.39 percent of the total as compared to 24,189 or 19.28 percent of the total pending as of September 30, 1990. Torts cases decreased to 8,973 or 8.25 percent from 9,813 or 7.82 percent of the previous year's total.

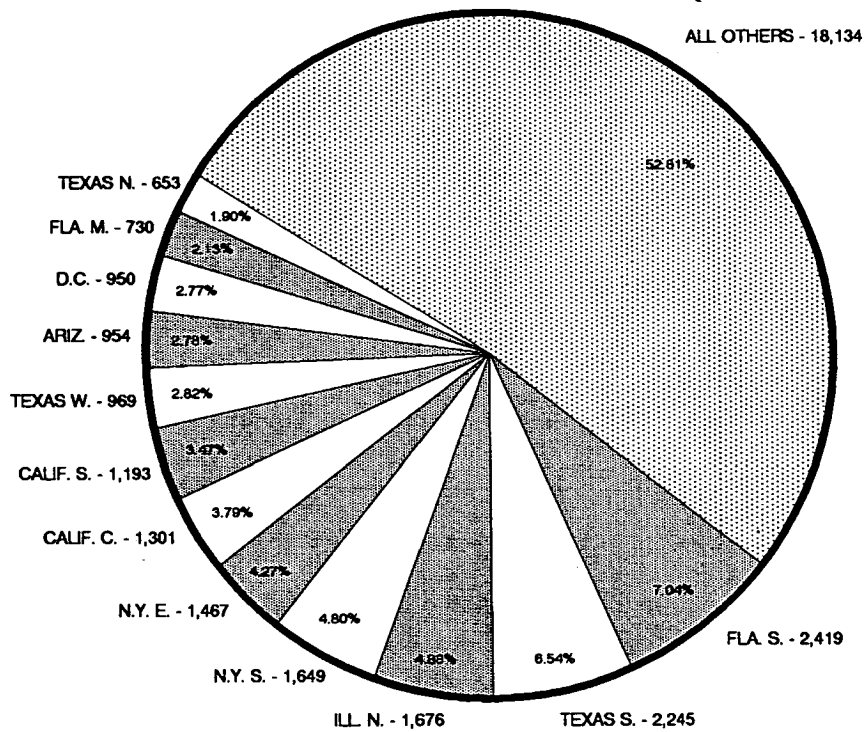
Chart 4 | Criminal and Civil Cases Pending in United States Attorneys' Offices

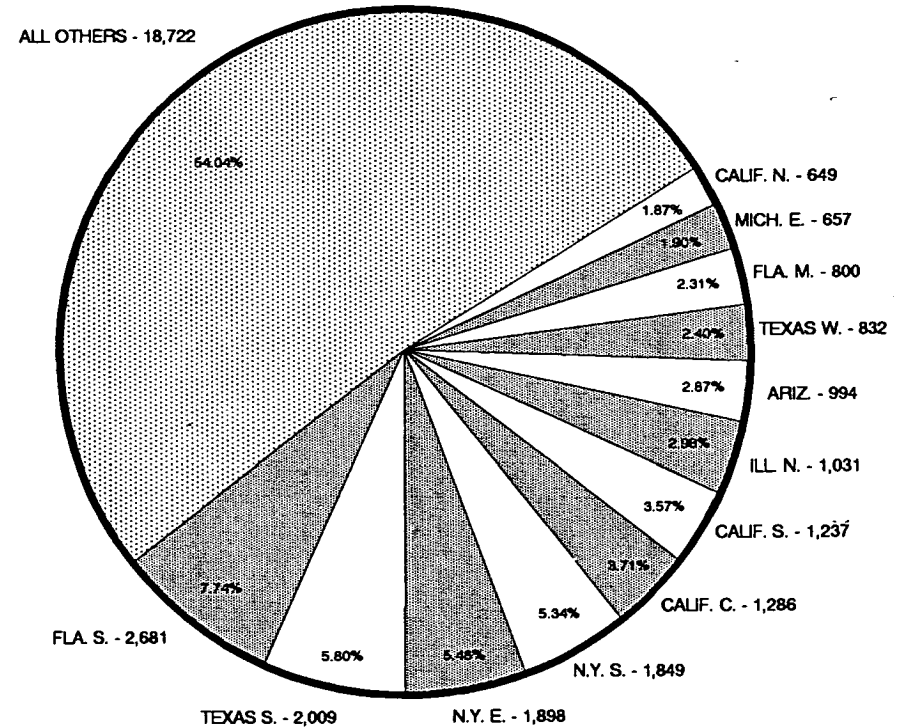
Chart 5 | Criminal Cases Pending in United States Attorneys' Offices

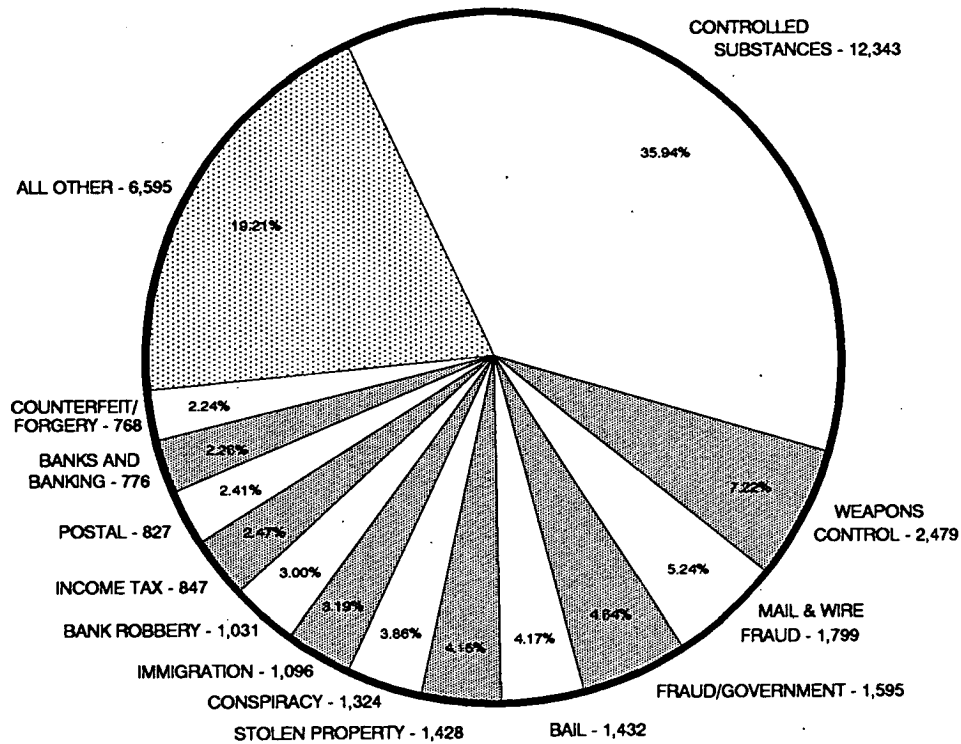

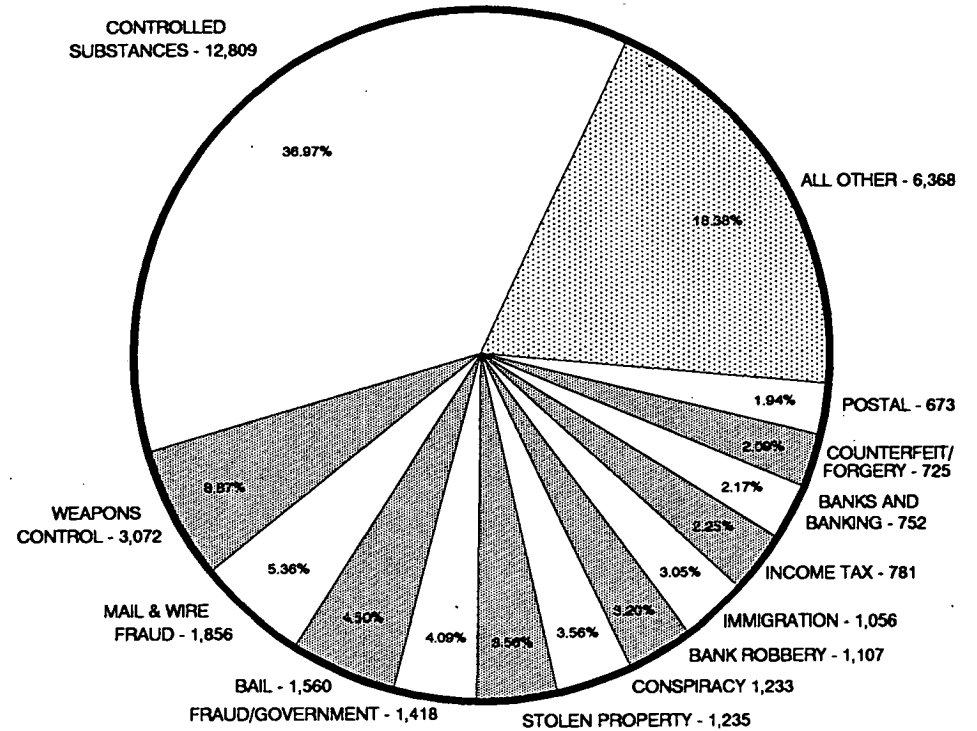
Chart 6 | Criminal Cases Pending by Offense in United States Attorneys' Offices

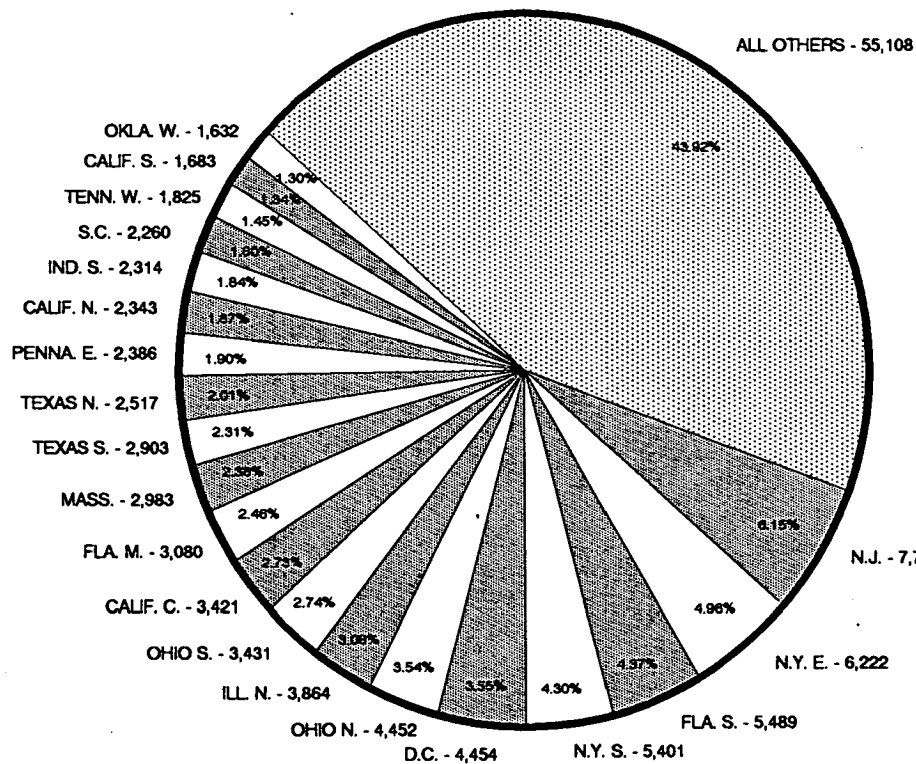

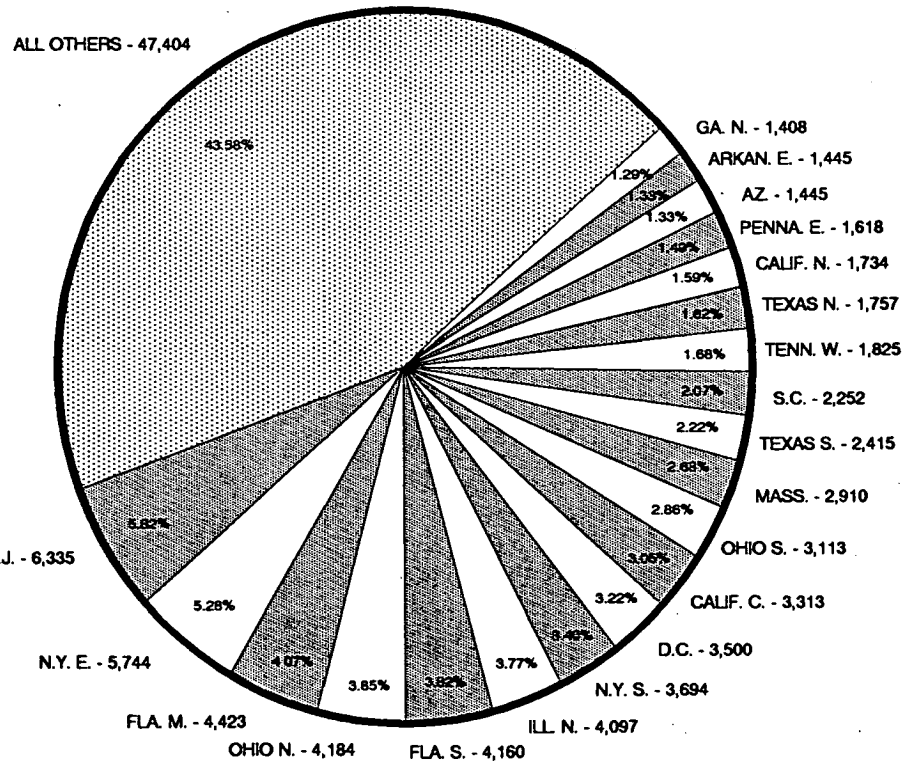
Chart 7 | Civil Cases Pending in United States Attorneys' Offices

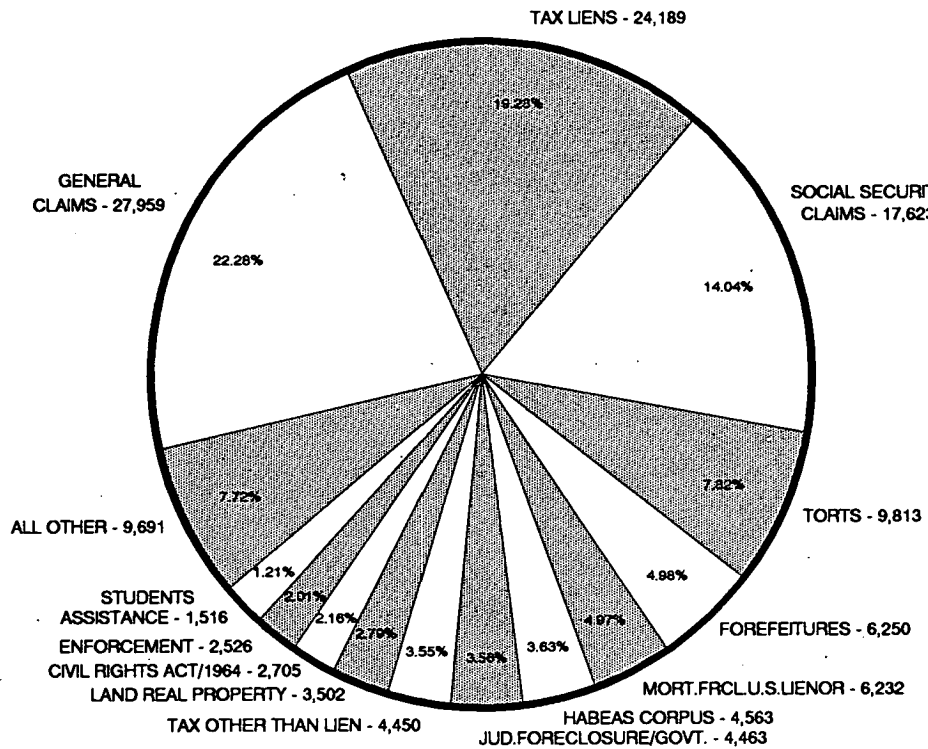

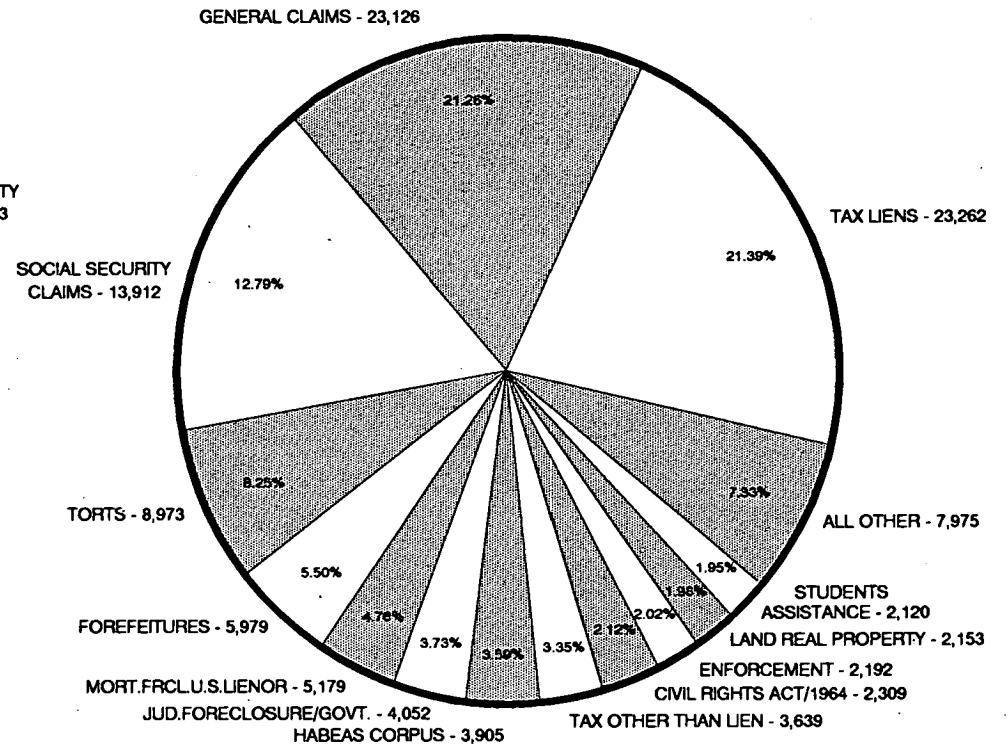
Chart 8 | Civil Cases Pending by Cause of Action in United States Attorneys' Offices

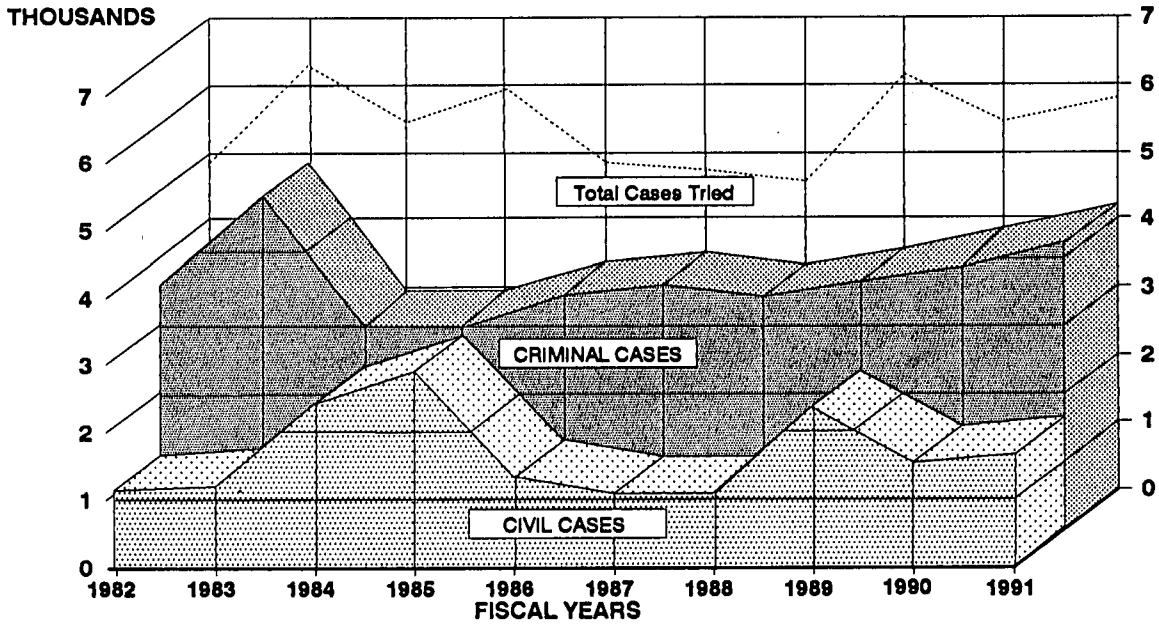

Chart 9 | Criminal and Civil Cases Tried in United States Attorneys' Offices

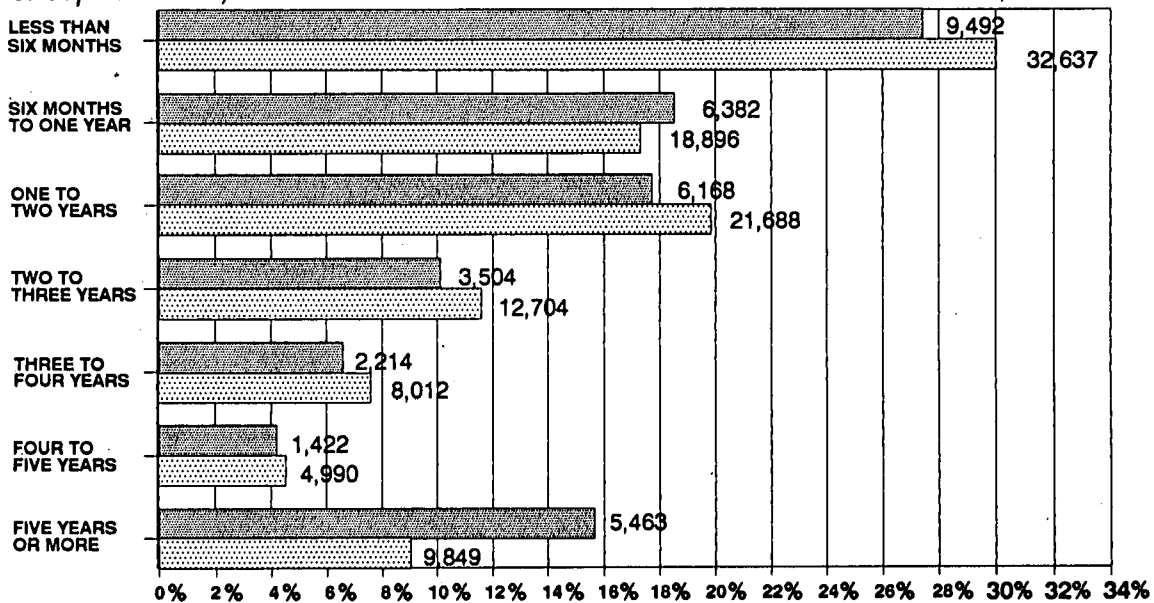

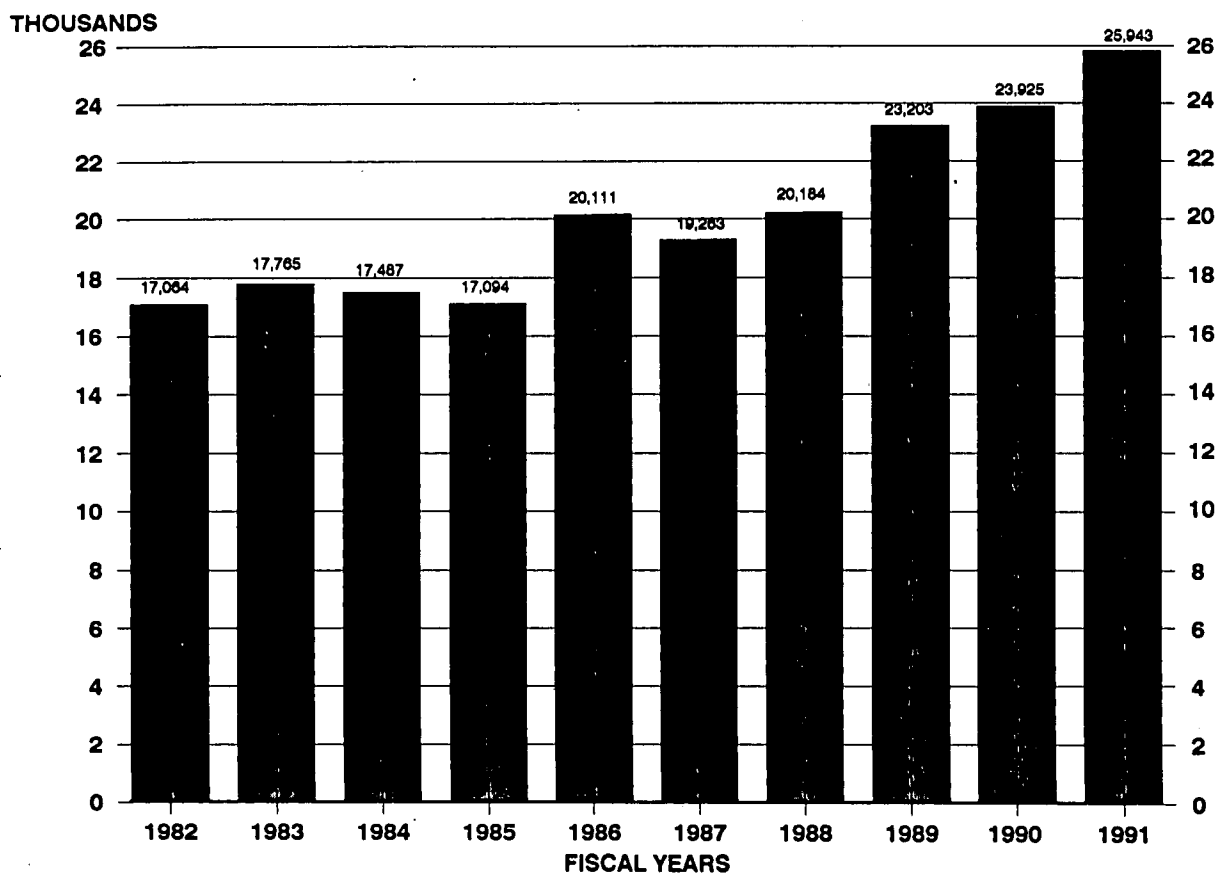
HOURS IN COURT

A total of 1,196,434 hours were spent in court and court-related activities during fiscal year 1991. The three largest categories amounted to 867,824 work hours and 72.53 percent of the total. These categories were for District Criminal Court (381,474 or 31.88 percent), Witness Preparation (355,580 or 29.72 percent), and Court Travel Time (130,770 or 10.93 percent). Based on 3,627.3 total attorney full time equivalent work years, each attorney averaged 27.49 hours per month in courtroom and court-related work during the fiscal year.

GRAND JURY PROCEEDINGS

Grand Jury Proceedings resulted in 25,927 indictments and 16 No True Bills, totalling 25,943, an increase of 8.43 percent from the previous fiscal year.

MATTERS

MATTERS RECEIVED - Criminal matters received increased to 99,778 or 3.57 percent more than the 96,333 received in fiscal year 1990. The Southern District of California with 6,137 had the most criminal matters and the Southern District of Texas with 3,347 and the Eastern District of Pennsylvania with 3,322 were the next highest.

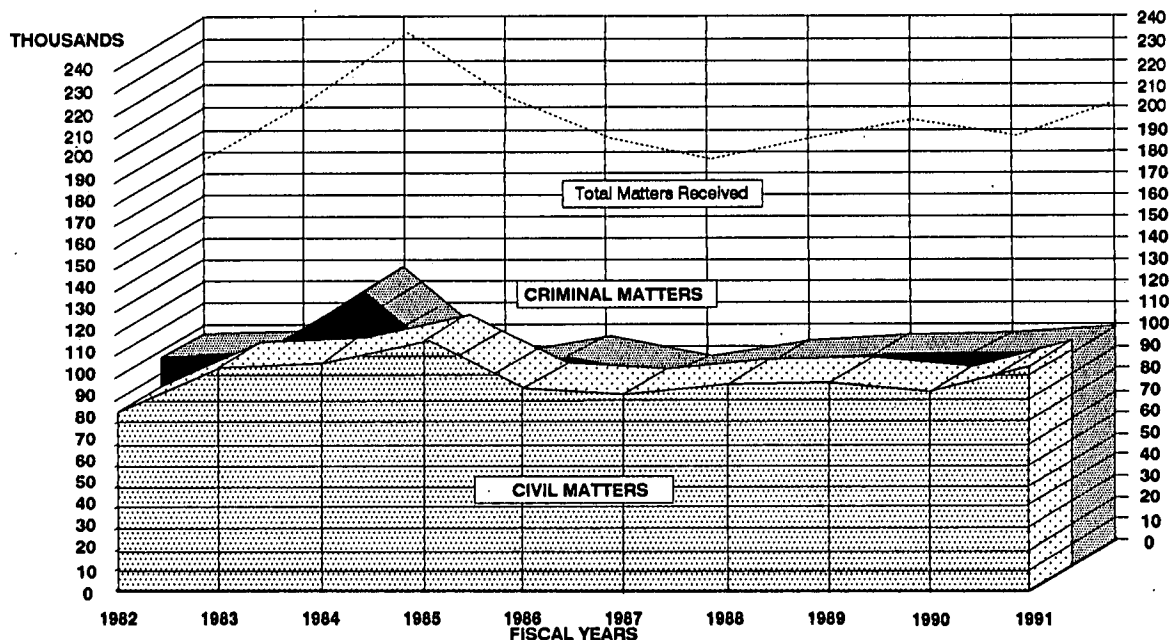
Civil matters received amounted to 102,276, an increase of 10,860 or 11.87 percent more than the 91,416 in fiscal year 1990. The Middle District of Florida with 5,462 had the most civil matters, and the District of New Jersey with 3,698 and the Southern District of Florida with 3,669 being the next highest.

PENDING - Criminal matters pending as of September 30, 1991, were 55,039 and Civil matters pending were 16,897.

CLOSED - Some 61,168 matters were closed during 1991 without reaching district court dockets. Of this number, 20,057 referrals were closed by immediate declination of prosecutions. Some 24,999 matters were declined after further investigation. Another 10,514 matters were disposed of by federal magistrates.

Civil matters terminated without reaching court dockets amounted to 11,692. This was an increase of 795 matters or 7.3 percent more than the fiscal year 1990 total of 10,897.

Chart 12 | **Criminal and Civil Matters Received in United States Attorneys' Offices**

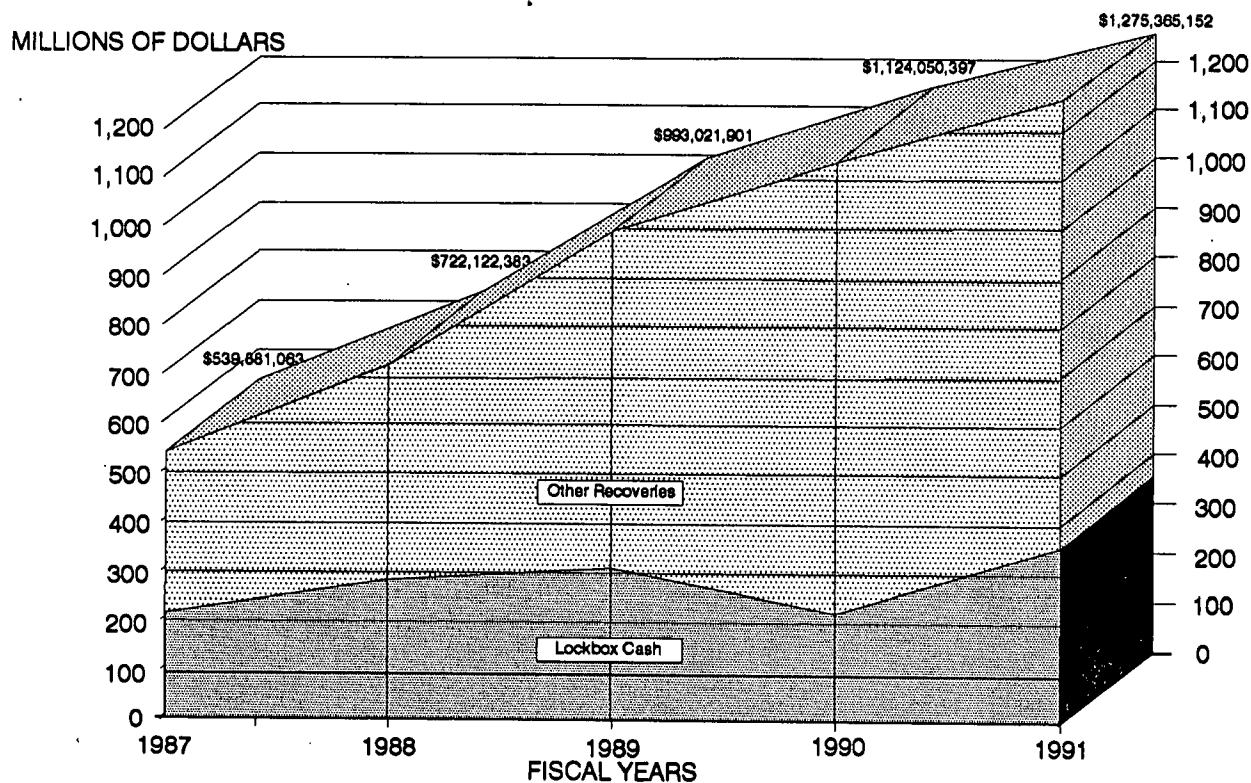


COLLECTIONS

During fiscal year 1991, the efforts of the 93 United States Attorneys resulted in the recovery of \$1,275,365,152 in actual assets (*i.e.*, cash and property). The actual assets recovered represents a 13.46 percent increase from the 1990 figure of \$1,124,050,397.

During the fiscal year, 7 districts participated in the Private Counsel Pilot Program, which authorizes the referral of federal debts to private attorneys for enforced collection. The legal activity on these debts is tracked separately in these districts by the Justice Management Division's Central Intake Facility. All debts referred to the private attorneys are included in the districts' statistics. The participating districts are the Eastern District of Michigan (Detroit), the Eastern District of New York (Brooklyn), the Southern District of Texas (Houston), the Southern District of Florida (Miami), the Central District of California (Los Angeles), the District of Columbia (Washington, D.C.) and the Northern District of California (San Francisco).

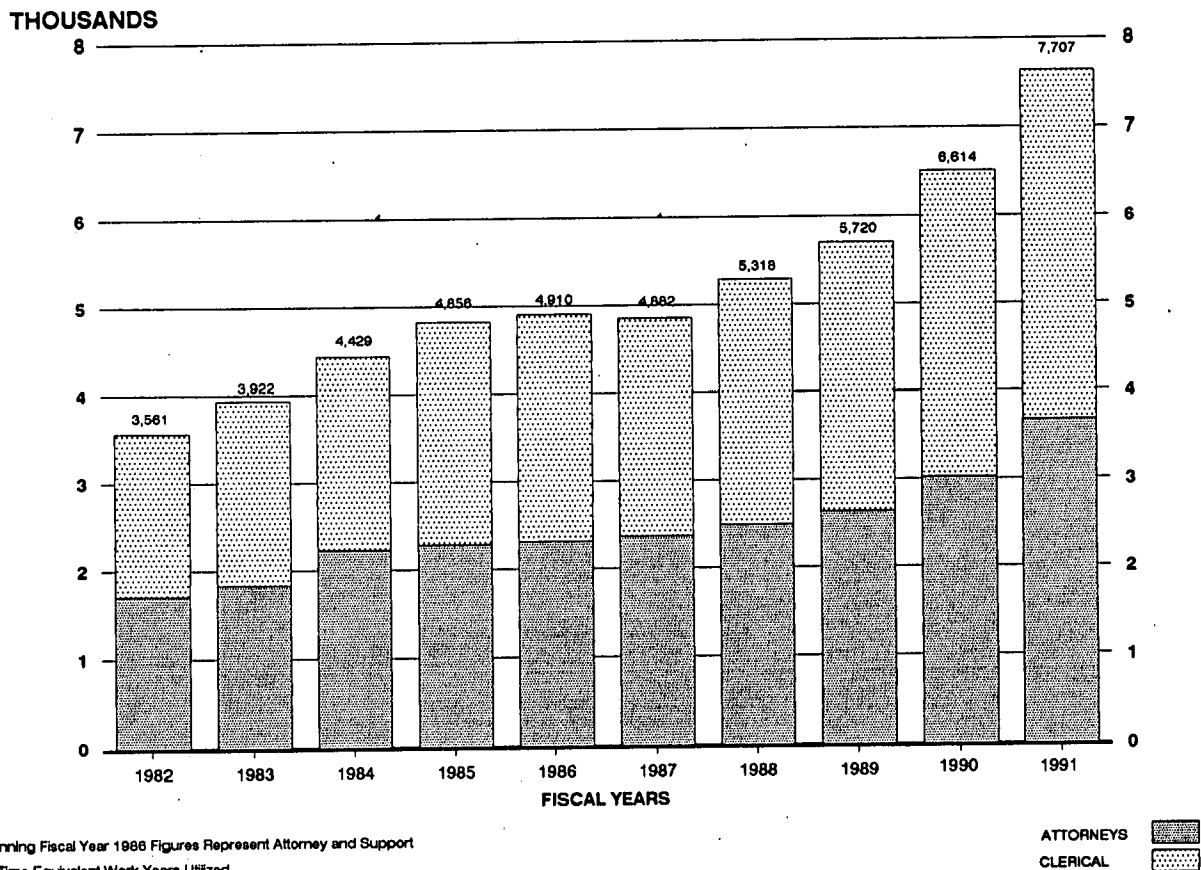
**Chart 13 | Collections in

PERSONNEL

The United States Attorneys' appropriation had 8,260 employees on the rolls as of September 30, 1991. Cases handled per Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Assistant United States Attorney work year averaged 79.8 in fiscal year 1991 and cases terminated per FTE Assistant United States Attorney work year averaged 37.7.
