Annual World of Work Seminar

Since 1989 the UWIAA T&T Chapter has contributed to the World of Work Seminar and Mock Interview Sessions for members of the Graduating Class. Areas of focus include preparation of job application letters and resumes, preparation for job interviews, on-the-job adjustment and career options for new graduates.



Distinguished Alumni Awards (DAA)

On April 02, 2011, 50 distinguished UWI Alumni of the St Augustine Campus were honoured at the UWIAA T&T Chapter's inaugural Distinguished Alumni Awards (DAA).
