Chapter II. International peace and security

Heavenly Culture, World Peace, Restoration of Light (HWPL) is an international peace NGO in consultative status with the UN ECOSOC. Our proposal:

- Calls on the UN Summit of the Future to reaffirm the obligations of the UN Charter to maintain international peace and security, especially Article 33 that insists that the "parties to any dispute, the continuance of which is likely to endanger the maintenance of international peace and security, shall, first of all, seek a solution by negotiation, enquiry, mediation, conciliation, arbitration, judicial settlement, resort to regional agencies or arrangements, or other peaceful means of their own choice."

- Calls on the UN Summit of the Future to take action with respect to the UN75 Declaration, which declares that "international arms control, non-proliferation and disarmament agreements and their architectures need to be upheld."

Based on our efforts toward fostering religious harmony and global peace in 129 countries through the establishment of 274 World Alliance of Religions' Peace Offices, our proposal also:

- Calls on the UN Summit of the Future to highlight resolution 77/296 on the Follow-up to the Declaration and Programme of Action on a Culture of Peace that "recognizes the importance of respect and understanding for religious and cultural diversity throughout the world, of choosing dialogue and negotiations over confrontation and of working together and not against each other."

Chapter IV. Youth and future generations

Based on extensive consultations with 314 educational institutions from 51 countries, including ministries of education and educators for the development of a peace education curriculum, our proposal:

- Calls on the UN Summit of the Future to highlight resolution 78/129 on the Promotion of interreligious and intercultural dialogue, understanding and cooperation for peace, which makes note of the underlining "importance of education, including education on culture, peace, tolerance, mutual understanding and human rights, in promoting interreligious and intercultural dialogue, respect for diversity, and the elimination of discrimination based on religion or belief."
