

The Holcombes' daughters, Kathryn and Karen, along with President Edward Serna '02 and Casey Ferri '09, president-elect of the Alumni Association Executive Board, were on hand to assist with the ribbon cutting and dedication. BOARD ACTION

Trustees Make History at June Board Meeting



Trustees made history at the June 27 board meeting as they approved Winthrop's first doctoral-level program, the Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) in Leadership and Innovation, which will be offered through the Richard W. Riley College of Education, Sport and Human Sciences. The program still must be approved by the S.C. Commission on Higher Education and the university's accreditation organization. Trustees also approved a \$119 million core operating budget for the 2024-25 fiscal year. The budget contains an 8-percent tuition decrease for students and uses a conservative estimate of revenues that the university is expected to bring in for the new fiscal year which started July 1. As part of the budget, the state will provide Winthrop \$36 million in non-capital funds. Additional action was taken on approving new bachelor's degree offerings, setting meal plan rates, and more.

Convocation to Usher in 139th Academic Year



President Edward Serna '02 will preside over the Aug. 19 Convocation ceremony for new students, which will officially start the 139th academic year at Winthrop. The 11 a.m. ceremony will be held in the West Center. A Winthrop tradition, the ceremony is a way to welcome new and transfer students to the historic campus and into the Winthrop community of learners. Following the ceremony, President Serna and First Lady Lauren Serna will lead students toward the campus front lawn in the traditional Blue Line procession. A picnic lunch, open to the community, will take place on the lawn in front of Margaret Nance Hall. Fall classes will begin at 5 p.m. on Aug. 19.




