METHODOLOGY

YouGov interviewed 900 registered voters in Arizona between July 4-12, 2024 for The Times, and the SAY24 project for Stanford, Arizona State, and Yale Universities.

This sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, and education based on the U.S. Census American Community Survey, and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as 2020 Presidential vote and partisan identification. Respondents were selected to be representative of registered voters living in Arizona. The weights range from 0.1 to 5.1, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.7.

The margin of error for a percentage based upon the entire sample is ± 3.9 points. The margin of error is larger for subsamples and differences of percentages.

METHODOLOGY

YouGov interviewed 1,000 registered voters in Georgia between July 4-12, 2024 for The Times, and the SAY24 project for Stanford, Arizona State, and Yale Universities.

This sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, and education based on the U.S. Census American Community Survey, and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as 2020 Presidential vote and partisan identification. Respondents were selected to be representative of registered voters living in Georgia. The weights range from 0.1 to 4.7, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.6.

The margin of error for a percentage based upon the entire sample is ± 3.6 points. The margin of error is larger for subsamples and differences of percentages.

METHODOLOGY

YouGov interviewed 1,000 registered voters in Michigan between July 4-12, 2024 for The Times, and the SAY24 project for Stanford, Arizona State, and Yale Universities.

This sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, and education based on the U.S. Census American Community Survey, and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as 2020 Presidential vote and partisan identification. Respondents were selected to be representative of registered voters living in Michigan. The weights range from 0.2 to 5.9, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.6.

The margin of error for a percentage based upon the entire sample is ± 3.6 points. The margin of error is larger for subsamples and differences of percentages.

METHODOLOGY

YouGov interviewed 1,000 registered voters in North Carolina between July 4-12, 2024 for The Times, and the SAY24 project for Stanford, Arizona State, and Yale Universities.

This sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, and education based on the U.S. Census American Community Survey, and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as 2020 Presidential vote and partisan identification. Respondents were selected to be representative of registered voters living in North Carolina. The weights range from 0.1 to 5.1, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.6.

The margin of error for a percentage based upon the entire sample is ± 3.7 points. The margin of error is larger for subsamples and differences of percentages.

METHODOLOGY

YouGov interviewed 800 registered voters in Nevada between July 4-12, 2024 for The Times, and the SAY24 project for Stanford, Arizona State, and Yale Universities.

This sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, and education based on the U.S. Census American Community Survey, and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as 2020 Presidential vote and partisan identification. Respondents were selected to be representative of registered voters living in Nevada. The weights range from 0.1 to 5.1, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.9.

The margin of error for a percentage based upon the entire sample is ± 4.7 points. The margin of error is larger for subsamples and differences of percentages.

METHODOLOGY

YouGov interviewed 1,000 registered voters in Pennsylvania between July 4-12, 2024 for The Times, and the SAY24 project for Stanford, Arizona State, and Yale Universities.

This sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, and education based on the U.S. Census American Community Survey, and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as 2020 Presidential vote and partisan identification. Respondents were selected to be representative of registered voters living in Pennsylvania. The weights range from 0.2 to 2.5, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.5.

The margin of error for a percentage based upon the entire sample is ± 3.4 points. The margin of error is larger for subsamples and differences of percentages.

METHODOLOGY

YouGov interviewed 900 registered voters in Wisconsin between July 4-12, 2024 for The Times, and the SAY24 project for Stanford, Arizona State, and Yale Universities.

This sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, and education based on the U.S. Census American Community Survey, and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as 2020 Presidential vote and partisan identification. Respondents were selected to be representative of registered voters living in Wisconsin. The weights range from 0.1 to 5.3, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.8.

The margin of error for a percentage based upon the entire sample is ± 4.1 points. The margin of error is larger for subsamples and differences of percentages.
